**Minutes of a meeting of the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board
held on 28 May 2013 at 5pm in the Community Room,
Upper Riccarton Library, 71 Main South Road**

The Board reports that:

PART B - REPORTS FOR INFORMATION

1. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

1.1 HARRINGTON PARK MURAL

Peter Simmonds, Riccarton resident, discussed with the Board a proposal to renew the mural on the fence in Harrington Park. Mr Simmonds was a school pupil when the mural was first painted approximately in 1980s. At a recent community meeting it was highlighted that the mural is past its best and attracting graffiti.

The deputation discussed the removal of the trees along the fence line; the Board advised that matter would need to be further discussed with the Board. Mr Simmonds was also advised that the final proposed design would need to be approved by the Council, a memorandum of understanding or agreement between himself and the Council would need to be completed, and that the Council do not maintain completed murals. The Board suggested that a graffiti resistant paint be applied to the new mural.

The Board advised Mr Simmonds to work with the Council's Riccarton/Wigram Strengthening Communities Team on this project.

3. CORRESPONDENCE

3.1 MUIR PARK, HALSWELL

The Board **received** correspondence from F.D. Maslen and R.H. Birnie, residents of Halswell Road, in relation to trees in Muir Park shading their residence. The Board were advised that staff could visit the residents to further clarify the matter and report back to the Board.

The Board **agreed** to undertake a site visit to Muir Park with Council staff to investigate the residents concerns.

4. BRIEFINGS

Joanna Corbett, Earthquake Recovery Community Advocate, updated the Board on her work within the Riccarton/Wigram ward.

5. STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES FUNDING – KEY LOCAL PROJECTS 2013

The Board considered a report regarding Key Local Projects in the Riccarton/Wigram ward.

It was **resolved** that the Board:

- (a) Nominate the Hornby Presbyterian Community Trust as a Key Local Project and recommend finding of \$40,000 from the Metropolitan Funding Committee towards the Hope House Hornby Project.
- (b) Nominate the Oak Development Trust as a Key Local Project and recommend funding of \$20,000 from the Metropolitan Funding Committee towards salary and associated expenses.
- (c) Nominate the Community Development Network Trust as a Key Local Project and recommends funding of \$50,000 from the Metropolitan Funding Committee towards their Youth Work Service.

6. COMMUNITY BOARD ADVISER'S UPDATE

6.1 Christchurch City Council Draft Local Alcohol Policy

The Board **agreed** that it would prepare a submission on the Christchurch City Council Draft Alcohol Policy. The Board agreed to convene a Submission Working Party workshop on 4 June 2013.

6.2 Community Facilities Rebuild Community Forums

The Board **received** information on the proposed community forums to be held across Christchurch and in Banks Peninsula beginning in mid-June.

7. ELECTED MEMBERS' INFORMATION EXCHANGE

Mention was made of the Wayne Francis Charitable Trust's initiative to provide supported transitional housing for youth in Christchurch. It was suggested that the Trust speak to the Council's Community, Recreation and Culture Committee Chairperson.

PART C - REPORT ON DELEGATED DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE BOARD

9. HARRINGTON PARK MURAL (CONT'D)

Staff advice was given that the Local Government Act 2002 and other legislation requires that decision making must take into account all options and that sufficient time is given for that information to be received and considered before granting funding to the Harrington Park Mural.

The Board **resolved**:

- (a) It has sufficient information to make a decision to grant Mr Simmonds funding from the Riccarton/Wigram 2013/14 Discretionary Response Fund; and
- (b) To grant, in principal, up to \$1,000 from the Riccarton/Wigram 2013/14 Discretionary Response Fund towards the proposed work on the Harrington Park fence mural.

10. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES – 16 APRIL 2013

The Board **resolved** that the minutes of the Board's ordinary meeting of 16 April 2013 be confirmed.

11. NOTICES OF MOTION

The following notice of motion submitted by Helen Broughton, pursuant to Standing Order 3.10.1 for the 28 May 2013 meeting of the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board, received on 11 March 2013.

That the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board allocate up to \$5000 from its 2013/2014 Discretionary Fund for an independent review of the data compiled by ECan relating to air pollution from the Owaka Pit

The Board **decided** that it would discuss the situation at the Owaka Pit further at its 18 June 2013 meeting.

Helen Broughton **withdrew** her Notice of Motion.

12. JANET STREET/WHARENUI ROAD – PROPOSED NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS

The Board considered a report seeking its approval for the installation of no stopping restrictions at the intersection of Janet Street and Wharenui Road.

The Board **resolved** to approve:

- (a) That all existing parking restrictions on the northern side of Janet Street commencing at its intersection with Wharenui Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of eight metres be revoked.
- (b) That all existing parking restrictions on the southern side of Janet Street commencing at its intersection with Wharenui Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of eight metres be revoked.
- (c) That all existing parking restrictions on the western side of Wharenui Road commencing at its intersection with Janet Street and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 12 metres be revoked.
- (d) That all existing parking restrictions on the western side of Wharenui Road commencing at its intersection with Janet Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 15 metres be revoked.
- (e) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the northern side of Janet Street commencing at its intersection with Wharenui Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of eight metres.
- (f) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the southern side of Janet Street commencing at its intersection with Wharenui Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of eight metres.

- (g) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the western side of Wharenui Road commencing at its intersection with Janet Street and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 12 metres.
- (h) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the western side of Wharenui Road commencing at its intersection with Janet Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 15 metres.

13. NEILL STREET – PROPOSED NO STOPPING RESTRICTION

The Board considered a report seeking its approval to install no stopping restrictions along Neil Street.

The Board **resolved** to approve:

- (a) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on western side of Neill Street commencing at a point 32 metres from its intersection with Main South Road and extending in a southerly direction and around the bend in the road for a distance of 44 metres.
- (b) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on western side of Neill Street commencing at a point 138 metres from its intersection with Main South Road and extending in a south-east direction for a distance of 23 metres.
- (c) That the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south-eastern side of Neill Street commencing at a point 95 metres from its intersection with Main South Road and extending in a southerly direction and around the bend in the road for a distance of 28 metres.
