STAFF RECOMMENDATION

9.3 **SELWYN STREET PARKING**

Staff advice was given that no consultation had yet been undertaken on the proposed establishment of a resident's car park, and this is required prior to installation.

The Board **resolved** that:

9.3.1 With regard to clause 4.4 in the minutes of the meeting of 5 August 2014 on the installation of a resident's car park on Selwyn Street, the installation is only to proceed following public consultation being undertaken and the Board being satisfied of support for the installation.

9.3.2 In the special circumstances the Board delegates to the Area Traffic Engineer the power to revoke any existing parking restrictions in the area covered by clause 9.3.1 prior to installation of a resident's car park under that clause.

14. 350 SELWYN STREET BUS STOP MARKINGS

The Board considered a report seeking its approval to upgrade parking restrictions at the existing bus stop located on Selwyn Street outside the Bishop Selwyn Lifecare Centre.

The Board **resolved** to:

14.1 Revoke all existing parking and stopping restrictions on the eastern side of Selwyn Street commencing at a point 41 metres south of Ruskin Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 30 metres.

14.2 Approve that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the eastern side of Selwyn Street commencing at a point 41 metres south of Ruskin Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of eight metres.

14.3 Approve that a marked bus stop be installed on the eastern side of Selwyn Street commencing at a point 49 metres south of Ruskin Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 14 metres.

14.4 Approve that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited on the eastern side of Selwyn Street commencing at a point 63 metres south of Ruskin Street and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of eight metres.

1. PURPOSE AND ORIGIN OF REPORT

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek that the Spreydon/Heathcote Community Board consider the application by the Christchurch School of Music to Community Boards across the city for a total amount of \$15,000 funding for the Christchurch Youth Orchestra Trip to Brisbane project and decide whether it will allocate funding from its 2014/15 Discretionary Response Fund.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2.1 Not applicable

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The purpose of the Fund is to assist community groups where the project and funding request falls outside other council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations.
- 3.2 At the Council meeting of 22 April 2010, Council resolved to change the criteria and delegations around the local Discretionary Response Fund.
- 3.3 The change in criteria limited the items that the local Discretionary Response Fund does not cover to only:
- (a) Legal challenges or Environment Court challenges against the Council, Council Controlled Organisations or Community Boards decisions;
 - (b) Projects or initiatives that change the scope of a Council project; and
 - (c) Projects or initiatives that will lead to ongoing operational costs to the Council.

Council also made a note that: *"Community Boards can recommend to the Council for consideration grants under (b) and (c)."*

4. COMMENT

- 4.1 In 2014/15, the total budget available for allocation in the Spreydon/Heathcote Discretionary Response Fund is \$51,197. The Discretionary Response Fund opens each year on 1 July and closes on 30 June the following year, or when all funds are expended.
- 4.2 Based on the above criteria, the application from Christchurch School of Music is eligible for funding.
- 4.3 Detailed information on the application including details of the orchestra members resident in the Spreydon/Heathcote Ward and staff comments on the application are included in the attached Decision Matrix. (refer **Attachment 1**)

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 There is currently \$35,397 remaining in the Board's 2014/15 Discretionary Response Fund.
- 5.2 Current recommendations align with the 2013-16 Three Year Plan page 227 regarding community grants schemes including Board funding.

Overall the tour involves 43 students across seven wards of Christchurch.</p> <p>As the premiere orchestra of the CSM, the CYO has been invited to perform in an Australian Youth Orchestra Festival. The schedule for the tour includes a performance with the Sydney Youth Orchestra, the Festival Finale concert, the Corinda State School and a public concert at St Paul's Church.</p> <p>The CYO students usually have progressed through the CSM and are primarily secondary school and university students, aged 16 to 25 years. The students first begin playing with the Junior Symphony Orchestra, then the Intermediate Symphony, followed by the Sinfonia. Sinfonia players audition for places in the CYO. They continue to undertake weekly lessons throughout this time. Once in the CYO, the students play a mentoring role for the CSM students as well as at their secondary schools and with their own instrumental students. Some CYO students also tutor at the CSM and in primary and intermediate schools around Christchurch. CYO performs three to four major concerts during the March to October period, as well as taking part in CSM community events and concerts. The CYO tours most years with destinations as diverse as Sydney, Stewart Island and Tekapo.</p> <p>The CSM was established in 1955 to provide an education in instrumental music for primary school students. Since then the school has extended its activities to include students of all ages and choral groups. The aims of the school are to give tuition in practical and theoretical music skills, and to present concerts and recitals of instrumental and choral music. They have an office and library in Waltham Road and hold its classes and ensembles at Catholic Cathedral College and Marian College.</p> <p>The group has been undertaking a variety of fundraising activities including sausage sizzles every Saturday for the year and holding a movie concert fundraiser. Individuals have also been doing their own fundraising towards the cost to attend. The total cost per person is \$1,750 (includes airfares, accommodation, meals, insurance and land transport). Staff considers this application suited to the Discretionary Response Fund given the number of students involved and that the school has made the application on the students' behalf.</p>
