4. Deputations by Appointment

Part B

4.1 Arthur Collins and Tom Collins - Conflict at Magazine Bay, Lyttelton

Arthur and Tom Collins addressed the Board regarding issues at Magazine Bay, Lyttelton involving conflict between yachties and local teenagers. Tom Collins explained to the Board that swimmers like to jump off a high platform situated in the bay. The platform was behind a barbed wire fence and swimmers therefore have to swim around, and close to, moored yachts to access the platform ladder. This is causing conflict, and has resulted in the police being called on at least one occasion. The deputation asked for the Board's support to help resolve this situation, possibly by moving the gate and fenced off access to the high platform, so it could be accessed from the adjacent jetty. They also suggested that some safety improvements could be made at the same time, for example the installation of a rubber life buoy.

4.2 James Ensor – Proposed Boat Safety Project at Naval Point

James Ensor and Roger Allen from the Naval Point Boat Security and Safety Association, addressed the Board on the Association's proposed boat safety project at Naval Point. They noted that there were some 10,000 trailer boat owners in Canterbury and they believed there was not one safe all-weather slipway for them to launch/retrieve boats in the Christchurch district. They advised the Board that they would bring an update on their project back to a meeting early next year when they would be asking for the Board's support through the Long Term Plan process to seek funding for the upgrading of Naval Point facilities.

4.3 Marion Hore – Residents Only Parking Space

Marion Hore addressed the Board on the request for a "residents only" parking space for 14 Ticehurst Road, Lyttelton and explained that because of access issues for her disabled husband, there was a need for them to be able to park close to their home.

Further discussion regarding this item was dealt with under Clause 10 of the minutes.

The Board **agreed** that Board member Jed O'Donoghue work with local residents to see if some local understanding could be arranged to assist Mr and Mrs Hore with parking closer to their residence.

4.4 Whakaraupō Carving Centre - Linda Goodwin and Caine Tauwhare

Caine Tauwhare from the Whakaraupō Carving centre sought formal support from the Board for a proposed Pou Project that the Centre is wanting to develop and implement in 2017. He



explained the project would involve the design, making and installation of three pou – on Quail Island, Pirau and Ripapa Island. The Carving Centre would work with the three school communities within the harbour, along with community stakeholders to achieve this. The purpose of the Pou project will be to highlight the significant history of the three locations and to try to give people a sense of belonging to this place.

She believed that the standard of maintenance on many of these items had deteriorated over recent years and she asked that Lyttelton be afforded the same level of maintenance as that of the rest of the city. Ms Harrison said that she had submitted numerous Requests for Service, but the situation remained the same. However, she also reported on a successful meeting she had recently had with the new Park Ranger, so was hopeful of some improvement.

Board Comment

6.1 Akaroa Main Wharf and Loss of Open Public Space

Ms Andrews had written to the Board expressing her concern regarding the loss of open public space, due to alteratons made to the Black Cat offices, on the Akaroa Wharf.

The Board also received a tabled letter from the Akaroa Fishermens' Association expressing its concern that the fisherman's landing on the south side of the wharf was now unable to be used for its original purpose of unloading fish, washing down of boats and as a general maintenance area for fishing boats. Fishermen are now forced to use the pontoons being used by cruise ship tenders and tourists boats, a situation they noted was not ideal.
