Mayor's Report to Council – February— March 2017

Mayor's Introduction

March was another busy month, with a range of community activities taking place, from the launch of the Mainland Tactix Netball Season through to the next step in developing an Antarctic relationship with the city of Busan in Korea.

And it was a month of loss with the passing of one of our beloved Pacifica Community Leaders, Memea Eleitino Bubsy Ma'aelopa. Bubsy lived to serve his community in all its diversity, winning the respect and love of all who came into contact with him. He was a selfless man who devoted his life to the wellbeing of others, and he had that smile that told you that you were going to agree to whatever he asked for. He will be greatly missed.

March saw the Prime Minister, Rt Hon Bill English, and the Minister of Education, Hon Hekia Parata, officially open the new Haeata Community Campus, which replaces Aranui High, Aranui Primary, Avondale and Wainoni Schools. The school was expecting just over 600 enrolments before they opened – over 900 turned up on day one. It will be interesting to see how the new 'modern learning environments' contribute to developing the full potential of these children (who seemed pretty happy with their brand new school).

Hundreds of university students turned up at the Southshore Spit on March 4 ready to restore the track, clear the weeds and build a community picnic area. The Student Volunteer Army is a great legacy of the community response to the earthquakes. Here they are 6 years down the track making a huge difference. The Park Rangers said this one morning of voluntary effort by the SVA saved them months of work.

On the same day thousands of people turned up in the East Frame to celebrate the Holi Festival – the Festival of Colours – which represents the victory of good, peace and love over evil.

It was a wonderful and colourful display of the diversity of our city. It was also great to see Regenerate Christchurch there gathering ideas about the future of the city.

I didn't make it to Linwood's LYFE festival but a number of councillors attended and said it was a great occasion too.

The next day was Japan Day and Children's Day and thousands of people turned up to both events. I loved the opportunity to participate in the traditional Japanese Tea Ceremony and rice pounding to make traditional rice cakes. And Children's Day was held in the residential red zone for the first time. What a great chance for us to see the huge potential of what is just a small portion of the red zone.

I was pleased Dame Susan Devoy, Human Rights Commissioner, was able to turn up to both the Holi Festival and Japan Day.

The relationships between the Antarctic Programmes we host seem to go from strength to strength. I was pleased to welcome the new President of the Korea Polar Research Institute to Christchurch at the beginning of the month. Then at the end of the month I hosted the Mayor of Busan, Korea's major port city, with whom I will sign an MOU about Antarctic collaboration in the middle of the year.

As you will see from the events calendar, I attend many fundraising dinners and events. One that was near and dear to my heart was the Hurunui fundraiser, which raised over \$20,000 to support the rebuild of community facilities after their earthquake.

I am pleased that the Te Hononga—Nga Papatipu Runanga Committee is making such good progress. It has truly exceeded my expectations.

It was an honour to be able to represent the city at the farewell dinner for Ta Mark Solomon, who has been the Kaiwhakahaere of Te Runanga O Ngai Tahu for 18 years. So much has happened in this time. But in terms of the role that Ngai Tahu played during the earthquake response and the legislative framework that brought Ngai Tahu to the table as a strategic partner, we owe Ta Mark a debt of gratitude. He could walk into any meeting with the mana of the iwi to the fore—he personified the values that Ngai Tahu hold wherever he went:

Whanaungatanga—*family*
Manaakitanga—*looking after our people*
Tohungatanga—*expertise*
Kaitiakitanga—*stewardship*
Tikanga—*appropriate action*
Rangatiratanga—*leadership*

External Meetings

Greater Christchurch Urban Development Strategy Implementation Committee (UDSIC) - 3 March 2017: the Committee considered an updated Memorandum of Agreement to support the renewed role and operation of the Committee and the Partnership; and we will discuss this further at the next meeting. We also discussed the approach we will adopt in reviewing the Urban Development Strategy, starting with a settlement pattern review, as required by the National Policy Statement on Urban Development Capacity.

Greater Christchurch Public Transport Committee— 15 March 2017: At the March meeting the committee agreed to progress a programme business case for the Future of Public Transport. This will provide the evidence for decisions about how best to invest in public transport, and ensuring all transport networks are integrated.

The three entity "regeneration ecosystem" is a good model for this stage of the recovery and collaboration between the entities is key.

CCHL Directors Tour of Lyttelton Port—30 March 2017

This was an excellent opportunity to view the Port recovery from the harbour, looking back towards the planned areas of development.

The scale of the recovery effort is enormous, but it really will enable the Port to be future-proofed for generations to come.
