AKAROA MUSEUM DIRECTOR'S UPDATE - 31 August 2017

#.1 VISITORS

Visitor numbers

Visitor total for 2016/17 was 23,962 compared to 24,398 for the previous year. All visitorrelated levels of service targets were met for the year (number of visitors and cost per visitor).

Opening hours

Levels of service target for opening hours, a minimum of 2090 hours open to the public, was exceeded – the Museum was open for 2110 hours during the year.

The Museum switches to summer opening hours on 25 September, just after the start of daylight saving.

#.2 EXHIBITIONS

Temporary exhibitions

Exhibition related levels of service target, a minimum of two temporary exhibitions annually, was met. New Collections continues in the temporary exhibition gallery. We plan to refresh this gallery before the onset of the summer season, other projects allowing.

Long term exhibitions

The next two long-term exhibitions, called Land and Sea (in the Steel Gallery) and Tales of Banks Peninsula (in the lower gallery), are planned to open on 10 November.

#.3 COLLECTIONS

Levels of service targets

Collections related levels of service measure the number of acquisitions received and documented, and the amount of backlog documentation addressed – both levels of service targets were achieved, or exceeded.

Recent acquisitions

The Friends of the Museum has recently purchased two letters, written by Frank Worsley during the early part of World War II, and donated them to the Museum. The letters record Worsley's research into purchasing cold weather equipment for a military operation in Norway. They are a valuable addition to the Museum's existing Frank Worsley collection, and will be incorporated into the Worsley section of Tales of Banks Peninsula.

#.4 FACILITIES

Grounds maintenance

A large self-sown cherry tree, located between the main Museum building and the court house, is presenting problems for building maintenance and visitor safety. An arborist's inspection has resulted in a recommendation to remove the tree, as follows:

Although the tree is attractive when in blossom and in autumn colours, and provides welcome shade in the summer, it has outgrown its location.

The Museum Director requests the Committee's support to remove this tree.



Cleaning contract commenced

At the beginning of July, for the first time commercial cleaners began cleaning the public areas of the Museum. This is work that previously had been carried out by Museum staff, and all are pleased to be relieved of the task, on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at least.

Langlois-Eteveneaux cottage

Repair and conservation work is due to start on the Langlois-Eteveneaux cottage at the beginning of September. Included in this work is the replacement of the picket fence that fronts the Museum site, from Rue Balguerie around the corner onto Rue Lavaud and extending to the butcher's shop.

#.5 OTHER

Friends engraved pavers project

The laying of the first set of engraved pavers at the Museum's entrance occurred at the end of July and they are attracting a lot of positive comment. Most of the names are those of early Banks Peninsula families, or people with a long association with the Museum, so as well as being an excellent fundraiser, the presence of the names at the Museum's entrance serves to remind everyone of the strong connections of the local community to the Museum.

Ashburton Historical Society talk

The director will be travelling to Ashburton on Sunday 27 August to talk to the Ashburton Historical Society on the topic of Akaroa Museum's post-earthquake rejuvenation.

Placenames of Banks Peninsula and the Port Hills

The same day, Sunday 27 August, Gordon Ogilvie's new book, *Placenames of Banks Peninsula and the Port Hills*, will be launched at the University Bookshop. The book will be a long-awaited addition to both the Museum's library and to the shop shelves. Dan Smith, collections manager, will be attending to represent Akaroa Museum.

French Festiva

The Museum will be represented at French Festival by the Friends of the Museum. The Friends are taking a table in the heritage tent at the Festival, promoting membership, engraved pavers and selling some shop product.

Progress update, The Future of Heritage in Christchurch and Banks Peninsula

Victoria Bliss, from Council's Heritage Team, will be presenting an update on progress with the development of a new heritage strategy for Council, here in Akaroa on Tuesday 5 September, starting at noon. The venue is the court house, access through the Museum.

Arborist Report on Cherry Tree

I was asked to go out and do an assessment on a Cherry tree at Akaroa Museum.

I met with Lynda Wallace (Director of the museum) on site and we went over what her concerns were. The tree is self-sown and is situated approximately 1 metre away from the museum building with branches that overhang both the museum and courthouse buildings. (See attached photographs)

Several branches have been removed by contractors when the museum roof was replaced causing it to have an unbalanced crown. The roots have lifted the path next to the tree which visitors use as access from the museum to the court house. The path also gets covered in leaves and fruit during the autumn months and the leaves also fill the guttering causing it to corrode faster than usual. The tree doesn't appear to have had a lot of maintenance in the past so it doesn't have great form and the stem is included at the base.

I think it should be removed. It has outgrown its location, it would reduce future maintenance costs and lower the risk of someone tripping on the uplifted path or slipping on fallen leaves.
