PALMERS ROAD (FROM BOWHILL ROAD - NEW BRIGHTON ROAD) ROAD RENEWAL PROJECT

Purpose:

This memo is in response to the action memo that followed the Coastal - Burwood Community Board meeting of 7/05/2018.

The action memo stated the following:

That the Coastal-Burwood Community Board:

- 1. Approve the width of 10 metres (as shown in the Community Board report from 7 May 2018, tabled attachment D) for the general layout of Palmers Road (Bowhill Road New Brighton Road).
- 2. Request that within the 10 metre width proposal for the Palmers Road (Bowhill Road New Brighton Road) renewal staff investigate options for:
 - a. Moving the chicane from outside 96 Palmers Road to allow for an extra car park.
 - b. Reducing the number of chicanes in the design.
 - c. Removing all chicanes from the design.
- 3. Request that for the Palmers Road (Bowhill Road New Brighton Road) renewal proposals outlined above, staff provide advice regarding the consultation requirements of these options.

Staff response to item 2 above:

a) Moving the chicane from outside 96 Palmers Road to allow for an extra car park.

Following consultation, this chicane was moved from being outside no 96 to outside no 98 Palmers Rd. The residents at no 98 were consulted about the change and happy for it to be relocated. This allowed a carpark to be located directly outside no 96 but resulted in the loss of and extra carpark

overall. If the desire is to maximise on street parking then it would ideally move back to being outside no 96 Palmers Road. Refer to Appendix A for plan amended after consultation.

If the chicane is to remain outside either number 96 or 98, no further consultation would be required.

Moving the chicane in the opposite direction becomes more complicated due to the number of driveways, and is not recommended. These properties also have higher density housing so locating it here would impact on more people. The possible moves are illustrated in Appendix B of this memo.

b) Reducing the number of chicanes in the design.

For effective and constant speed reduction the spacing of chicanes is important. Reducing the number is likely to lead to acceleration and braking between the chicanes, reducing residential amenity with speed and noise. For this reason it is recommended that if the Board are of a mind to reduce the number of chicanes, they give preference to the option suggested in c) as follows.

Speed counts have previously been undertaken on Palmers Road (2009), to the north of the Bowhill Road intersection, which show that vehicles are travelling at 49 Km/h. This is in a location where there is significant parking, a 9 metre wide road, and a sharp 90 degree bend. These are all elements that act to reduce vehicle speeds. The section of Palmers Road which is now being looked at, New Brighton Road – Bowhill Road, is a straight road and will be 10 metres wide. Reducing the number of chicanes, may result in higher vehicle speeds for this 300 metre section than desired. If speed were to be an issue in future, additional treatments would need to be prioritised as a new project.

If the number of chicanes is to be reduced, depending on location, further consultation may be required.

c) <u>Implications of removing all chicanes from the design and consultation requirements.</u>


Removing the chicanes is feasible, and while the traffic calming impact would be reduced, this can be monitored. If speed were to be an issue in future, additional treatments would need to be prioritised as a new project.

An option for removing the chicanes is attached as Appendix C to this memo. This option shows the 10m carriageway with raised platforms at the intersections of Bowhill Road and Caithness Street, to provide some traffic calming. The function of them is to moderate speeds at the intersections themselves typically given that we would expect to see pedestrians crossing in the vicinity. The raised treatment at the Palmers Road / Bowhill Road intersection would also serve to moderate the speeds of the northbound vehicles approaching the bend thereby addressing an underlying issue of speeds and crashes on the bend. It should be noted that the raised treatments would be designed to accommodate buses in case they were to be reintroduced to the street in future.










Chicane Outside 92





Chicane Outside 96


