Nature of Issue and Origin	• This series of briefings is based on the Mayor and Councillor's Letter of Expectation, as well as the Long-term Plan process and high-level phasings approved by the Council.
Timing	This briefing is expected to last for 2-3 hours.
Confidentiality	The briefing and any shared information are not confidential.
	Guidance is sought on the following topics so that they meet the Council's expectations, in readiness for staff preparation of the Draft Long-term Plan adoption report and supporting documentation, including coordination of the related audit (community consultation commencing March 2024):
Outcome	Overview of current status of LTP development.
Sought	Financial strategy.
	Guidance on deferred matters.
	• CE recommendations for the draft LTP 2024-34 (Capital Endowment Fund and Contestable Fund Considerations) (from public briefing of 13 December 2023).
	• Initial discussion regarding proposed Councillor amendments for the draft LTP.
ELT Consideration	The Executive Leadership Team has considered this information prior to it being provided to the Council.
Next Steps	 Guidance from this briefing will continue to inform the development of the draft LTP. LTP development and decision-making is extensively reviewed by the Office of the Auditor-General (via Audit NZ.) Results of the audit review are published with the draft and final LTP documents. The Council will meet to adopt the draft LTP 2024-34 for consultation on 14 February 2024. Community consultation period begins March 2024, including submissions and hearings.
Key points / background	 External Impacts Both nationally and locally, organisations and individuals are grappling with challenging economic conditions and the rising cost of living.

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	• The Council is facing significant increases to non-controllable costs, generally the impacts of external influences outside its control (for example, increases in inflation, interest rates, insurance costs).
	 What Matters Most The What Matters Most city-wide survey showed that most services council provides are important to someone – one person's 'must have' is another person's 'nice to have'. The challenge for the Council is to balance these competing values and priorities alongside the financial challenges Council is facing.
	In line with Councillors' Letter of Expectations, extensive briefings have been conducted with Councillors since July 2023. Documentation and recordings from these briefings have been made publicly available, with some briefings advertised and held in public.
	 Capital Endowment Fund and Contestable Fund Considerations Additional information and advice were requested by the Council. Staff propose changes and options to the Capital Endowment Fund (CEF) and other identified contestable funding schemes with the draft 2024/34 LTP. This includes:
	 the operation, maintenance, and use of the proceeds of the CEF. intended purpose, use and resources available; identified contestable funding schemes subject to the staff proposals for change in the draft LTP, including: Biodiversity; Sustainability; Heritage; City Placemaking; Accessibility Working Group Seed Funding.
	 Proposed amendments Following general direction given by the Council during briefings held July-December 2023 a range of amendments have since been proposed by Councillors for the draft LTP. Staff advice is being prepared in response to these proposed amendments.
