Greater Christchurch Partnership: **A strong foundation for the future**

- **Long-standing and broad partnership is a significant opportunity** – local government, iwi, health board, central government (NZTA, DPMC, Regen)
- **Strong foundation strategy** – Urban Development Strategy
- **Partnership through adversity**
- **Leading in wellbeing thinking** – UDS, Canterbury Wellbeing Index

- Greater Christchurch is **New Zealand's second city and capital of the South Island** – we have the platform to achieve more and contribute more to national wellbeing
 - New infrastructure – resilient attractive buildings
 - High amenity value – beautiful natural environment, social amenity
 - Strong tertiary base – four tertiary institutions, major tertiary hospital
 - Affordable housing and favourable rent-income ratio
 - Low traffic congestion
 - International connectivity – airport, port
 - Strong, diverse and resilience economy
- Greater Christchurch has **capacity to absorb growth** to support national prosperity

To realise the opportunity, we need:

A clear way forward now

- We need to **leverage the investment to date** and realise the opportunity of Greater Christchurch
- Central government partnership and investment is **dependent on a clear, shared aspiration and plan**
- We need:
 - A **new positioning** based on the national opportunity of Greater Christchurch
 - An **agreed vision and collective focus** to inspire and coordinate effort



National context:

Desire to partner with regions /cities

- **Partnership with Govt is bringing benefit to other regions:**
 - Waikato corridor Urban Growth Partnership
 - Taranaki 2050 (Transition Plan)
 - Queenstown Spatial Plan
- **Strong expectation by Govt that:**
 - Will engage with a coordinated GC
 - Strong alignment with Living Standards framework
 - GC have a clear rationale for partnership and investment



A strong focus on a shared vision:

Greater Christchurch 2050

- **Strong consensus** by GCP CEOs and previous GCPC of the need
- Greater Christchurch 2050 will enable:
 - **Strong, consistent positioning** of Greater Christchurch – with central government, private sector, people
 - **Stronger partnership and shared purpose**
 - **Coordinated focus** on improving wellbeing

1. Identify the opportunities and challenges facing Greater Christchurch
2. Articulate the opportunity of Greater Christchurch in a national and international context
3. Identify areas of focus for GCP
