1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for the Waimāero/Fendalton-Waimairi-Harewood Community Board Submissions Committee to consider and, if appropriate, undertake the preparation of a Board submission to the Council on City Mall and Oxford Terrace Access Changes.
- 1.2 The Council is proposing to create consistent rules along Oxford and City Mall to make it safer for people walking and gathering along these areas. It is proposed that this be done by:
 - Reducing the speed limit in City Mall to 10 kilometres per hour
 - Restricting goods vehicles access times to mornings only between 5am and 10am daily
 - Allowing people to bike through at a slow speed
 - Changing the legal status of City Mall from a pedestrian mall to a shared zone, extending the shared zone on Oxford Terrace.
 - Installing retractable bollards at the intersection of Oxford Terrace and Hereford Street with access retained for emergency vehicles and the tram.
