- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Waipapa/Papanui Innes Community Board Submissions Committee the opportunity to make a submission on behalf of the Board about the Wheels to Wings Major Cycleway Project.
- 1.2 Consultation opened for feedback on 25 January 2021 and closes on 8 March 2021.
- 1.3 The proposed cycleway begins at the Johns Road cycle and pedestrian underpass, allowing connections to the commercial areas surrounding the airport and to McLeans Island Road via the Johns Road shared path. 1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Waipapa/Papanui Innes Community Board Submissions Committee the opportunity to make a submission on behalf of the Board about the proposed amendments to the Christchurch Central Recovery Plan to manage noise from the Canterbury Multi-Use Arena.
- 1.2 Consultation opened for feedback on 26 January 2021 and closes on 1 March 2021.
- 1.3 Key items in the proposed noise-related conditions and rules include:
 - 1.3.1 A noise limit for concerts.
 - 1.3.2 A noise limit on public address systems for non-concert events.
 - 1.3.3 A bass noise limit to reduce noise nuisance at distance.
 - 1.3.4 Real time noise monitoring at specified compliance points.
 - 1.3.5 A standard finishing time of 11pm, except for New Year's Eve when concerts could continue to 12.30am.
 - 1.3.6 An upper limit of 15 concerts per year over a specified noise limit.
 - 1.3.7 A requirement for a noise management plan.
 - 1.3.8 An amended noise insulation rule to strengthen acoustic insulation requirements for new buildings in the area.

1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Waipapa/Papanui Innes Community Board Submissions Committee the opportunity to make a submission on behalf of the Board about the proposed changes to the District Plan policies and rules regarding significant indigenous vegetation in the coastal environment. Consultation opened for feedback on 11 January 2021 and closes on 23 February 2021.
- 1.2 The proposed changes relate to the type and size of native trees and plants (indigenous vegetation) that can be cleared within areas of existing pasture on coastal farmland.
- 1.3 The changes also seek to:
 - 1.3.1 Clarify the circumstances where an assessment should be undertaken to determine if an area is of significant value for its biodiversity as part of an application for resource consent to undertake clearance.
 - 1.3.2 Update information in the plan that is intended to assist landowners to determine whether they have indigenous vegetation on their properties or not.
