4.1 Eastgate Passenger Transport Hub

Elizabeth Graham, local resident, addressed the Board regarding the current works at the Eastgate Passenger Transport Hub. Ms Graham outlined that the information notices that have been placed are small and are difficult to read for the visually impaired and that the taxi

stand has not been temporary relocated so that there is no taxi stand available at Eastgate Mall during the works.

After questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Ms Graham for her presentation.

The Board agreed to request staff to:

1. Enlarge the temporary relocations of bus stop notices during the Eastgate Transport Hub works to enable them to be read by visually impaired people.
2. To make provision for a temporary taxi stand during the Eastgate Transport Hub works.

4.2 Ferry Road/Waterman Place Intersection

Stephen McPaike, local resident, outlined his concerns about motorists behaviour on Ferry Road in the vicinity of Waterman Place.

After questions from members, the Chairperson thanked for Mr McPaike for his presentation and advised him to report his concerns about motorists speed on Ferry Road to New Zealand Police.

The Board agreed to request that staff:

1. Provide advice on the impact of increasing development on traffic movements in the vicinity of Ferrymead Commercial Area.
2. Undertake a tube count on Ferry Road between Ferrymead Fire Station (925 Ferry Road) and Countdown entry (1008 Ferry Road) and report results to the Board.
3. Request New Zealand Police to monitor the speed on Ferry Road between Ferrymead Fire Station (925 Ferry Road) and Countdown entry (1008 Ferry Road) and report results to the Board.
