- 2020 onwards; entry available for casual users when accompanied by a key holder
- 2021/22 Reduction of key costs

Pay2Play Review

- 2021 Access Review of Installing Pay2Play:
Is this a viable option for casual users?
- Unable to deal with Health and Safety requirements
- Doesn't meet the concept of "walk up and swim"
- Does not allow for young people to book
