

Why review speeds in neighbourhoods?


- *Road to Zero has set a goal of a 40% reduction in Death and Serious injury crashes by 2030*
- Speed management is one of the many tools being used to achieve this
- Safe and appropriate speeds in neighbourhoods can:
- o Improve safety for vulnerable road users
- o Improve connectivity for pedestrians
- o Reduce traffic noise in communities
- Improve safety outside schools in these neighbourhoods



Changes made to plan

- New 30km/h to neighbourhoods around schools
- 40km/h extension to Mays Road, Rutland Street and the streets bound by Mays Road, Rutland Street, Papanui Road and Innes Road
