An alcohol ban would make it an offence to drink on the street, which would mean the local businesses and community could call the Police to move on the people who hang around getting drunk on the street furniture.








Deprivation Index Map of Woolston (redder=more deprived) University of Otago, mapped by Massey University






Index of Multiple Deprivation map of Woolston (redder=more deprived) University of Auckland



Notes - Paul McMahon - for Waikura Community Board re Alcohol Ban in Woolston Village 13/07/2022

Woolston Village is located within a highly deprived community, about 500m from my home as the kereru flies.. The vicinity includes areas with higher populations of Māori and/or Pacific Peoples than Christchurch City, and has fewer full-time workers, and significantly lower median incomes than both Christchurch City and Aotearoa New Zealand as a whole. There can be little doubt it bears a high burden of deprivation and alcohol-related harm.

The streets within a 500m radius and the Woolston Village are littered with empty alcohol containers. What is most upsetting to us is the recent increase in public drinking and intoxication on Ferry Rd, where a group of (mainly) men frequently sit on the street furniture drinking alcohol, leering at women (including my wife), scaring school children, begging for money so they can purchase cheap alcohol from the local off-licenses.

From my discussions with local business people in the area, they agree there is significant and increased alcohol-related harm in the area, which is why several of them hosted my petition asking for an alcohol ban in the Woolston Village.

Without any promotion apart from on one Facebook group, 173 signatures have been gathered online and in person in stores: hairdressers, a dairy, the barber, the pharmacy, and others.

In a recent alcohol hearing, the Woolston Pharmacist noted in his submission,

There is frequent litter, graffiti, and vandalism in Woolston Village. We have been robbed three times since 2011, once at knifepoint.

Woolston has issues with people consuming alcohol on the street and loitering around, particularly on the street furniture on either side of Ferry Road - but particularly on my side. These people typically consume RTDs like Woodstock and Cody's, as well as cheap single beers.

Despite the fact there is a public toilet (currently out of order) on the footpath side of the community library, we frequently have people urinating behind our store underneath the window we use to charge our e-car through. It smells and is unpleasant.

The Council also had to remove the seat beside the community library backed towards the road due to people spending all night there drinking.

[...] on November 3 2021 two police cars and at least three officers manhandled a drunk into one of their patrol cars because he had been harassing people and stumbling around on the road in front of our pharmacy.

[Recently], [someone] was visiting me and had his car parked out the back of the Pharmacy and his Tesla automatically recorded a [man] standing by my white Nissan Leaf sculling a 1.25L of Nitro (6.9 standard drinks, alcoholic energy drink), arriving from the direction of the passage to Ferry Rd. The man sculls the drink, throws up, and sculls the drink again a number of times. Afterwards, we also found a pool of what was likely urine by the car. We found two empties, Nitro and an El Diablo (12%) beer.

Earlier in June 2022, there was an incident where there was a whole group of people drinking alcohol from mid-afternoon to about 7pm on the street furniture by the Community Library. They were very loud, yelling at people abusively and listening to music loudly on a portable speaker. Just prior to them leaving, one of them threw a bottle at the old GP's office (which I own) and it smashed

We do not attempt to intervene or approach these people because they are often in groups and highly intoxicated, as well as abusive and threatening. We are just resigned to it being this way and hope it goes away.

Incidents like these every week, notably on Tuesdays and Wednesdays when people have received their social welfare payments.

A lot of our customers have told us they've been verbally abused by people drinking outside, including being challenged to fights.

[Which is why] I had a number of customers sign the petition to have an alcohol ban implemented in the Woolston Village.

I am aware that an Alcohol Ban is a very blunt tool and is not a solution in itself. I do not wish to criminalise people who are poor and addicted to alcohol, which is why I

approached Housing First to see if they knew a bit about what was going on. It turns out there are only a few rough sleepers around Woolston and they are not part of the problem group above.

I would am seeking your support to start the Council process to look at an alcohol ban in Woolston Village and, furthermore, I would like to seek your support in engaging social agencies, the Police, local businesses, and local residents to make sure Woolston Village is a safe and pleasant environment for everyone.
