The Community Open Forum is a session of up to 30 minutes in total where members of the public and community groups can speak directly to the Waipapa Papanui-Innes Community Board on issues, activities and projects relevant to the <u>Papanui and Innes Wards</u>.

If you wish to speak you should prearrange this with the Community Board Advisor as soon as possible before the day. If there are no speakers in attendance at the start time, or if speaking finishes early, the Board will close the forum. Speaking will generally be limited to five minutes at the discretion of the Chairperson (which allowance should include time to receive questions from the Board).<sup>1</sup>

Presentations of slides or documents is limited to the time allowance; they may be provided in advance to the Community Board Advisor in electronic form. Material must be suitable to become public. Please note that forums are live streamed and a recording may be retained online.
