## Ko wai tatou?



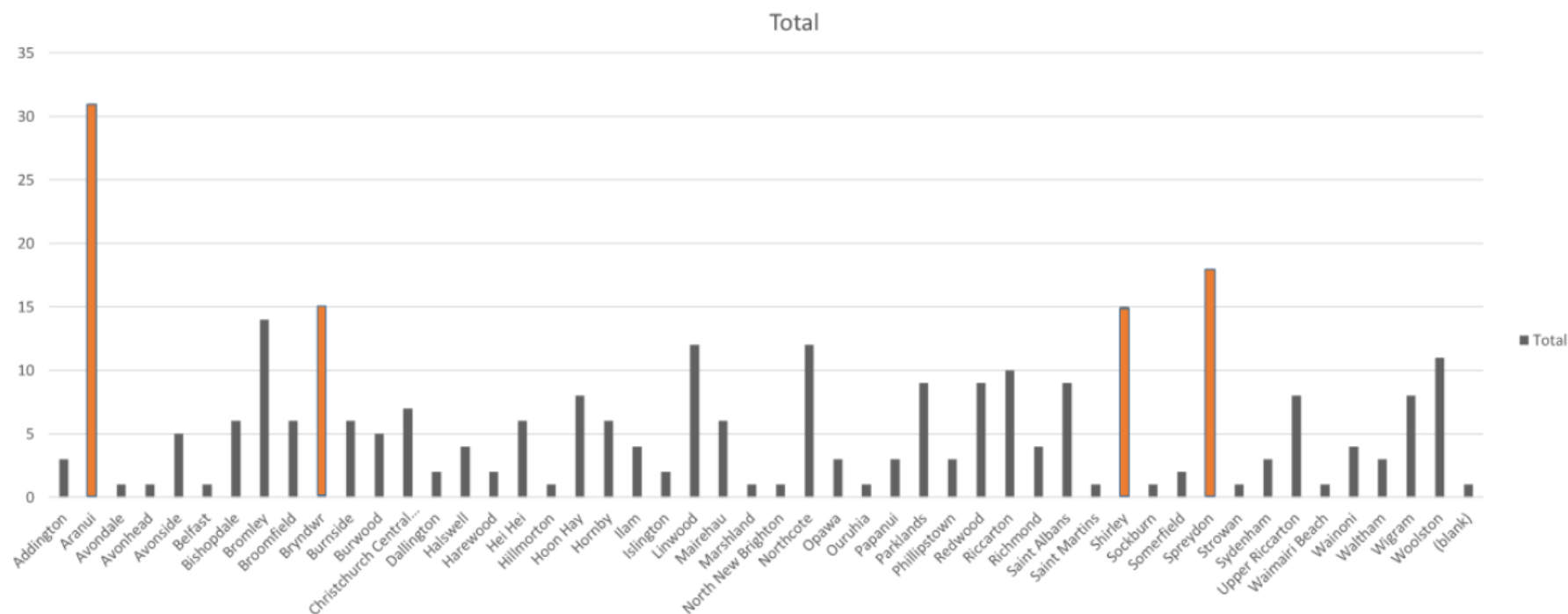
- Opened 7 March 1925 by Hugh Heber Cholmondeley
- Over the past 98 years, Cholmondeley has supported over 30,000 tamariki.
- Continues to deliver free, regular and emergency respite care to tamariki aged 3-12.
- Awhi Team (outreach) works alongside whānau to build resilience and strengthen communities
- 46 kaimahi; 22 full-time, 14 part-time and 10 casual, as well as 6-7 overseas volunteers every 6 months (Denmark/Germany)

# Statistics from 2021-22 Financial Year

- 331 tamariki from 267 whānau
- Over 2,800 bed-nights
- More than 22,500 meals prepared
- 418 off-site activities and experiences around Ōtautahi and Te Whakaraupō
- Operating on an annual budget of approximately \$2.5 - 3 million (70 - 80% community funded)

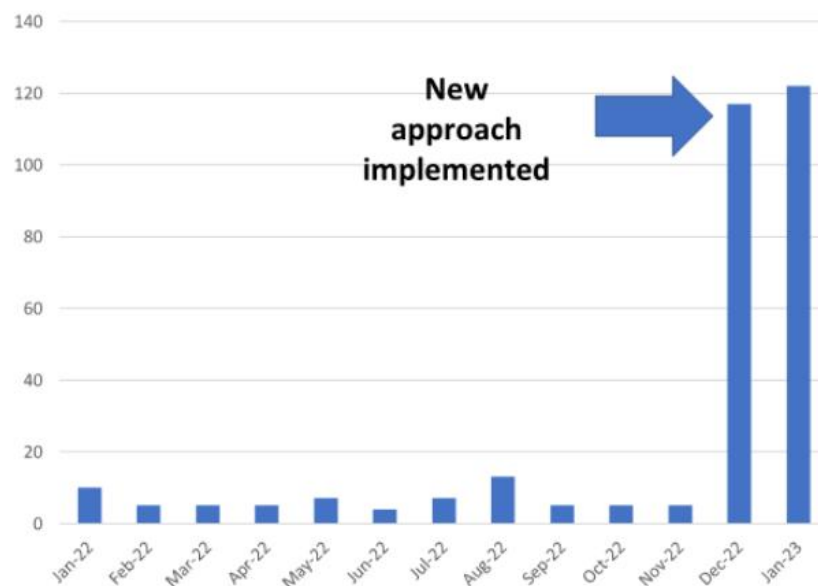

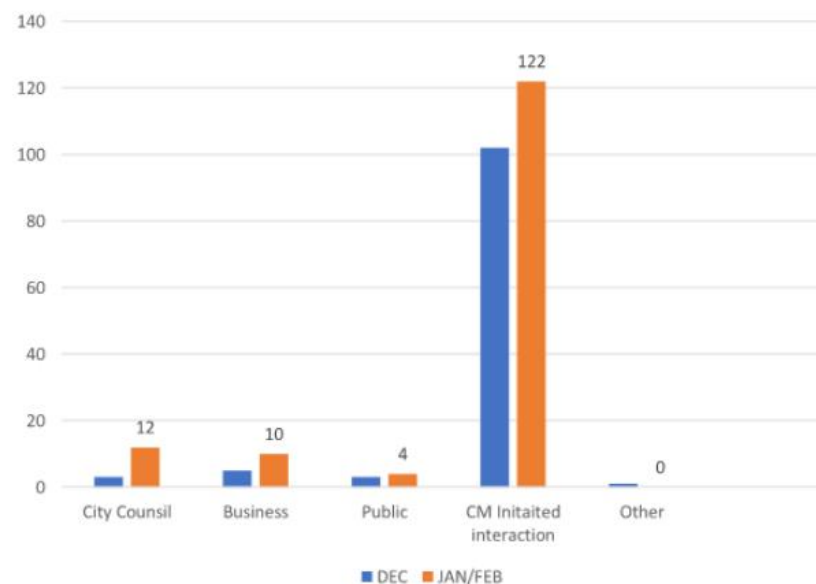

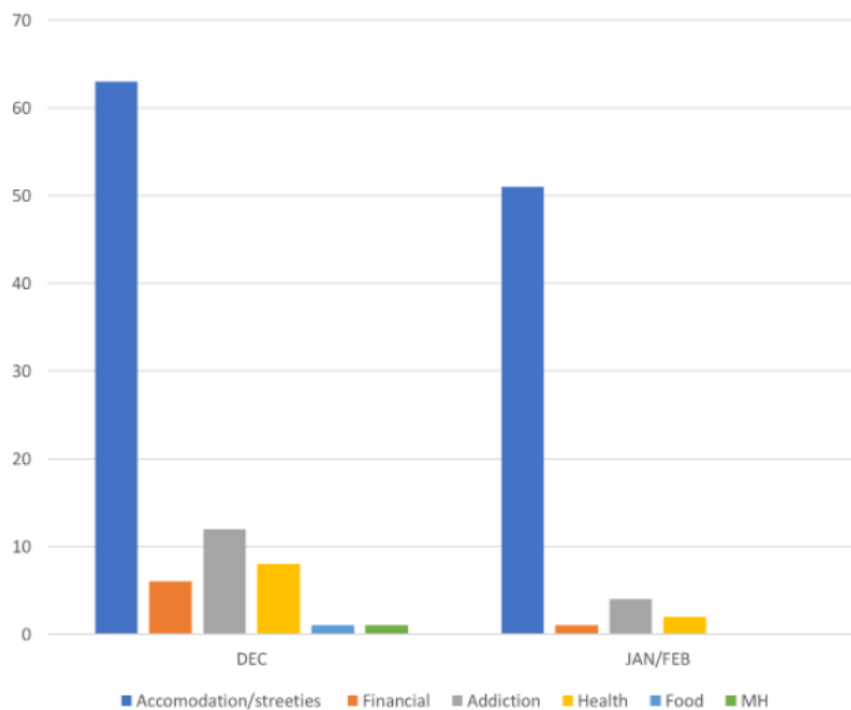
Total Outreach Interactions 2022- 2023



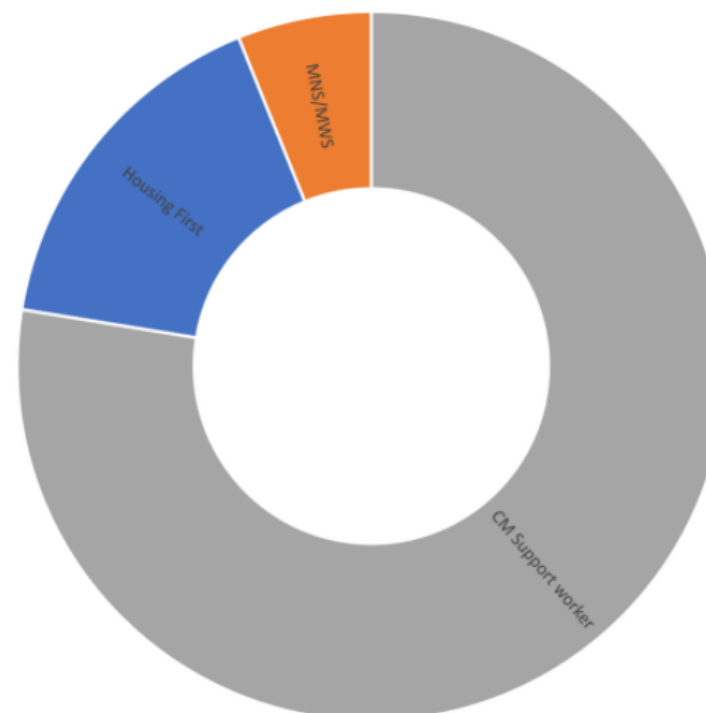
Total Outreach referrals



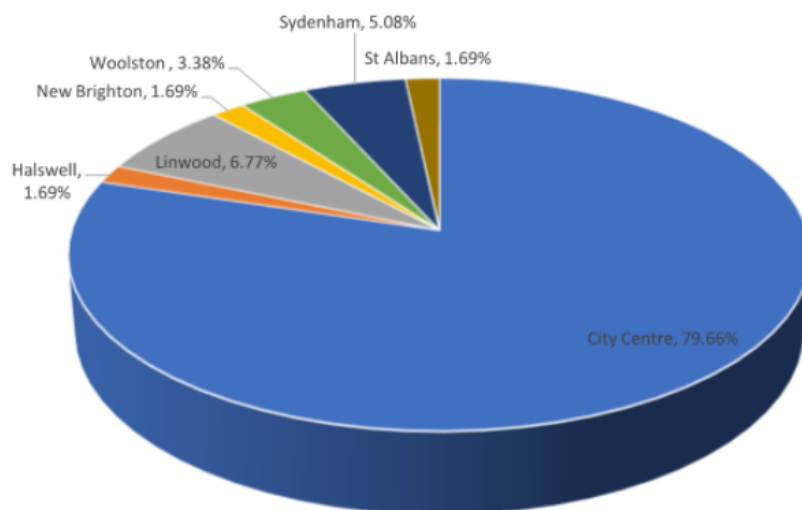

# Gloucester & Hereford Parking Changes

Supporting changes for Rolleston Avenue

Gemma Dioni & Stephen Wright

## Background

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- Transport Operations informed of Museum closure and details of proposed site operations (August 2022)
  - Concern over narrowing of shared path due to the current demands
  - Ongoing complaints over shared path behaviour due to numbers using the path.
  - Ongoing complaints about the crossing of Park Terrace at Salisbury Street

*Ensure safe operation of the street for all road users while the museum works are undertaken with the most minimal disruption to all road users.*

## Considerations

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- Transport Operations informed of Museum closure and details of proposed site operations (August 2022)
  - Opportunity to implement low cost solution to move people who bike from the shared path to the road.
  - Traffic volumes are too high on Rolleston Avenue for some people who ride to share the lane.
  - Opportunity to improve the crossing at Salisbury Street for active users including school children walking and cycling through here.



## Engagement

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- Informing Elected Members & Executive Leadership Team
  - Memo - 31 August 2022
  - Memo - 13 January 2023
  - Report on parking changes for Gloucester and Hereford
- Directly affected stakeholders
  - Ongoing liaison with the Museum team.
  - Visited all the businesses and schools along Rolleston Avenue and Park Terrace (to Salisbury St) to discuss proposal.
  - Met with the tram operator
  - Met with Te Whatu Ora.
  - Provided information to Emergency Services with the invitation to meet.
  - Discussed the proposal with Environment Canterbury.
  - Met with Spokes.

## Engagement

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- Engagement outcomes
  - Supportive of the proposal
  - P3 parking and coach stop on Gloucester Street proposed following discussions with Christ's College
  - New coach pick-up/drop-off proposed on Hereford Street to support tour operators that currently use the bays on Rolleston Avenue that will become parking.
  - Additional wayfinding at the request of The Arts Centre

## Next Steps

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- Ongoing liaison with stakeholders regarding upcoming works
- Start date is April 12 2023.

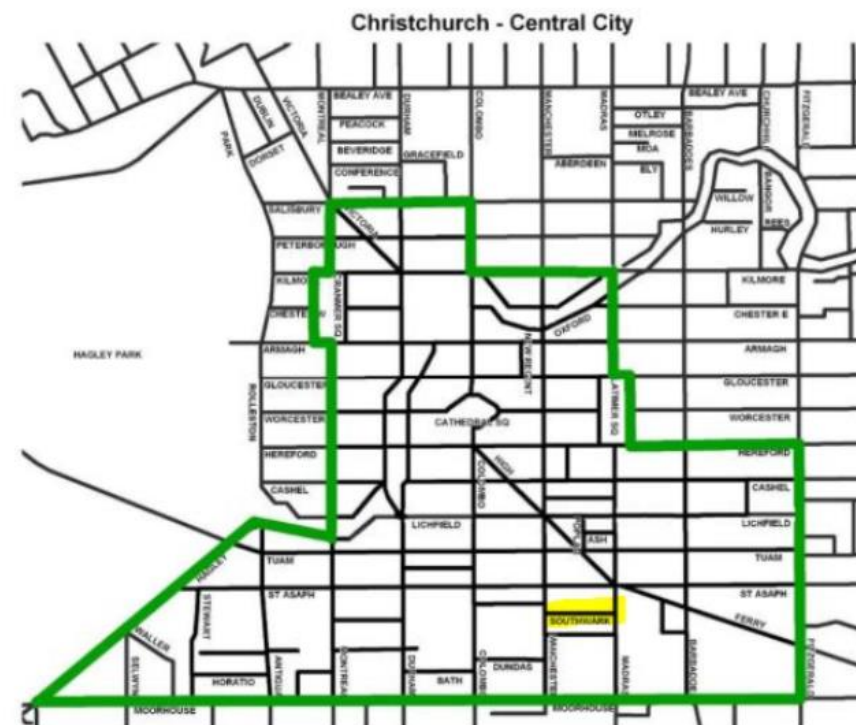

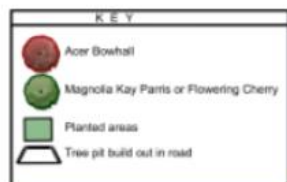
