

 Said Ms Jenkins: "Of course the best solution would be if members of the public didn't discard rubbish into streets and gutters in the first place, as much of it ends up in the rivers.

Said Helene Mautner of the Opawaho Heathcote River Network: "The rivers and estuary are real assets of the city, we need to look after them so we can enjoy them locally and showcase them to our visitors."

Up event is being planned for May 18 with the continuing support of City Care.

Thopefully, with the booms back on the river, we will now

see a significant reduction in rubbish downstream," says Ms Jenkins.

Spokesman for Avon-Otakaro Network Evan Smith said: "Floating rubbish presents a real navigation hazard to recreational users on the river and the rubbish along the banks is a real eyesore that

Another Mother of All Clean diminishes the amenity value of riverside trails. The booms are placed in bends of the rivers in such a way that they don't impede navigation, a win-win for all."

The initiative has the support of the Christchurch West Melton Zone Committee, Environment Canterbury and Department of Conservation. Conservation service volunteers will also be involved from next year.

- The Board approves the landscape development plan for Reserve 1259










