



Activities funded

- 1. Plan to build treatment basins proposed to the consent hearing.
- 2. Set contaminant reduction targets.
- 3. Demonstrate how stormwater quality will get better over time
- Meet specific flood control objectives (mostly re new development)
- 5. Rural areas excluded from SMPs






Flooding


- Pūharakekenui-Styx River rises within the catchment
- Contained within the channel through built-up areas
- Lower catchment is a flood ponding area (tide gates)
- Aquatic macrophyte growth affects water levels downstream of Radcliff Road
 - > +0.3 m average
 - > +0.7 m in extreme














Contaminants

- Usual range of urban contaminants
 - > TSS: roads and construction
 - Copper: brake pads
 - Zinc: roofs and tyres
- ➤ Each new development mitigated through basin + wetland
- ➤ Large ponding areas Cranford North Basin (north of QE2 Dr).
- Best available treatment for Kruses Drain and Prestons Creek catchments.
