Submissions were made by four recognised organisations and 180 individuals

6.6

135 submissions were received from the Heaton Intermediate School community:

Out of 49 students that responded. Three (3) said "no" in the signalised crossing field. No comment about no raised platform

Out of 76 from family/parents/caregivers. Three (3) said "no" to the signalised crossing.

Out of 10 from staff. Zero (0) said "no" to the signalised crossing.

23 people mentioned the raised platform



Signalised crossing was advertised with raised platform

The plan

We're planning to install a safe crossing point for Heaton Intermediate students and others walking, cycling and scooting, to cross Heaton Street.

The work includes:

- · Installation of a signalised pedestrian crossing.
- Installation of a raised safety platform at the signalised crossing to slow traffic, reducing the likelihood and severity of collisions.
- · Painted cycle lanes in the vicinity of the crossing.
- · Relocation of the bus stops and shelters so buses enter and exit the bus stops after the crossing.
- . Moving the P3 parking to support the bus stop relocation.




