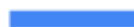

# Summary of Submissions

Submissions were made by four recognised organisations and 180 individuals

6.6

135 submissions were received from the Heaton Intermediate School community:

Out of 49 students that responded. Three (3) said “no” in the signalised crossing field. No comment about no raised platform

Out of 76 from family/parents/caregivers. Three (3) said “no” to the signalised crossing.

Out of 10 from staff. Zero (0) said “no” to the signalised crossing.

23 people mentioned the raised platform

# Signalised crossing was advertised with raised platform

## The plan

We're planning to install a safe crossing point for Heaton Intermediate students and others walking, cycling and scooting, to cross Heaton Street.

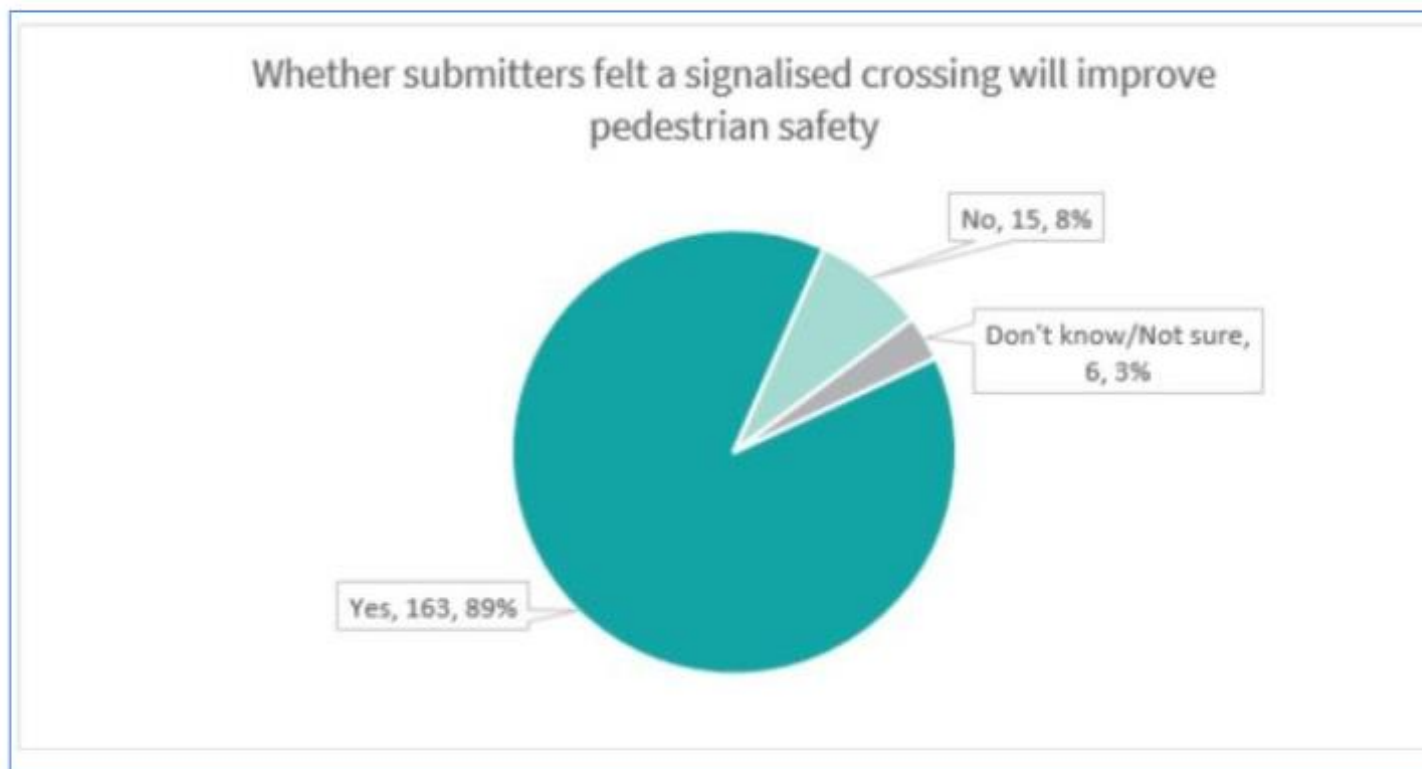
The work includes:

- Installation of a signalised pedestrian crossing.
- Installation of a raised safety platform at the signalised crossing to slow traffic, reducing the likelihood and severity of collisions.
- Painted cycle lanes in the vicinity of the crossing.
- Relocation of the bus stops and shelters so buses enter and exit the bus stops after the crossing.
- Moving the P3 parking to support the bus stop relocation.

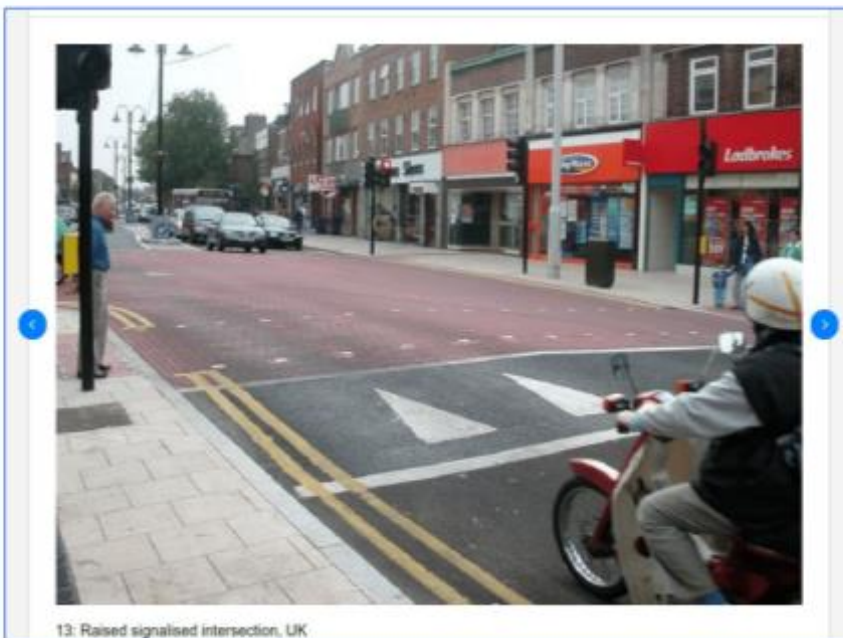
Figure 5.20: Raised table signalised crossings on Pukete Rd and River Rd in Hamilton

## Benefits

- Enhances access for people with ambulatory disabilities by providing level crossing
- Compels drivers to travel at speeds no higher than the street's design speed
- Improves drivers' awareness of presence of pedestrian crossing, particularly at mid-block crossing locations
- Can alert drivers that they are entering a slower-speed, pedestrian-oriented street environment
- Allows convenient pedestrian circulation between high foot traffic destinations on opposite sides of a street
- Encourages motorists to yield to pedestrians
