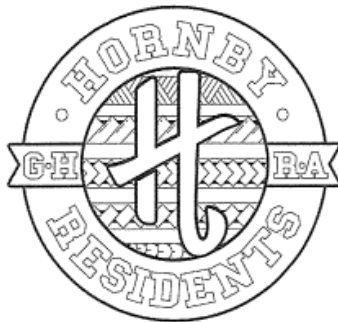

Intersection of Gilberthorpes/Parker and Waterloo Rd.

Good Afternoon,

I am here today, to speak on behalf of the residents located in The Greater Hornby Residents Assn's catchment.

We believe that opportunities were lost, when original consultations took place, about the S.W.Express Cycleway, due to the way consultations were pushed through hurriedly, and staff not truly listening to the Community concerns. That is why we are here, having this consultation now, when if listened to, there would have been no need to.

Cycleways are supported by our community, who want to see our cyclists, pedestrians and motorists safe.

Cycleway technology is meant to decrease the carbon footprint, however, the left in, left out option will only

increase this, with many motorists having to do u-turns to get to their destinations.

Left in, Left out, is only favoured by 8.9%, and these will clearly not be by those residents living in the Moffitt St Waterloo Rd. area who will be cut off from travel to the Mall, or those who live to the north, and use the shops and garage in Waterloo Rd.

Left out, will see trucks using the left out turn of Waterloo Rd then right into Taurima St then left into Waterloo again so they have access to the industrial area to the East of here. This alone could see many accidents due to the narrowness of Taurima St.

Leaving the intersection in the status quo, is also not an option, as motoring accidents may end up with cyclists in the line of fire, from damaged vehicles. A mere 15.44% want this cycleway to proceed as the intersection is now. Lights for cyclists alone will not make this intersection any safer, and we want our people kept safe.

When you read the stats, you can clearly see this intersection is not seen as a safe crossing. When coming from Carmen Rd. I myself travel through Taurima St. then left onto Gilberthorpes, as do many

others, instead of at the crossing which this discussion is about, and if we wish to go to the shops we will have to cross into Parker St, do a u-turn then come back and turn left into Waterloo.

When you have a real in-depth look into this idea, you will see many problems and certainly little solution. You have only created another ongoing problem.

The only clear solution, is to delay this crossing until funding is available, to install a full set of traffic lights at this intersection, complete with pedestrian crossings in all directions. We have at least one resident we know of, who has withdrawn her children from school, as she sees this location as too dangerous to cross with her children.

Once again delay this section of the cycleway until funding is available, do it properly and safely. Do it once and properly as in the end it is the cheapest option in the long run.

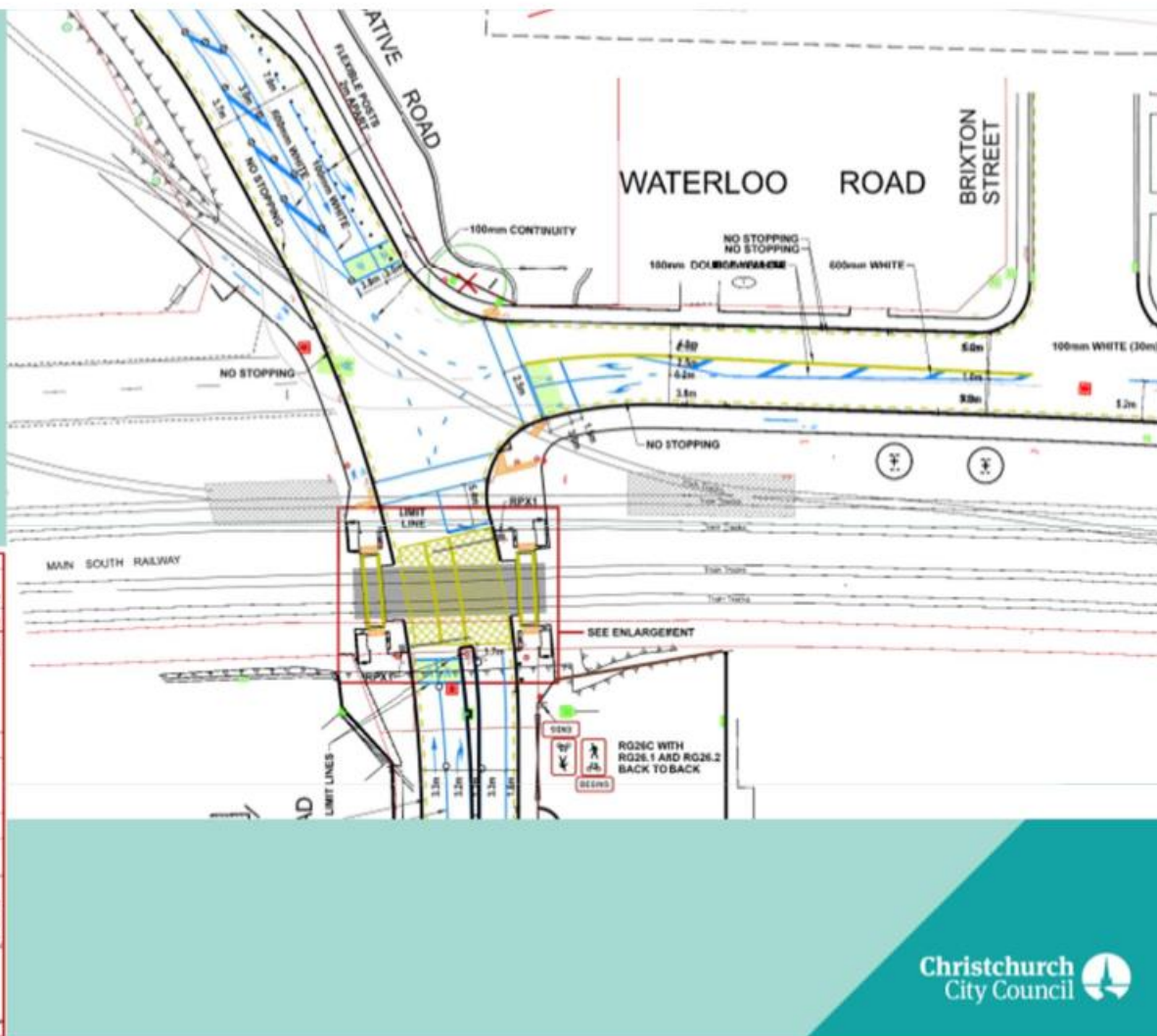
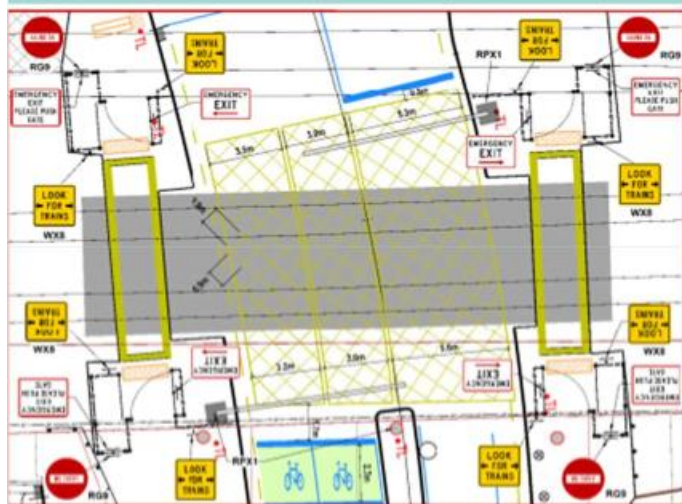
Halswell Junction Road Extension

Background and project area

- Stage 1 completed with South Express MCR works in 2022.
- Main bulk of the works
- Final MCR works shown on Waterloo Road as well as decommissioning of existing level crossing
- KiwiRail elements around the railway



New level crossing and link to Waterloo Road



KiwiRail elements

- New level crossing to meet new road alignment
- New pedestrian gates and barrier arms
- Once the new crossing is built, the existing crossing can be decommissioned
- KiwiRail completing works within their corridor

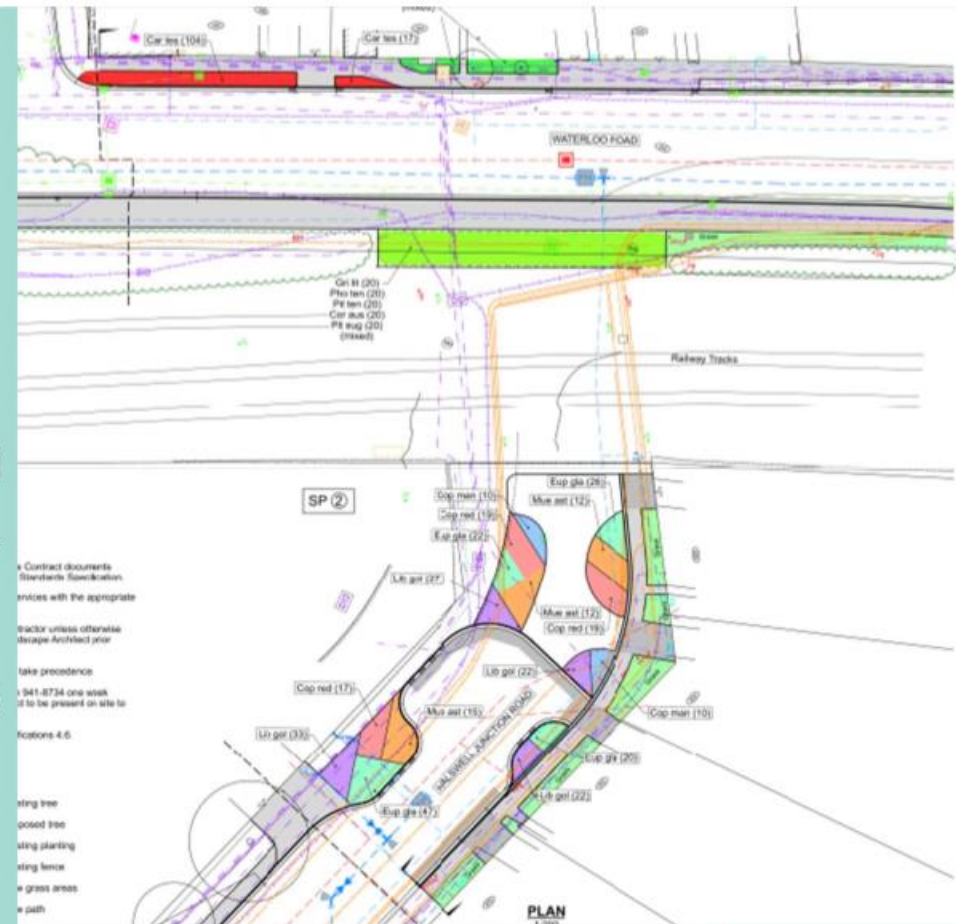

Foremans Road /Halswell Junction Road intersection

- New layout and link road alignment
- Fully functional when link road and crossing complete
- Bus stops move to the new link road- new shelter southbound and new bus seat northbound
- Additional landscaping, pedestrian and cycle shared paths and on-road cycle lanes, as well as median island crossing points



- Cul-de-sac can only be constructed once the new level crossing is operational and existing level crossing decommissioned
- This section of Halswell Junction Road will need a new road name and new property numbering- CCC process that will be running in the background. This will be consulted on and go to the Community Board for decision.
- Road resurfaced, new kerb and channel and footpaths on the West side

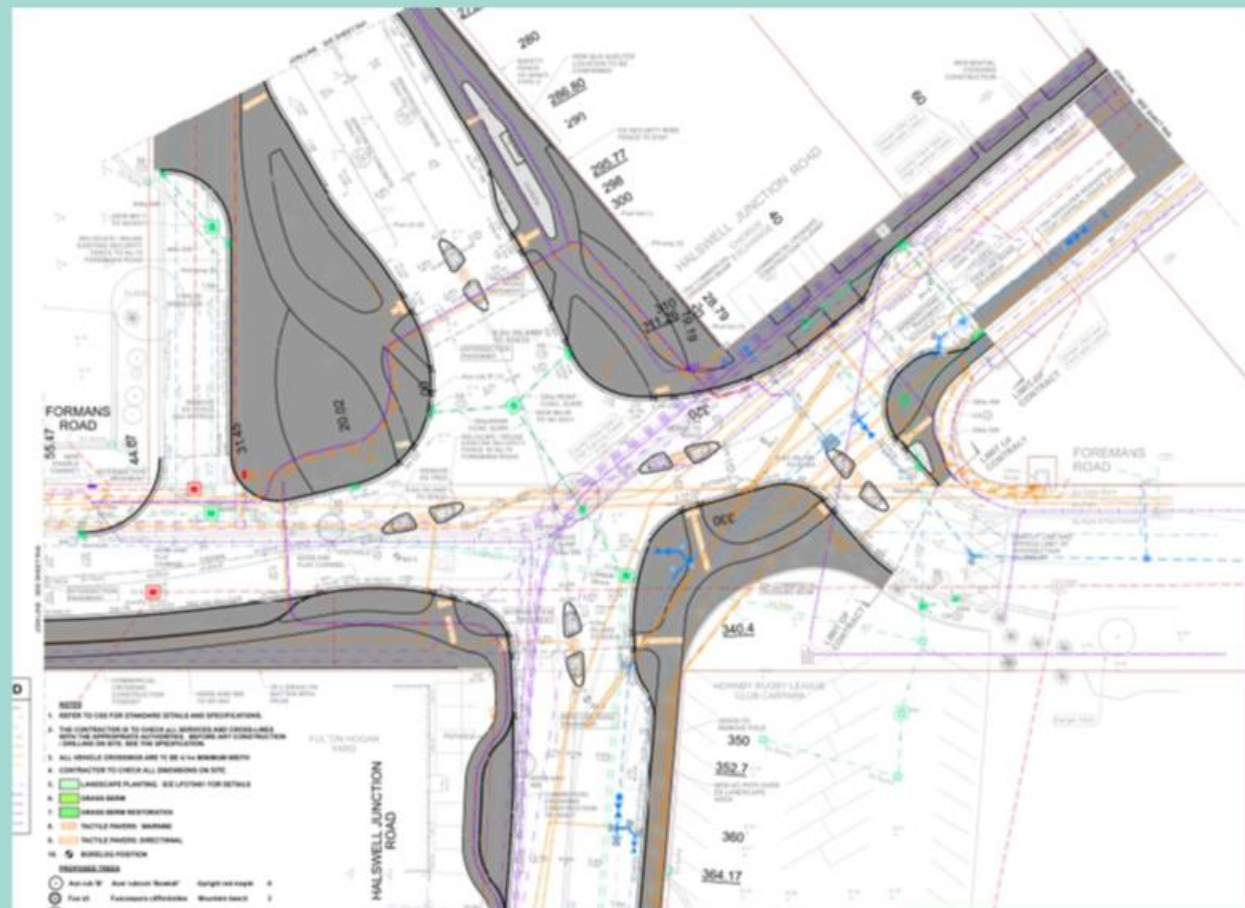

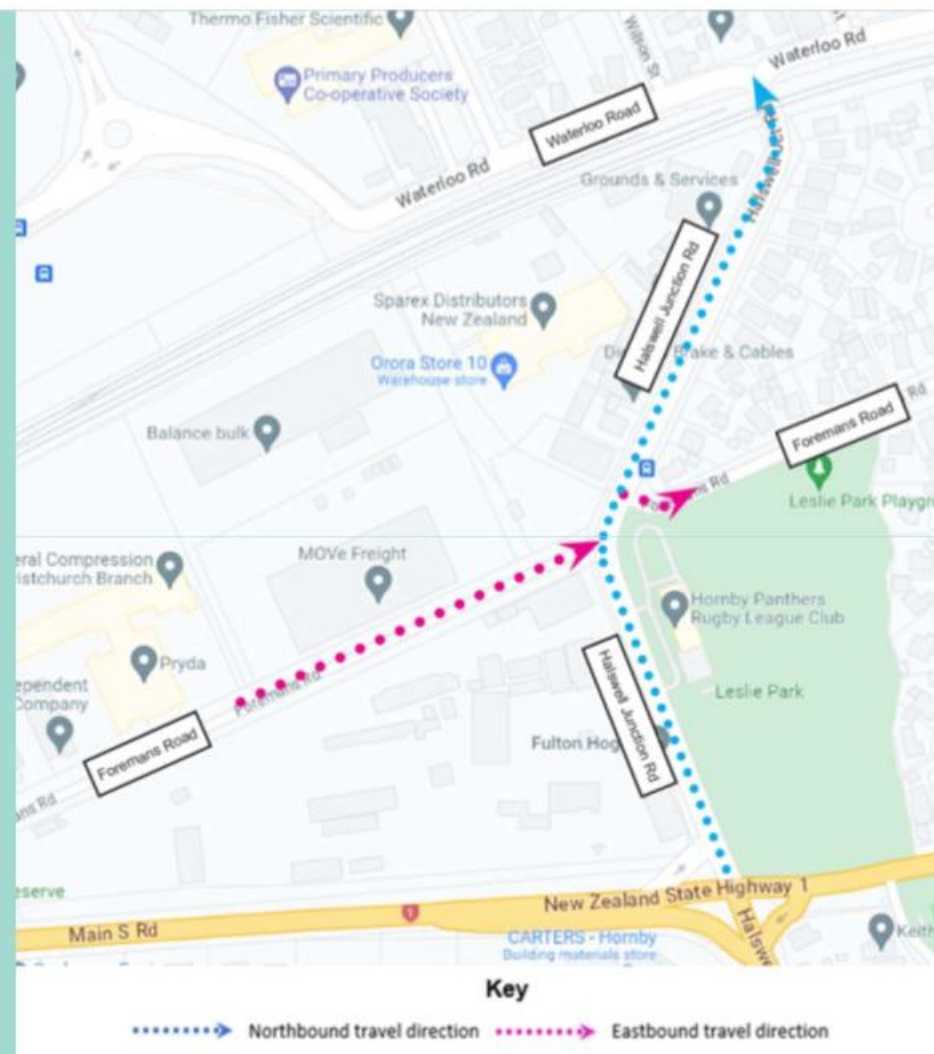

Project Update

Work is substantially complete in the West Zone with only minor works to be carried out over the next few weeks. The installation of pavers around the Oxford Tce intersection is well underway with traffic light work and tactile paver installation still to be completed. We have been working hard to complete the bridge work and have the footpaths operational as soon as possible - thank you for your patience! The green surfacing has been installed site wide and street furniture installation is underway as well. There has been a small delay with the plant supplier but planting will commence early next week. This will be the last edition of the West Zone newsletter, further project progress updates will be included in the email each Friday.

Two Week Look Ahead

- Paver installation will continue on the footpaths around the Oxford Tce intersection
- Other minor footpath work will continue site wide, including the installation of the Pākura patterned pavers
- The installation of street furniture (including cycle stands) will continue zone wide
- Traffic signals work will continue at both Oxford Tce and Colombo St intersections
- Existing service lids on the Hereford St bridge will be raised to the new footpath height
- Planting will begin site wide
