3. Brief Summary

- 3.1 Everyone should be able to safely walk, scooter, bus, cycle or drive where they want to go. That's why Christchurch City Council is making several Ōtautahi Christchurch areas safer for travellers.

Christchurch City Council has received Government funding for a range of improvements that make it safer to walk, cycle and bus, which helps reduce congestion, lowers emissions and makes it easier for everyone to get around.

Most of the proposed projects are in Linwood and Bromley, areas currently lacking in real travel choice.

The six projects the Board are advised to submit on are:

- Te Aratai College Cycle Connection
- Improving Bromley's Roads
- Smith Street Cycleway and Upgrades
- School Safety Linwood
- Rhona Street Upgrades
- Public Transport Linwood and Woolston Upgrades

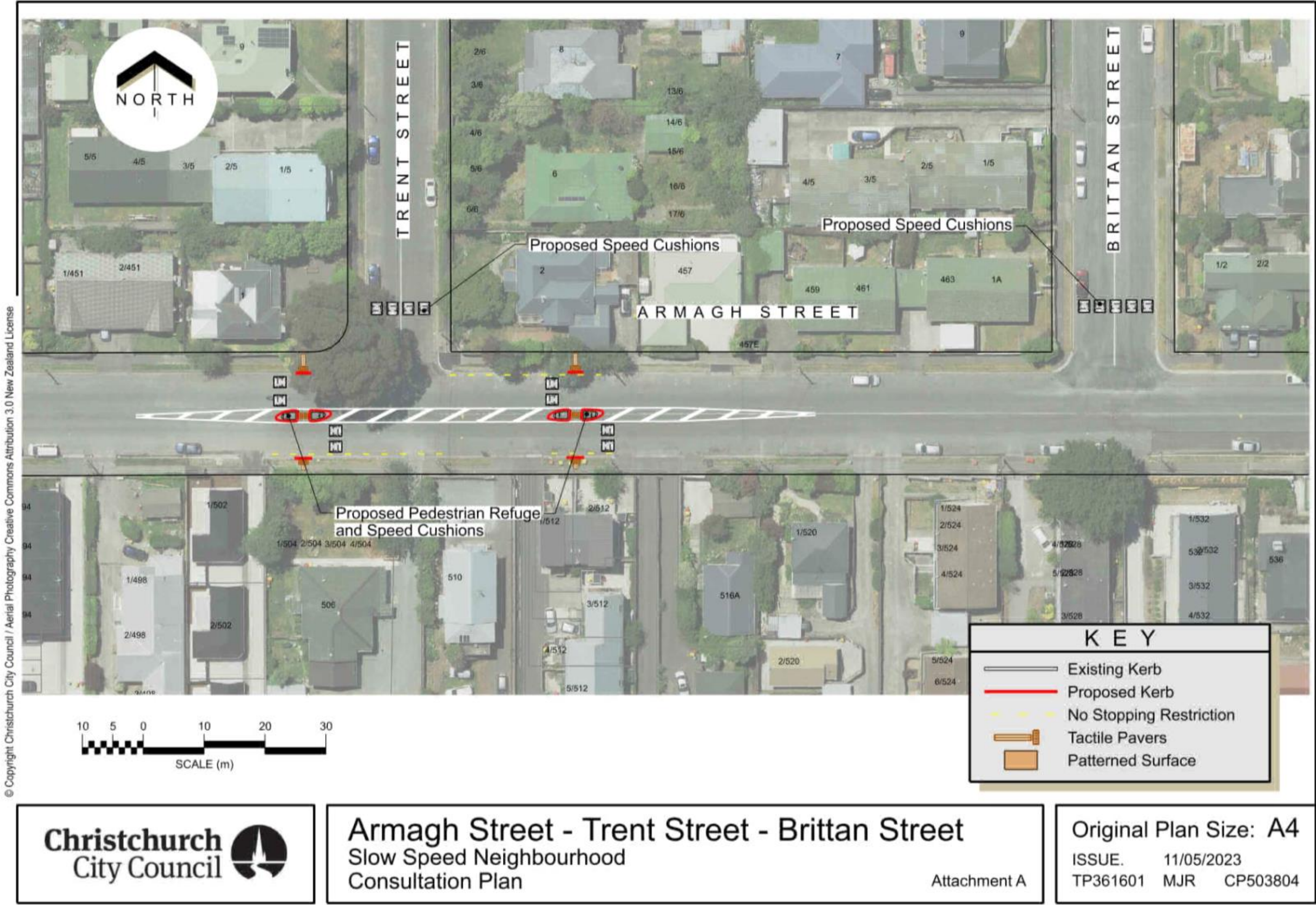
Worcester Street - Mclean / Surrey / Wyon Street

2. Notes that given the consultation timetable, the Submissions Committee will exercise its delegated authority to complete and lodge a submission on behalf of the Board.

3. Brief Summary

- 3.1 The Cruising and Prohibited Times on Roads Bylaw was last reviewed in 2014. It sets rules to reduce cruising and to restrict access to some roads in rural and industrial areas where there is a history of antisocial behaviour, such as racing and burnouts. It enables police to take certain actions and complements other powers they have.

Under the current bylaw, cruising is restricted on 50 roads (or parts of roads). In this review it is not proposed to change the roads already registered.

Proposed changes outlined focus on roads (or parts of roads) with prohibited times (access restrictions) in place. There are currently 82 of these.
