Note: If you wish to speak on an issue that will be the subject of a report to a formal Board meeting, you may prefer to seek approval to instead make a longer deputation at the start of the relevant meeting; noting there is a general restriction on making repetitious presentations to the Board.

The Community Open Forum is not part of a formal meeting and so standing orders do not apply but speakers are invited to it on the basis that they accept the Chairperson's directions to avoid presenting on matters subject to legal proceedings, a hearing or current funding application, or that are repetitious, disrespectful or offensive. The number of speaking slots is limited based on the total time reserved
