QEII Temporary Alcohol ban

PROPOSAL FOR 24-HOUR ALCOHOL BAN DURING LARGE SCALE
EVENTS AT QEII

Events

- ▶ Large-Scale Events were brought back to QEII in November 2022 since the earthquakes. i.e. Groove Armada, Golden Festival, Fat Boy Slim and Netsky
- ▶ 4000-6000 per event had attended.
- ▶ These events had Special Licence for Alcohol
- ▶ Feedback has been positive from residents and patrons
- ▶ More events expected next Summer 2024

Incidents

- ▶ Stabbing in Taiora QEII carpark during Netsky concert Saturday 11th February 2023 – Stuff article 12th February 2023
- ▶ Police report on Alcohol contributing factor data from their records in a 3 year period from 19th August 2019 – 31st May 2023, within 1 km radius surrounding the QEII football field/Event Ground.

Proposing a 24hour Alcohol Ban during Large-scale Events at QEII Park.

Time: 12.01am-11.59pm Event Day

Reason:

- ▶ Assist with managing anti-social behaviour around the event site during an event.
- ▶ Added security measure.
- ▶ minimise intoxication.
- ▶ Consistent with other Event venues that hosts Large-Scale Events i.e., Hagley Park North
- ▶ Educate Event patrons and public what behaviours are expected at and around the QEII events space.

Pre-emptive Measure:

- ▶ In addition to security plan in and around QEII event venue, signage will be placed at strategic points within the alcohol ban zone.
- ▶ Security will be monitoring this space within Beach Rd, Ascot Ave, Bower Ave, Travis Rd and Frosts Rd.
- ▶ Security can instruct people with alcohol in the restricted areas to tip out or leave the premises.
- ▶ Police can fine people up to \$200 if caught with alcohol in the restricted area.
