The area around the Birdlings Flat Community Hall is the focus of our community and frequented by visitors to the beach.

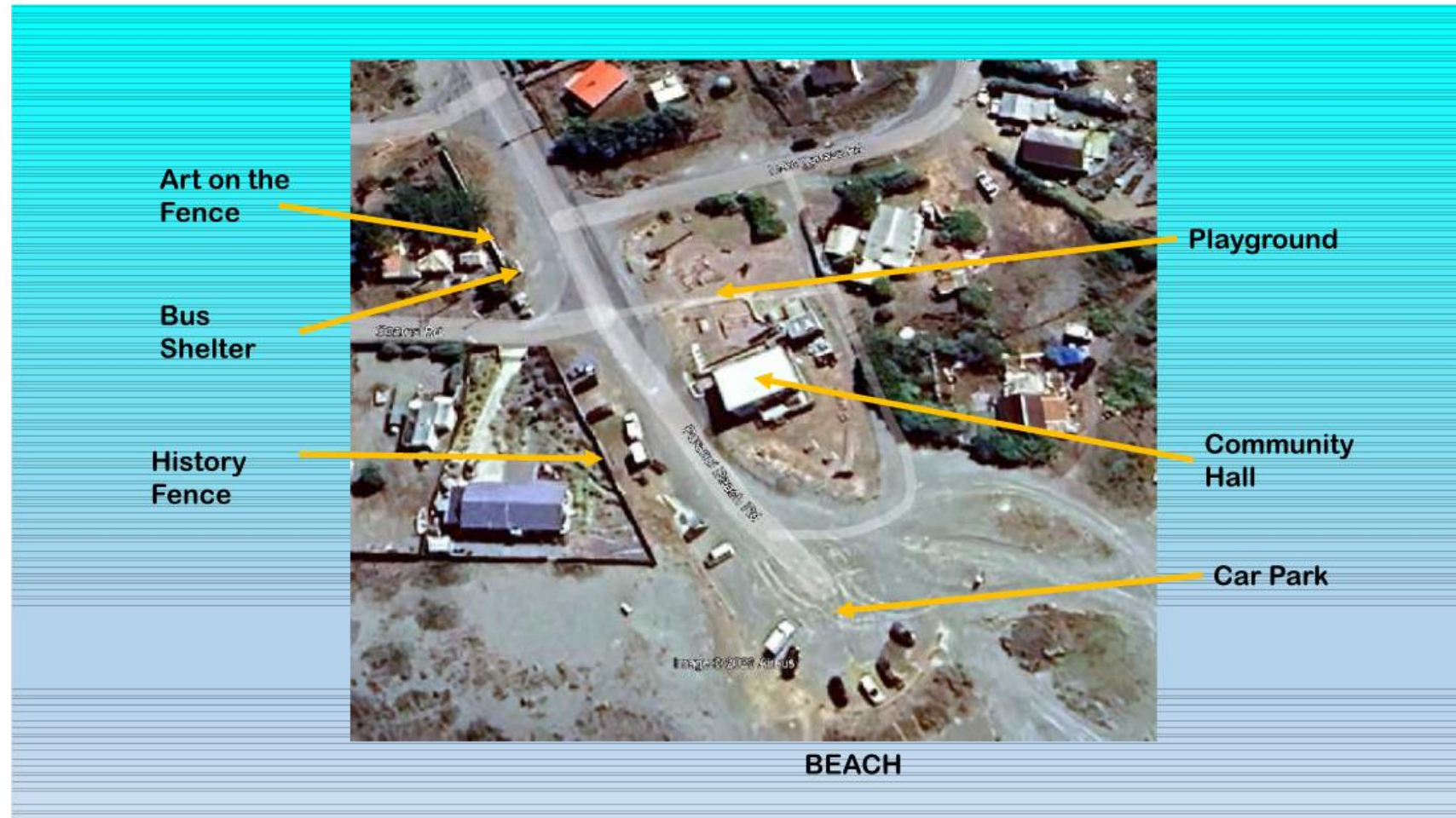
As well as the hall there are public toilets, a children's playground, a book nook, a bus shelter and a car park.

- Intended opening February 2024

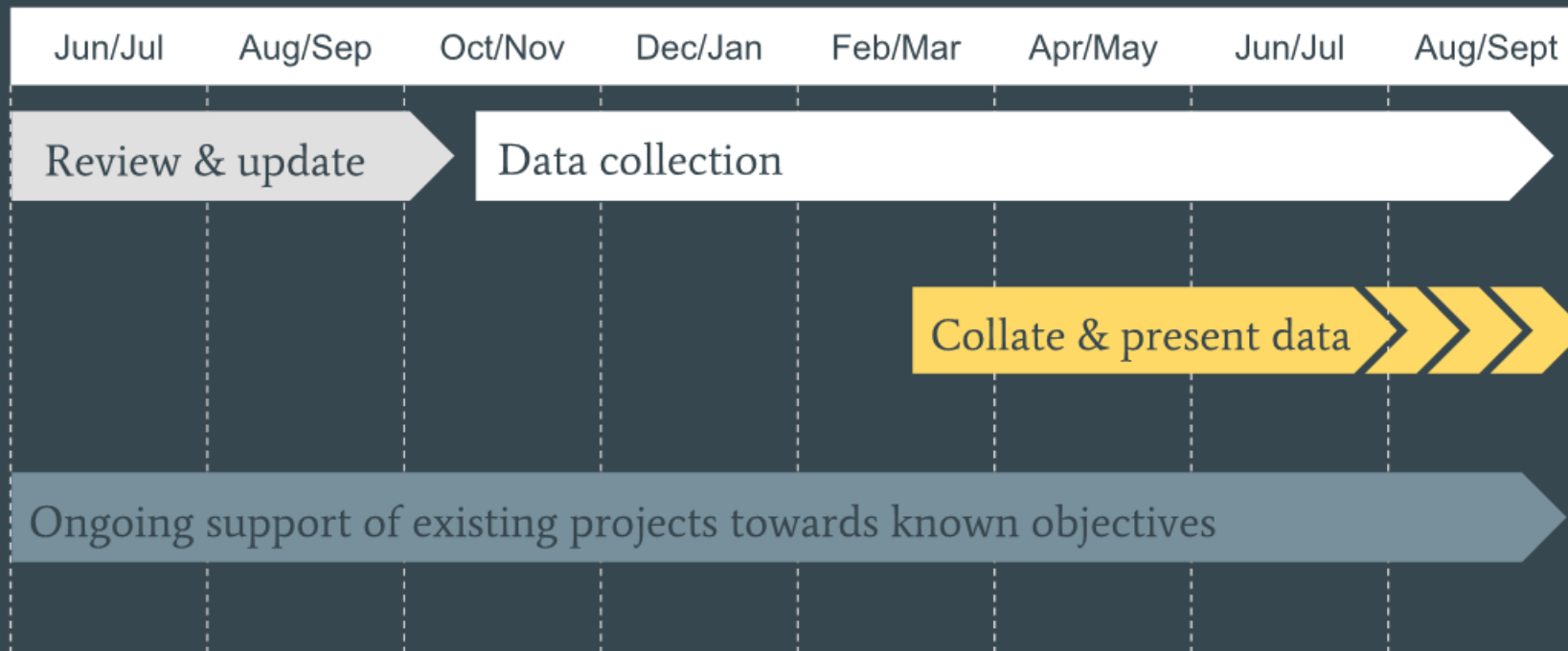


Little River - Big Ideas Review 2023/2024

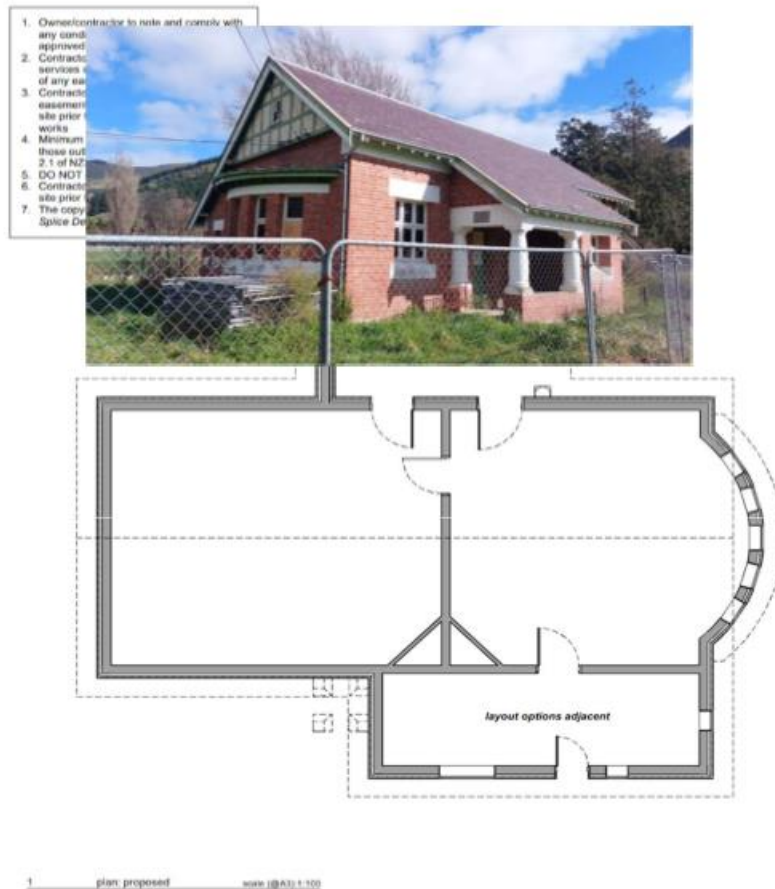

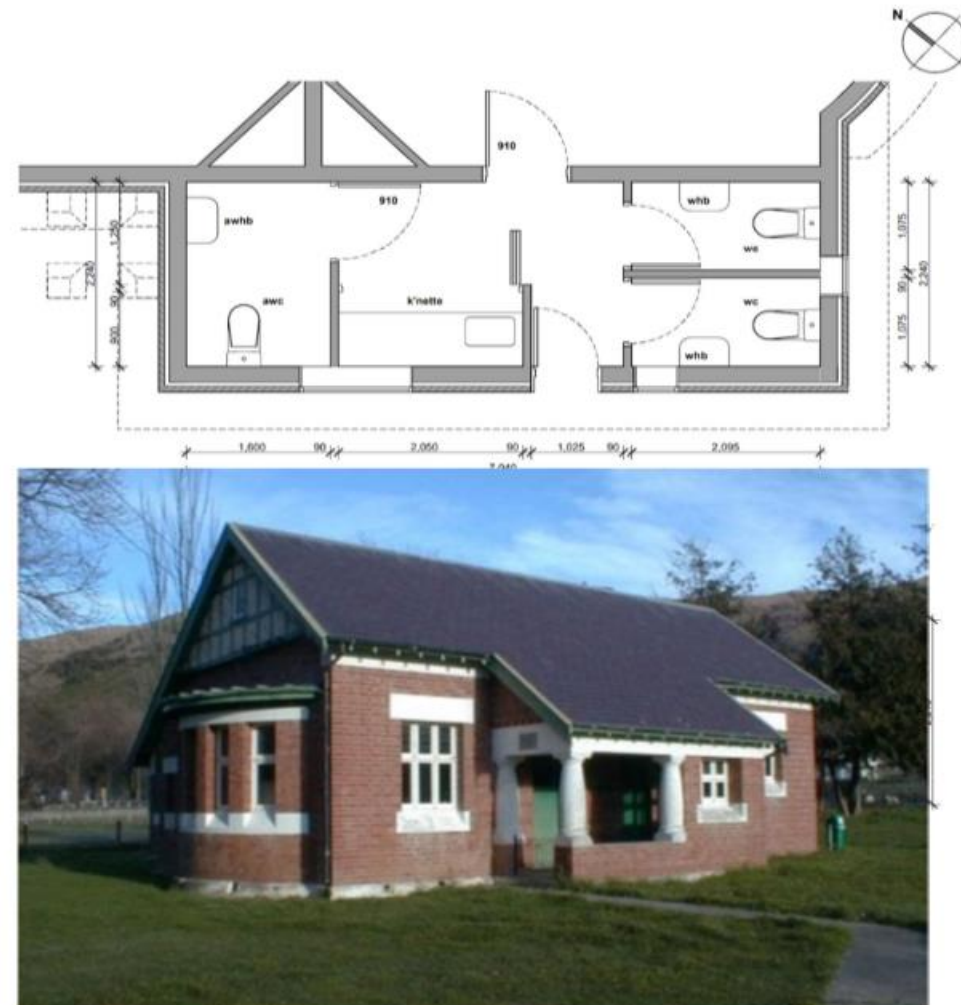
