1. Brief Summary



- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the Fire on High Event 2023. The proposed closure is to enable the event to be held on the roadway and eliminate interactions between event attendees / activities from regular road users, enabling the safe running of the event.
- 1.2 This report has been written because Goodbye Blue Monday Ltd have proposed to close the following road from 7am to 10pm on 2 September 2023:
 - High Street - from Tuam Street to Lichfield Street.
- 1.3 The event organisers have indicated that they have undertaken direct notifications to impacted parties, which is required as part of the road closure application process. The event organisers will provide a record of any feedback received from impacted parties, to the Subcommittee in advance of the scheduled meeting or alternatively the organisers may present the information in person to the Subcommittee.
- 1.4 Public notification was carried out through publication in The Press and on the Council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received meeting the minimum required time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised in The Press on 21 July 2023 with objections closing 27 July 2023.
- 1.5 There were no objections received by Council, as a result of the public notifications process.
- 1.6 Road closures for this event have previously been approved by the Road Closure Subcommittee at this location, with no unexpected impacts regarding traffic movements, reported in the area.
- 1.7 Christchurch tramways have been spoken to by the event organisers to discuss provisions for tram movements impacted by the proposed closures.
- 1.8 Staff support the proposed temporary road closures and believe that it will not unreasonably impact traffic.

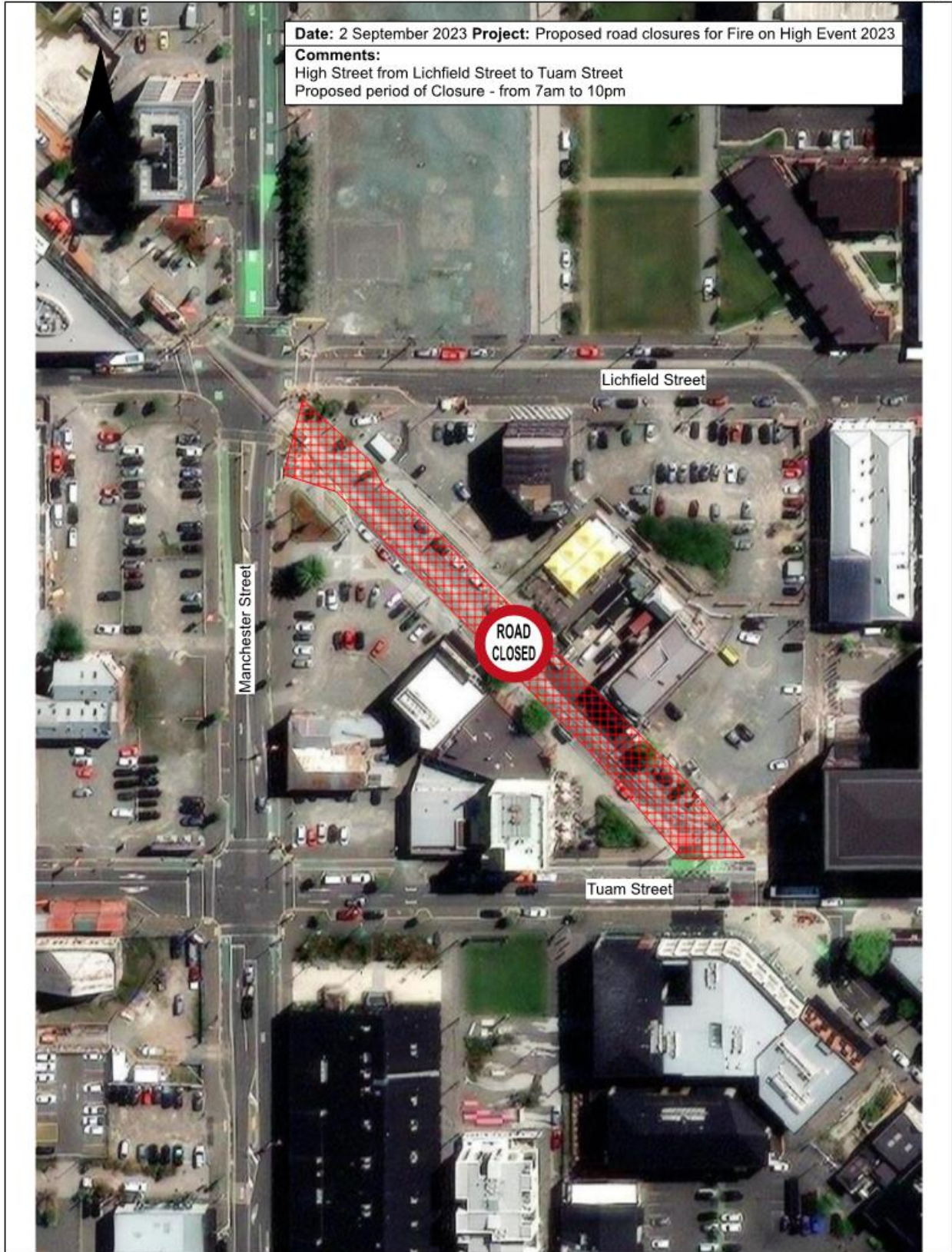

1. Brief Summary


- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the Orangetheory Stadium Bunnings Warehouse Cup Rugby matches. The proposed road closures have been applied for to eliminate interactions between event attendees and vehicular traffic on roads directly adjacent to the venue, when high numbers of attendees are entering or exiting the venue.
- 1.2 This report has been written because Venues Otautahi have proposed to close:
 - Jack Hinton Drive - from Whiteleigh Ave to Twigger Street
 - Twigger Street - from Lincoln Road to Jack Hinton DriveOn the dates and times listed below:
 - From 1pm to 7pm Saturday, 19 August 2023
 - From 10:30am to 5pm on Sunday, 27 August 2023
 - From 12pm to 5pm on Sunday, 17 September 2023
 - From 1pm to 11pm on Saturday, 23 September 2023
- 1.3 The event organisers have indicated that they have undertaken direct notifications to impacted parties, which is required as part of the road closure application process. The event organisers will provide a record of any feedback received, from impacted parties, to the Subcommittee in advance of the scheduled meeting or alternatively the organisers may present the information in person to the Subcommittee.
- 1.4 When possible and safe to do so the closures of Twigger Street will be reopened during matches to allow residents access, when attendees are not actively arriving or leaving the venue.
- 1.5 Public notification was carried out through publication in The Press and on the Council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received meeting the minimum required time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised in The Press on 21 July 2023 with objections closing 27 July 2023.
- 1.6 No objections were received by Council, as a result of the public notifications process.
- 1.7 Road closures for this event have previously been approved by the Road Closure Subcommittee at this location, with no unexpected impacts regarding traffic movements, reported in the area.
- 1.8 Staff support the proposed temporary road closures and believe that it will not unreasonably impact traffic.
