3. Brief Summary

- 3.1 Christchurch City Council are making improvements to the main road into New Brighton, including a new bridge across the Ōtākaro-Avon River and upgrading Pages Road east of Anzac Drive. This project also includes changes to the surrounding streets and intersections - some of which are key for improving the emergency evacuation of the area.
- 3.2 The plans include better road alignments, road safety upgrades and traffic flow improvements, to make it safer to get in and out of New Brighton.
- 3.3 The new bridge and road will be more resilient to future earthquakes and the effects of climate change. It will be designed to improve access for everyone – from the truck and car drivers to the cyclists and dog walkers, and everyone in between. And importantly, this project will also provide for large volumes of traffic to exit New Brighton and the surrounding suburbs during planned and unplanned events.

3. Brief Summary

- 3.1 This Stormwater Management plan is one of seven plans being prepared over the period 2020 to 2024 for the Ōpāwaho-Heathcote, Huritini-Halswell, Ihutai-Estuary and Coastal and Ōtūkaikino catchments and Settlements of Te Pātaka-o-Rākaihautū-Banks Peninsula, and Ōtākaro-Avon and Pūharakekenui-Styx catchments.
- 3.2 The Pūharakekenui-Styx Catchment encompasses an area of approximately 7,000 hectares situated on the northern urban periphery of Christchurch. This spring-fed river system, stretches for 22km from its headwaters in the Harewood area to the sea. It meanders in a north-easterly direction, passing through reserves, pastures, horticultural areas, and residential developments before reaching the sea via Te Riu o Te Aika Kawa-Brooklands Lagoon and the Waimakariri River.
- 3.3 The Pūharakekenui-Styx Stormwater Management Plan has three key purposes:
 - To propose targets for lowering stormwater contaminants.
 - To describe the ways stormwater discharges will be improved over time to meet environmental objectives.
 - To discuss how flooding risks will be dealt with, if there are any.

 - Have regard to the views of interested parties and communities in choosing names.
 - Provide names that are not easily confused with other similar names and assist with wayfinding.
