4. Public Forum Te Huinga Whānui

Part B

4.1 Crossing Points on Sabys Road, Halswell

David Hawke, Secretary, Halswell Residents' Association, addressed the Board regarding the need for pedestrian crossing points on Sabys Road, Halswell.

He advised that there is heavy traffic at times on Sabys Road and it is often difficult for pedestrians to cross, including children travelling to Halswell School. The Association supports the initiative in the Notice of Motion on the Agenda for the meeting that staff investigate the installation of two mid-block crossing points on Sabys Road using low-cost materials.



Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Mr Hawke for his presentation.

5. Deputations by Appointment Ngā Huinga Whakaritenga Part B

5.1 Waka Kotahi Roading Improvements 206R Halswell Road (SH75) - Temporary Licence to Occupy and Purchase of Land

David Hawke, Secretary, Halswell Residents' Association, addressed the Board regarding the Waka Kotahi Roading Improvements 206R Halswell Road (SH75) - Temporary Licence to Occupy and Purchase of Land Report (Item 10 of these Minutes refers).

The Association is supportive of the proposals regarding the sale of land to Waka Kotahi to improve the roading network, including for users of public transport and cyclists.

The Association recognises that improving safety will encourage use of cycles with positive effects on carbon emissions.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Mr Hawke for his presentation.

4. Public Forum Te Huinga Whānui (continued)

Part B

4.2 Wigram Aquatic Centre

Morgan Du, local resident, addressed the Board regarding the benefits of an Aquatic Centre being established in Wigram.

Morgan Du considers that the location of an Aquatic Centre in Wigram will provide access to a swimming pool for local residents, particularly young people, resulting in physical and mental health benefits. Also, the proximity of a pool would make it easier for people to learn to swim.

In addition, an Aquatic Centre would provide local employment opportunities and be an attraction for the area that could result in increased patronage for local businesses.

Morgan Du acknowledged the challenge of funding such a facility but considered that local fundraising could contribute to this.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Morgan Du for his presentation.



5. Deputations by Appointment Ngā Huinga Whakaritenga (continued) Part B

5.2 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Josiah Tualamali'i, local resident, addressed the Board in relation to the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).

Mr Tualamali'i supports the proposed Church Corner safety improvements, particularly the proposal to make Main South Road (from Riccarton Road) entry only and removing vehicle access from Main South Road onto Riccarton Road and Yaldhurst Road.

He suggested that the greenspace resulting from the changes presented an opportunity to provide a marker to recognise the area's social history, cultural diversity and community connectivity.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Mr Tualamali'i for his presentation.

Tyla Harrison-Hunt joined the meeting via audio/visual link at 4.56pm.

5.3 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Corin Murfitt, Chair of Petersgate Trust and Gray Crawford, Business Manager, Petersgate Counselling Centre addressed the Board in relation to the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).

Mr Crawford considers that the proposed changes to Main South Road and Curletts Road will create difficulty resulting in stress for clients accessing the Petersgate site.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Mr Crawford and Mr Murfitt for their presentation.

Tyla Harrison-Hunt joined the meeting in person at 5.16pm.

5.4 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Liz Orr, Teacher, spoke on behalf of St Peter's Anglican Preschool regarding the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).

Ms Orr expressed concern that the proposed change to Main South Road will make it harder to access the site and may deter participation. Ms Orr considers that it will be preferable to maintain the ability to turn left from Main South Road onto Yaldhurst Road.

She is also concerned that the proposed changes may lead to driver impatience and frustration with possible detrimental effects for the safety of children.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Ms Orr for her presentation.

5.5 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Jennifer Porter, local resident, addressed the Board regarding the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).



Ms Porter expressed concern about the proposed pedestrian crossings on Yaldhurst, Waimairi and Main South Roads, potentially resulting in numerous stoppages for vehicles and frustration for drivers and carelessness.

Ms Porter considers that the change to make Main South Road one way at Church Corner will be hard for residents.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Ms Porter for her presentation.

5.6 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Mike Davidson, resident, addressed the Board regarding the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).

Mr Davidson commended staff for the safety proposals contained in the report noting that the safety improvements were overdue.

Mr Davidson noted that the five traffic lanes in the vicinity of the Riccarton and Waimairi Roads intersection creates difficulties for cyclists often being "squeezed". The proposed safety improvements will not in his opinion improve this situation. While Mr Davidson supports the proposed removal of the left turn slip lane from Main South Road to Curletts Road he suggests that a small slip lane for cyclists could be maintained to avoid competition between cyclists and vehicles turning left at that corner.

Mr Davidson advised that his major concern is that without providing a dual crossing the proposals do not improve the already difficult journey for cyclists travelling East along the cycleway on Main South Road to safely transition to the other side of the road. Mr Davidson tabled a statement from an employee outlining her experiences travelling from Main South Road towards New Brighton.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Mr Davidson for his presentation.

5.7 Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements

Jeanette Quinn, local resident, addressed the Board regarding the Church Corner and Waimairi Road Safety Improvements Report (Item 8 of these Minutes refers).

Ms Quinn considers the proposed installation of a raised hump at the Bowen Street and Peer Street intersection is a good idea but suggested that the humps at Angela and Brake Street be increased in height to more effectively slow traffic. Ms Quinn noted that Bowen Street is increasingly being treated as a detour with heavier traffic than previously and there is no pedestrian crossing facility on the street.

Ms Quinn is concerned that the proposed relocated bus stop on Waimairi Road could obscure visibility of vehicles turning right into the Bush Inn Centre as well as for vehicles illegally exiting the centre at that point.



Ms Quinn considers that improvements are required to ensure the safety of pedestrians using the crossing facility on Riccarton Road in the vicinity of Countdown. Ms Quinn suggested as an alternative to the proposed alteration to Main South Road, a traffic signal could be installed on Riccarton Road controlling the right hand turn onto Yaldhurst Road.

Following questions from members, the Chairperson thanked Ms Quinn for her presentation.

- 2. Resolves to grant temporary occupation of that part of the Land B and Land D (shown labelled "F" & "K" on the Plan contained in the Draft Memorandum of Agreement attached to the report on the meeting agenda), being an area of approximately 511 square metres to allow the formation of a footpath to be vested in the Council upon completion.



- 3. Notes that:
 - a. Due to the mutual benefit, there is no consideration for the temporary occupation.
 - b. The Head of Transport has signed off the report on the meeting agenda indicating that they will accept the new footpath.
- 4. Community Board Consideration Continued

Staff in attendance spoke to the accompanying report.

The Board also took into consideration the deputations received from Josiah Tualamali'l, Gray Crawford and Corin Murfitt, Liz Orr, Jennifer Porter, Mike Davidson and Jeanette Quinn (Items 5.2 to 5.7 of these Minutes refers).

Staff outlined the purpose of the changes which is to mitigate the ongoing risk to all users at the intersections in Church Corner to improve safety for all.

Staff clarified that it is also proposed to install a speed hump on Bowen Street at its intersection with Peer Street.



The Board discussed the proposed safety measures but was concerned about the possible disruption to traffic resulting from the proposal to remove vehicle access from Main South Road onto Riccarton Road and Yaldhurst Road.

In response to deputations received staff provided updated staff recommendations and a detailed plan reflecting these (Plan TG145703 attached to the minutes). 8. and 10. below in the Board's decision reflect the updated staff recommendations.

As part of the updated staff recommendations, there is an additional Part A recommendation to the Council, namely 1.e.

Note: As the Board did not agree to the recommendations in 6 to 10 below, the original staff recommendations 19 and 20 were not required to be considered.

Andrei Moore left the meeting at 4.41pm and returned at 4.54pm.

The meeting adjourned at 6.26pm and reconvened at 6.48pm.

- 1. Approves, pursuant to Clause 18 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017:
 - a. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of northbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the west side of Waimairi Road, commencing at its intersection with Riccarton Road and extending in a northerly direction to its intersection with Bowen Street.
 - b. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of southbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the east side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 149 metres south of its intersection with Hanrahan Street and extending in a southerly distance to its intersection with Riccarton Road.
 - c. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of south eastbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the north-east side of Yaldhurst Road, commencing at a point 94 metres south-east of its intersection with Angela Street and extending in a south easterly direction to its intersection with Riccarton Road.
 - d. That a Special Vehicle Lane, in accordance with Clause 18 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, for the use of eastbound road users as defined in Section 1.6 (definition of Bus lane) of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004 and also as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the north side of Riccarton Road, commencing at its intersection with Yaldhurst Road and extending in an easterly direction to a point located 105 metres west of its intersection with Waimairi Road, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 2. Approves that in accordance with Section 8.5 of the Land Transport Rule Traffic Control Devices: 2004 that a signalised roadway crossing be installed on Waimairi Road, located 23



metres north from its intersection with Leslie Street, and as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A. This signalised crossing is for the use by the classes of road user as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004.

- 3. Approves that in accordance with Clause 21 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, that the path on the west side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 20 metres north of its intersection with Leslie Street, and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 11 metres be resolved as a Shared Path and in accordance with section 11.4 of the Land Transport Act Traffic Control Devices Rules: 2004. 1. Purpose of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to approve the proposed private road names at 185 Kirk Road, Templeton.
- 1.2 The report is staff generated resulting from a naming request received from the developer.

2. Staff Recommendations / Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

- 1. Approves the following new private road names for 185 Kirk Road (RMA/2021/497).
 - a. Road 1 Black Beech Road
 - b. Road 2 Hazel Road
 - c. Road 3 Tūākura Road

3. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Introduction Te Whakatkinga

- 3.1 A road naming request has been submitted by Davie-Lovell Smith Ltd on behalf of the developer. A preferred name and alternative names have been put forward for each private road.
- 3.2 The recommended road names have been checked against existing road names in Christchurch and bordering districts, for duplication, alternative spelling, or other similarities in spelling or pronunciation to avoid the potential for confusion. The proposed names are considered sufficiently different to existing road names.
- 3.3 The recommended road names have been checked against the Council's Naming Policy dated 15 November 2023 and are considered to be consistent with this policy except as outlined below. The specific criteria for assessing a name from clause 2 is set out below.
 - 3.3.1 A traditional or Māori name which is acceptable to the Rūnanga or Iwi; this may be a name reflecting the physical characteristics of an area, an activity or event associated with the area or of a notable ancestor.
 - 3.3.2 A feature of historical, social, cultural, environmental or physical importance in the area (e.g., Carlton Mill Road or Carlton Mill Reserve*).
 - 3.3.3 The name of a notable family, person or event associated with the locality or with the wider Christchurch area.
 - 3.3.4 A name in recognition of a person's service. This can be for community service, conservation, sport, the arts, science and research or other sphere of activity.



- 3.3.5 Consistency with a common or established theme for naming in a subdivision or locality.
- 3.3.6 A name that reflects the diverse cultures and communities of the locality or of Christchurch generally.
- 3.3.7 The name of an event or activity strongly associated with the immediate location including an informal name for the area that is (or was historically) in common usage.
- 3.3.8 A name associated with a person, event or activity of significance to Christchurch including names associated with people, events, or places of national and international significance.
- 3.4 The criteria for names that are not suitable for approval from clause 6 is set out below.
 - 3.4.1 Names of people, flora, fauna or geographical features not associated with the area, e.g., names of native trees which are not present in the area or views that cannot be identified, except where the name continues a current naming theme in the locality.
 - 3.4.2 Currently trading commercial organisations except for sponsorship names for facilities and leased parks.
 - 3.4.3 Anagrams, amalgamations or derivatives of people's names.
 - 3.4.4 Names of living persons.
 - 3.4.5 Names related to the developer of a subdivision.
 - 3.4.6 Name of a person, club or organisation associated with a privately owned building on Council land, where the club or organisation does not hold the ground lease for the building.
 - 3.4.7 Names for roads which may cause confusion because they are associated with another geographical location or feature e.g., Parklands Drive which is not located in the Parklands suburb.
- 3.5 The recommended road names have also been checked against the Australia and New Zealand Standard AS/NZA 4819:2011 Rural and Urban Addressing. The names are considered to be consistent with the Standard unless otherwise stated below.
- 3.6 Under the Naming Policy, the names considered must be requested by the developer. There is not an ability to consider alternative names without first checking whether there are any duplications or similarities with other road and right-of-way names.
- 3.7 Consultation has been undertaken with Land Information New Zealand who have raised no concerns with the proposed road names.
- 3.8 Consultation under the policy with rūnanga is not required because none of the roads to be named are collector roads and/or sites of significance under the District Plan (clause 3 of the Naming Policy).
- 3.9 No addresses of neighbouring properties are affected by the proposed road naming (clause 12.2 of the Naming Policy).
- 3.10 The names requested have been accompanied by an explanation of the background to the names, which is summarised below, along with correspondence with the applicant.

Assessment of Significance and Engagement Te Aromatawai Whakahirahira

3.11 The decision in this report is of low significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.



- 3.12 The level of significance was determined by the number of people affected and/or with an interest.
- 3.13 Council's Principal Advisor Treaty Relationships has been consulted and has raised no concerns with the suitability of the proposed Te Reo Māori names as set out below.
- 3.14 Due to the assessment of low significance, no further community engagement and consultation is required.

Proposed Names

- 3.15 The proposed roads are shown in **Attachment A**.
- 3.16 The names are themed for trees, as the site contains a large number of previously protected trees and the previous use of the site as a hospital had all the internal roads informally named for trees. (Oakwood Dr, Sycamore Rd, Willow Way, and Blue Gum Pl).
- 3.17 Road 1 Black Beech Road
- 3.18 Black Beech (*Nothofagus solandri*) is species of tree endemic to New Zealand. Black Beech occurs on both the North and the South Island at low elevations up to the mountains. It is also known as *Fuscospora solandri*.
- 3.19 Road 2 Hazel Road
- 3.20 Hazels are deciduous trees and large shrubs native to the temperate Northern Hemisphere.
- 3.21 Road 3 <u>Tūākura Road</u>
- 3.22 Tūākura is a te reo Māori word for the New Zealand tree fern (*Dicksonia squarrosa*) which is endemic to New Zealand. It one of the most common tree ferns in New Zealand forests.

Alternative Names

- 3.23 <u>Toatoa Road</u> Toatoa is a te reo Māori word for the blue celery pine (Phyllocladus toatoa) which is a species of conifer in the family Podocarpaceae, endemic to New Zealand. Predominately found in the North Island.
- 3.24 <u>Tānekaha Road</u> Tānekaha is a te reo Māori word for the blue celery pine (Phyllocladus toatoa) which is a species of conifer in the family Podocarpaceae, endemic to New Zealand. Predominately found in the North Island.

Assessment of Names

- 3.25 The above names are considered to be consistent with the policy, as it is continuing a theme and reflecting the history of the site, however the tree names are not found on site or generally in the area.
- 3.26 The previously used informal road names were not acceptable to use at this site, as they are all already in use as existing road names in Christchurch or Selwyn.
- 3.27 Notwithstanding, the discretion lies with the Community Board to approve any of the above name options, including the alternative names.



1. Purpose of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to approve the proposed road names at 48 Quaifes Road, Halswell.
- 1.2 The report is staff generated resulting from a naming request received from the developer.

2. Staff Recommendations / Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

- 1. Approves the following new road names for 48 Quaifes Road (RMA/2022/2524).
 - a. Road 1 Castle Hill Road

3. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Introduction Te Whakatkinga

- 3.1 A road naming request has been submitted by the developer. A preferred name and alternative names have been put forward for the road.
- 3.2 The recommended road names have been checked against existing road names in Christchurch and bordering districts, for duplication, alternative spelling, or other similarities in spelling or pronunciation to avoid the potential for confusion. The proposed names are considered sufficiently different to existing road names.
- 3.3 The recommended road names have been checked against the Council's Naming Policy dated 15 November 2023 and are considered to be consistent with this policy except as outlined below. The specific criteria for assessing a name from clause 2 is set out below.
 - 3.3.1 A traditional or Māori name which is acceptable to the Rūnanga or Iwi; this may be a name reflecting the physical characteristics of an area, an activity or event associated with the area or of a notable ancestor.
 - 3.3.2 A feature of historical, social, cultural, environmental or physical importance in the area (e.g., Carlton Mill Road or Carlton Mill Reserve*).
 - 3.3.3 The name of a notable family, person or event associated with the locality or with the wider Christchurch area.
 - 3.3.4 A name in recognition of a person's service. This can be for community service, conservation, sport, the arts, science and research or other sphere of activity.
 - 3.3.5 Consistency with a common or established theme for naming in a subdivision or locality.
 - 3.3.6 A name that reflects the diverse cultures and communities of the locality or of Christchurch generally.



- 3.3.7 The name of an event or activity strongly associated with the immediate location including an informal name for the area that is (or was historically) in common usage.
- 3.3.8 A name associated with a person, event or activity of significance to Christchurch including names associated with people, events, or places of national and international significance.
- 3.4 The criteria for names that are not suitable for approval from clause 6 is set out below.
 - 3.4.1 Names of people, flora, fauna or geographical features not associated with the area, e.g., names of native trees which are not present in the area or views that cannot be identified, except where the name continues a current naming theme in the locality.
 - 3.4.2 Currently trading commercial organisations except for sponsorship names for facilities and leased parks.
 - 3.4.3 Anagrams, amalgamations or derivatives of people's names.
 - 3.4.4 Names of living persons.
 - 3.4.5 Names related to the developer of a subdivision.
 - 3.4.6 Name of a person, club or organisation associated with a privately owned building on Council land, where the club or organisation does not hold the ground lease for the building.
 - 3.4.7 Names for roads which may cause confusion because they are associated with another geographical location or feature e.g., Parklands Drive which is not located in the Parklands suburb.
- 3.5 The recommended road names have also been checked against the Australia and New Zealand Standard AS/NZA 4819:2011 Rural and Urban Addressing. The names are considered to be consistent with the Standard unless otherwise stated below.
- 3.6 Under the Naming Policy, the names considered must be requested by the developer. There is not an ability to consider alternative names without first checking whether there are any duplications or similarities with other road and right-of-way names.
- 3.7 Consultation has been undertaken with Land Information New Zealand who have raised no concerns with the proposed road names.
- 3.8 Consultation under the policy with rūnanga is not required because none of the roads to be named are collector roads and/or sites of significance under the District Plan (clause 3 of the Naming Policy).
- 3.9 No addresses of neighbouring properties are affected by the proposed road naming (clause 12.2 of the Naming Policy).
- 3.10 The names requested have been accompanied by an explanation of the background to the names, which is summarised below, along with correspondence with the applicant.

Assessment of Significance and Engagement Te Aromatawai Whakahirahira

- 3.11 The decision in this report is of low significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.
- 3.12 The level of significance was determined by the number of people affected and/or with an interest.
- 3.13 Due to the assessment of low significance, no further community engagement and consultation is required.



Proposed Names

- 3.14 The proposed roads are shown in **Attachment A**.
- 3.15 The names continue the theme of the first stage of Country View, mountains in the Southern Alps. The following mountains are at the top of the Waimakariri River and form part of the southern alps and are viewable from the site, see **Attachment B** for a map.
- 3.16 Road 1 Castle Hill Road
- 3.17 Castle Hill Peak (1998m) is a peak in the Torlesse Range. The name Castle Hill comes from the array of limestone boulders in the area reminiscent of an old, run-down stone castle. Some of the limestone the ChristChurch Cathedral is made from came from Castle Hill.

Alternative Names

- 3.18 Enys Road Mount Enys (2194m) is the highest peak in the Craigieburn Range. Mount Enys is named for John Enys who farmed in Castle Hill in the late 1800s with his brother Charles. John Enys was a notable naturalist who made many discoveries in the area.
- 3.19 <u>Bold Hill Drive</u> Bold Hill (1286m) is a peak in the Torlesse Range.
- 3.20 Otarama Drive Otarama Peak (1963m) is a peak in the Torlesse Range.
- 3.21 <u>Windwhistle Drive</u> Windwhistle Hill (750m) is adjacent to the Waimakariri River near the northern end of the Torlesse Range.
- 3.22 <u>Podocarp Drive</u> Podocarpaceae is a large family of mainly Southern Hemisphere conifers, known in English as podocarps, comprising about 156 species of evergreen trees and shrubs. New Zealand has 15 podocarp tree species, the best known are rimu, kahikatea, miro, mataī and tōtara. Thousand-year-old matai tree stumps were found on Quaifes Road during stormwater basin excavation works and were part of a subfossil matai forest underneath the ground.
- 3.23 Officers Note: If any alternative names are chosen, the appropriate road type will be used.

Assessment of Names

- 3.24 The above names are considered to be consistent with the policy.
- 3.25 Notwithstanding, the discretion lies with the Community Board to approve any of the above name options, including the alternative names.



10. Bus stop upgrades beside Shand Crescent Reserve on Riccarton Road

1. Purpose and Origin of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 To approve the upgrades proposed for bus stop (ID 38291) beside Shand Crescent Reserve on Riccarton Road.
- 1.2 This report is provided in response to requests from Environment Canterbury and bus operators asking for a longer bus box at this bus stop.
- 1.3 Staff investigation showed that at least two buses need to stop at this bus stop simultaneously. However, the current bus stop capacity is designed for a single bus, forcing the second bus to stop outside the bus box.
- 1.4 This not only is an accessibility problem for passengers who use the second bus but also is a safety concern as the second bus blocks the intersection of Shand Crescent and Riccarton Road (East end).
- 1.5 The decision in this report is of low significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. The level of significance was determined by considering the criteria set out in the Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.

2. Officer Recommendations Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board approves:

Bus stop 38291 - Outside Shand Crescent Reserve on Riccarton Road (Attachment A)

- 1. Pursuant to Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017:
 - a. That all existing parking and stopping restrictions associated with bus stop 38291 on the south side of Riccarton Road commencing at its intersection with Shand Crescent Street and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 26 metres, be revoked.
 - b. That the stopping of vehicles is prohibited at all times on the south side of Riccarton Road commencing at its intersection with Shand Crescent Street and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 5 metres.
 - c. That a bus stop be installed on the south side of Riccarton Road commencing at a point 6 metres west of its intersection with Shand Crescent Street and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 44 metres.
 - d. That the stopping of vehicles is prohibited at all times on the south side of Riccarton Road commencing at a point 49 metres west of its intersection with Shand Crescent and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 6 metres.



- 2. That bus stop facilities including three sets of directional and warning tactile pavers and a bus stop sign are installed at the bus stop as shown on Attachment A to the report on the meeting agenda.
- 3. That any previous resolutions pertaining to parking and stopping restrictions made pursuant to any bylaw to the extent that they conflict with the parking and stopping restrictions described in clauses 1 2 above are revoked.
- 4. That these recommendations if approved, take effect when the parking and stopping restrictions that evidence the restrictions described in clauses 1 2 above are in place.

3. Reason for Report Recommendations Ngā Take mō te Whakatau

- 3.1 Bus stop 38291 serves eight bus routes, including core routes 3 and 5, and is a driver changeover point.
- 3.2 The current bus stop capacity is designed to accommodate a single bus, yet the operational requirement necessitates the simultaneous stopping of at least two buses. This forces the second bus to stop outside of the bus box and poses both accessibility challenges for passengers utilizing the second bus and a safety concern, as the second bus blocks the intersection of Shand Crescent and Riccarton Road (East end).
- 3.3 This highlights the necessity to increase the capacity of the bus stop, enabling the concurrent service of two buses, to address the current situation.
- 3.4 Environment Canterbury has also confirmed that the frequency of one of the core routes that uses this bus stop (route 5) is scheduled to be lifted to a 10 min frequency in 2025. This means that, in near future, three buses will need to simultaneously stop at this bus stop.
- 3.5 Therefore, staff recommend increasing the capacity of this bus stop to effectively accommodate the simultaneous stopping of three buses. This approach is both time and cost-effective, eliminating the need to repeat all the necessary procedures for a similar report in 2025
- 3.6 If proposed plan is approved, initially, the bus stop capacity will be expanded to accommodate two buses, as illustrated in Attachment B, addressing the current issue. Subsequently, when the frequency of route 5 is enhanced in 2025, the bus stop capacity will be further increased to accommodate three buses.
- 3.7 The proposed plan leads to the loss of approximately five on-street parking spaces.
- 3.8 Due to financial constraints, the proposed plan primarily covers line markings. Other potential upgrades, such as pavement improvement, shelter relocation, kerb renewal, etc., may be needed and will be considered in the PT Futures programme, subject to funding approval.

4. Alternative Options Considered Etahi atu Kowhiringa

- 4.1 Option 2 Do nothing option and the existing street conditions will remain as is.
 - The advantages of this option include:
 - a. Council will not incur any costs.
 - The disadvantages of this option include:
 - a. The buses will continue to stop outside bus box posing accessibility and safety risks as discussed in clause 3.2 of section 3.



5. Detail Te Whakamahuki

- 5.1 Enhancing this bus stop has been prioritized with a focus on ensuring safe and convenient access for passengers to buses and promoting road safety for all road users. This priority is underscored by the fact that eight bus routes utilize this stop, increasing the likelihood of highlighted accessibility and safety risks.
- 5.2 Environment Canterbury supports the proposed plan.
- 5.3 Parks Recreation and Planning Team supports the proposed plan.
- 5.4 No resident has been affected by these changes and therefore, no consultation has been conducted.
- 5.5 The decision affects the following wards/Community Board areas:
 - 5.5.1 Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board.

6. Policy Framework Implications Ngā Hīraunga ā- Kaupapa here

Strategic AlignmentTe Rautaki Tīaroaro

- 6.1 Council's Strategic Framework is a key consideration in guiding the recommendations in this report. The recommendations in this report help achieve the:
 - community outcome of a well-connected and accessible city promoting active and public transport, and
- 6.2 This report supports the <u>Council's Long Term Plan (2021 2031)</u>:
- 6.3 Transport
 - 6.3.1 Activity: Transport
 - Level of Service: 10.4.4 Improve user satisfaction of public transport facilities (number and quality of shelters and quality of bus stop) ->=73% resident satisfaction
 - Level of Service: 10.4.1 More people are choosing to travel by bus >=13.7 million people

Policy Consistency Te Whai Kaupapa here

6.4 The decision is consistent with Council's Plans and Policies.

Impact on Mana Whenua Ngā Whai Take Mana Whenua

6.5 The decision does not involve a significant decision in relation to ancestral land or a body of water or other elements of intrinsic value, therefore this decision does not specifically impact Mana Whenua, their culture and traditions.

Climate Change Impact Considerations Ngā Whai Whakaaro mā te Āhuarangi

6.6 Public transport is a key provision to support mode shift, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, traffic congestion and traffic crashes. Measures that promote the use of public transport make it a more attractive travel option, thereby supporting mode shift and associated benefits to the environment.

Accessibility Considerations Ngā Whai Whakaaro mā te Hunga Hauā

6.7 Accessibility by inclusive design:



- The proposed line marking provides a safe space for buses to safely pull in/out and stop parallel to kerb. This significantly improves accessibility to public transport for public particularly disabled people who use a wheelchair, older bus users, and children.
- The standard and consistent design approach considered in the proposed upgrades improves the accessibility to public transport for blind and low vision people.

7. Resource Implications Ngā Hīraunga Rauemi

Capex/Opex Ngā Utu Whakahaere

- 7.1 Cost to Implement Approximately \$9,000 for the bus stop improvements and parking restrictions, plus \$2,000 for the planning, consultation, and preparation of this report.
- 7.2 Maintenance/Ongoing costs Transport Unit Operational Expenditure budgets, includes maintenance of bus stop infrastructure, which adds up to approximately \$230 annually.
- 7.3 Funding Source Traffic Operations, Capital Expenditure budget for bus stop upgrades.
- 7.4 If approved, the recommendations will be implemented during this financial year.

8. Legal Implications Ngā Hīraunga ā-Ture

Statutory power to undertake proposals in the report Te Manatū Whakahaere Kaupapa

- 8.1 The relevant Community Board or Committee have delegated authority from the Council to exercise the delegations as set out in the Register of Delegations. The list of delegations for the Community Boards includes the resolutions of:
 - Stopping, standing, and parking restrictions (including bus stops) under Clause 7 of the Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017.

Other Legal Implications Etahi atu Hīraunga-ā-Ture

- 8.2 The legal consideration is that the installation of any signs and/or markings associated with traffic control devices must comply with the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004.
- 8.3 This report has not been reviewed and approved by the Legal Services Unit.

9. Risk Management Implications Ngā Hīraunga Tūraru

- 9.1 Should the Community Board proceed with Option 2, the do-nothing option:
 - The buses will continue to stop outside bus box posing accessibility and safety risks as discussed in clause 3.2 of section 3.

10. Next Steps Ngā Mahinga ā-muri

10.1 Once recommendation approved, staff will contact the contractors to proceed the construction steps.





1. Purpose and Origin of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to receive information about plans for the Sparks Road / Milns Road intersection, and for development along Sparks Road in the vicinity.
- 1.2 This report is staff initiated, following an update briefing to the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board on 13 September 2022, and a further update on 28 September 2023.
- 1.3 The decisions in this report are of low significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. The level of significance was determined by the low level of impact and low number of people affected by the recommended decision.

2. Officer Recommendations Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

- 1. Receives the staff report on Sparks Road and Milns Road intersection.
- 2. Receives the staff Memorandum with respect to the Manager Consultancy Services exercising delegation for the Road Stopping of areas of Sparks/Milns Road and purchase of land off Milns Road see **Attachment A** to the report on the meeting agenda.
- 3. Receives the scheme plans for the Sparks Road improvements, see **Attachment C** to the report on the meeting agenda, and notes that further details remain to be established through the subdivision process for various parcels of land along Sparks Road.

3. Reason for Report Recommendations Ngā Take mō te Whakatau

- 3.1 It is proposed to stop the road in order to take the opportunity to move the Milns Road intersection with Sparks Road ~200m to the east as part of the subdivision development.

 Attachment C
- 3.2 The Roading Division have been in negotiations with the developer of land between Milns and Sparks Road in order to facilitate improvements to the safety of the roading network.
- 3.3 These negotiations involved stopping of road along with the exchange of land for roading and stormwater purposes.
- 3.4 Council will likely only have this opportunity, as once the land is developed there will be no practical alternative solution to the problems being experienced at the intersection.



3.5 The Manager Consultancy Services has the delegation to undertake the road stopping and acquisition of land for road which will be undertaken following the approval of the recommendation in this report for roading improvements to Sparks and Milns Road.

4. Alternative Options Considered Etahi atu Kowhiringa

- 4.1 Not stopping part of the road and keeping the current general alignment of the Sparks / Milns / Sutherlands intersection as a crossroad
 - 4.1.1 This has been discounted as it would not be possible to achieve the desired safety outcomes while retaining the current alignment.

5. Detail Te Whakamahuki

- 5.1 The decision affects the following wards/Community Board areas:
 - 5.1.1 Halswell Electoral Ward
 - 5.1.2 Waipuna / Halswell Hornby Riccarton Community Board area

Background

- 5.2 The current intersection---Milns / Sutherland / Sparks is a project in the '21-'31 Long-Term Plan for upgrade, and in recent years Council had received numerous submissions to advance this project.
- 5.3 Council staff briefed the Community Board on development in the area (including Sparks Road and the Sparks / Milns intersection) on 13 September 2022, and the feedback was supportive.
- 5.4 The development at 179 Milns Road creates an opportunity to relocate the Milns/ Sparks arm of the intersection approximately 200m eastward, as shown in **Attachment C**. This new intersection at Sparks will deliver a safer outcome for the road network than the current crossroads alignment.
- 5.5 Discussion with the development staging is advanced, with the approval of Stage 1 of RMA/2022/2381. This stage also includes the construction of the new internal road.
- 5.6 To proceed with the next stage of the subdivision, staff have recommended a portion of legal road indicated outlined blue on the attached plan **Attachment B** and land swapped with the owner for the parcel of land required for the construction of the 'New Road' intersection with Sparks road. The works on Milns and Sparks will be Resource Consent conditions for the next stage of development. This stage of the development will result in a restrictive movement with "Cyclists and Pedestrians" entry / exit only for Sparks/ Milns arm of the Sparks/Mins/ Sutherlands intersection.
- 5.7 In the 1980s Council acquired the parcel west of 179 Milns Road for roading purposes. With this development, a significant area of this legal road will need to be stopped in order to fund the work required to create a new intersection, Sparks Road upgrading and upgrading of Connals Drain.
- 5.8 Within the land that is proposed to be stopped, 16 trees are identified in the tree report. Unfortunately these trees were not maintained over their lifetime and left to survive on their own accord and as a result are described as being in poor form. It is anticipated that these trees will be replaced in locations along Sparks and Milns in accordance with Council's Trees Policy. The Developer and Christchurch City Council will enter into a Private Development Agreement (PDA) to deliver the project. The plan shown in **Attachment C** indicates the various parcel of works along Sparks Road.



5.9 In addition, the Council's Traffic Operations team have identified minor interim safety improvements to the existing Sparks Road / Milns Road / Sutherlands Road intersection. These interim changes are detailed on **Attachment D.** No specific consultation has been undertaken as these changes are safety related and minor in nature.

1. Background Te Horopaki

- 1.1 The intersection of Milns and Sparks Road Halswell is a project in the LTP which is programmed for an upgrade.
- 1.2 Council has received numerous submissions to advance this project.
- 1.3 A briefing to the Community board in September 2022 sought feedback of the project and the Community Board were supportive of the project.
- 1.4 The development at 179, Milns Road creates an opportunity to relocate the Milns/ Sparks arm of the intersection approximately 200m eastward. This new intersection at Sparks will deliver a safer outcome for the Road Network.
- 1.5 The Asset and Planning Team (Transport) have assessed and approved the road stopping application in accordance with the Councils Road stopping policy.
- 1.6 It is intended to stop the road shown in the plan Section 1 on Plan R3 RPS5114 and acquire a portion of the land where the intended road is to be located shown as Section 2 plan 179 Milns Road-RMA/2022/2381.
- 1.7 There will be a Public Development Agreement entered into between the developer and Christchurch City Council to ensure that the land exchange is equitable between the parties.

2. Delegation Authority Decision Required Me Whai Whakataunga Tukumana

- 2.1 The Christchurch City Council has delegated to the Manager Property Consultancy the authority to make application to the Minister of Lands to stop roads.
- 2.2 The Manager Property Consultancy has delegated authority to acquire land up to the value of \$250,000.
- 2.3 The developer and Council are sharing the costs associated with both the road stopping, acquisition of land for road, road formation therefore the financial conditions of the delegation in paragraph 2.2 are not applicable. The acquisition also falls within the strategic Land Use and Planning objectives (Transport) levels of service outlined in the draft LTP 2021 2031.

1. Purpose of the Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 To seek the approval of the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to install No Stopping restrictions at the Symes Road and Hayton Road intersection. This report has been written following a request from an industrial business to improve heavy vehicle turning movement.
- 1.2 The decisions in this report are of low significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. The level of significance was determined by the low level of impact and low number of people affected by the recommended decision.
- 1.3 The community engagement and consultation outlined in this report reflect the assessment.
- 1.4 The recommended option is to Install No Stopping restrictions in accordance with Attachment A. The length of No Stopping in this option will improve heavy vehicle turning movement at the Symes Road and Hayton Road intersection, as determined by vehicle tracking analysis and site visits.

2. Staff Recommendations / Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

- 1. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south-western side of Symes Road (east-west leg) commencing at its intersection with Main South Road and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 16 metres, as shown on Attachment Ato the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 2. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south-western side of Main South Road commencing at its intersection with Symes Road (east-west leg) and extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 77 metres, as shown on Attachment A- to the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 3. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the north-eastern side of Symes Road (east-west leg) commencing at its intersection with Main South Road and extending in a south-easterly then easterly direction for a distance of 63 metres, as shown on Attachment A- to the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 4. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south-eastern side of Main South Road commencing at its intersection with Symes Road (east-west leg) and extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 40 metres, as shown on Attachment Ato the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 5. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the western side of Hayton Road commencing at its intersection with Symes Road (east-west leg) and extending



- in a northerly direction for a distance of 17 metres, as shown on Attachment A- to the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 6. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the south side of Symes Road (east-west leg) commencing at its intersection with Symes Road (north-south leg) and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 23 metres, as shown on Attachment A- to the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 7. Approves that the stopping of vehicles be prohibited at any time on the western side of Symes Road (north-south leg) commencing its intersection with Symes Road (east-west leg) and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 14 metres, as shown on Attachment A- to the report on the meeting agenda Plan TG146866 dated 23/1/2024.
- 8. Revoke any previous resolutions pertaining to traffic controls made pursuant to any bylaw to the extent that they are in conflict with the traffic controls described item 1 to 7 above.
- 9. Approve that these resolutions take effect when parking signage and/or road marking that evidence the restrictions described in item 1 to 7 above are in place (or removed in the case of revocations).

3. Reason for Report Recommendations Ngā Take mō te Whakatau

- 3.1 Heavy vehicle turning issues have been raised by a B-train heavy vehicle driver. When vehicles are parked close to the Symes Road and Hayton Road intersection, particularly at Symes Road, turning movement for heavy vehicles can be restricted at times due to the remaining usable carriageway widths.
- 3.2 During staff site observations, safety concerns have been identified at the intersection of Symes Road and Hayton Road due to restricted visibility caused by on street parking close to the intersection. Implementing the noted recommendations will lead to a reduction in the risk of a crash by improving sightlines at the intersection.
- 3.3 The recommendations in this report will help to achieve the desired community outcome of a well-connected and accessible city through improved road safety.
- 3.4 Install No Stopping restrictions in accordance with **Attachment A.** The lengths of No Stopping in this option have been determined by vehicle tracking analysis and site visits.
- 3.5 Options within this report have been assessed against relevant industry-standard design guidance including the sight distance requirements of Council's Infrastructure Design Standard.

4. Alternative Options Considered Etahi atu Kowhiringa

- 4.1 Maintain the status quo Do not install no stopping restrictions.
- 4.2 The advantages of this option include:
 - 4.2.1 Retaining between 3 8 on-street parking spaces. Although vehicles can legally park to the northern side of Symes Road (east-west leg) when entering from Main South Road, the lane width is narrow. No vehicles have been observed parking in this area whenever staff passed through this road.
- 4.3 The disadvantages of the option include:
 - 4.3.1 Does not improve heavy vehicle turning movement at the Symes Road and Hayton Road intersection.



5. Detail Te Whakamahuki

- 5.1 Symes Road and Hayton Road form a Give Way controlled T-junction, with priority given to Hayton Road.
- 5.2 Staff have visited the site and investigated further that visibility can be limited by parked vehicles on Hayton Road and Symes Road. There are high parking demands in the area due to the car dealer near the intersection. Staff have taken proactive action to propose No Stopping restrictions at the Symes Road / Hayton Road intersection as well as Main South Road / Symes Road intersection (see Attachment B consultation plan). Following consultation and feedback from submitters, staff have amended the proposal to allow four parking spaces to be retained (see Attachment A).
- 5.3 A search of Waka Kotahi's Crash Analysis System (CAS) shows there have been two reported minor injury crashes in the last ten years. The crash occurred on 24 August 2019 on a fine night at 8.53pm, involving vehicle loss of control hitting the tree due to his power steering locked. The other crash occurred on 11 February 2021 on a fine day at 3.29pm, involving an 11 year old pedestrian crossing Hayton Road that was hit by oncoming an vehicle from the north as his visibility was blocked by a courier van waiting to turn right from Symes Road.
- 5.4 Main South Road is classified as Medium-High risk and Symes Road / Hayton Road is classified as Low-Medium risk under Council's collective risk mapping system. For personal risk, Main South Road, Symes Road and Hayton Road are all classified as Low-Medium risk.
- 5.5 Approval is required by the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board.
- 5.6 If approved, the recommendations will be implemented within the current financial year (generally around four weeks after the contractor receives the request, but this is subject to other factors such as resourcing and prioritisation beyond Council's control).

Community Views and Preferences

- 5.7 Three affected property owners and occupiers were advised of the recommended option by letter, including the consultation plan as shown in **Attachment B**. All three submissions objected the proposal.
- 5.8 The property occupier at 207 Main South Road responded that the area may not be suitable for heavy vehicles route as it's predominantly residential area.
- 5.9 The property occupier at 10 Symes Road responded that they would prefer the parking restrictions as minimal as possible and not removing valuable parking spaces for local companies and residential.
- 5.10 The property owner and landlord of both 207 Main South Road and 10 Symes Road objected to the proposal that truck and trailer units should use alternative route, and parking should be maintained for the businesses.
- 5.11 Staff have considered the community views and reduced the No Stopping restrictions to allow for four parking spaces to be retained in addition to those in the original proposal. (see Attachment A). Although this proposal does not have sufficient No Stopping length needed to provide minimum gap sight distance especially allowing a driver entering the intersection sufficient visibility towards approaching traffic from the south to make the desired turn safety, staff believe this proposal is a good initiation. Staff issued the amended plan to the submitters again and their feedback has been positive.
- 5.12 The Team Leader Parking Compliance supports the preferred option.
- 5.13 The do-nothing option is inconsistent with community requests to improve heavy vehicle turning movement and improve visibility at the intersection.

- 8.2 The Community Boards have delegated authority from the Council to exercise the delegations as set out in the Register of Delegations. The list of delegations for the Community Boards includes the resolution of stopping restrictions and traffic control devices.







To fully complete Stage 1 of the Enhancement Project will cost a total of \$1.2M. The Riccarton Bush Trust currently has \$400,000 committed and are currently fundraising through various funding agencies.

Costs are looking to be reduced by using community volunteers and completing the work themselves where possible.

SECTION SIX: STAFF ASSESSMENT

Pūtaringamotu/Riccarton Bush is one of Canterbury's few remnants of kahikatea floodplain forest. It is of significant cultural and ecological value both locally and nationally. The current 7.7 hectares of forest is protected by a predator proof fence which was installed in 2003. There is currently 1360m of formed track through the forest. This comprised of a mix of concrete, boardwalk, and grit/shingle. It is recognised that the tracks through the bush would benefit from an upgrade.

Key works which will occur during the development of Pūtaringamotu include:

- Integration of Ngāi Tūāhuriri narratives, values and associations with Pūtaringamotu through design, art, entrance experience and interpretation. This will allow the forest to act as a story book
- Upgrade of the track system and develop areas such as the grove to support larger groups visiting Pūtaringamotu.
- Provide interpretation to educate, engage and encourage participation.

The recommendation to allocate funding towards the Riccarton Bush Trust is underscored by the profound community outcomes anticipated through the Enhancement Project for Pūtaringamotu/Riccarton Bush. This ecological haven, comprising 7.7 hectares of kahikatea floodplain forest protected by a predator-proof fence, stands as a valuable communal asset, both culturally and ecologically. The proposed project, particularly the creation of a new boardwalk, aligns with the Better Off Funding criteria and the Strengthening Communities Strategy pillars, with a keen focus on fostering community well-being.

The envisioned enhancements, including track system upgrades, the development of communal spaces like the grove for larger group activities, and the integration of Ngāi Tūāhuriri narratives, amplify the social fabric of the community. By turning Pūtaringamotu into a living storybook, the project aims to deepen the community's connection to nature and cultural heritage. Interpretative elements, designed to educate and engage, further contribute to a shared sense of belonging.



The cost-effective approach, leveraging community volunteers and in-house capabilities, not only ensures fiscal responsibility but also promotes a collaborative spirit within the community. The community's active involvement in the public consultation process, with 115 supportive responses received in 2021, demonstrates the collective desire for infrastructure development. The proposed funding, contributing to the \$1.2 million project, is integral to realizing these community-centric objectives, enhancing the overall experience at Pūtaringamotu/Riccarton Bush and solidifying its role as a communal haven for nature, culture, and social connection.


4. Advice Provided to the Community Board Ngā Kupu Tohutohu ka hoatu ki te Poari Hapori

4.1.1 Hornby Matatiki Centre

Hornby Matatiki Centre's official opening date has been announced. The new centre will be open from 3pm on Friday 19 April 2024 following a formal opening.

The formalities will be followed by a full day of community activities and celebrations on Saturday 20 April. Full information can be found on Newsline.





4.2 Maintenance of Riccarton gardens

At its meeting on 9 November 2023 the Board received a Public Forum presentation from a resident regarding maintenance of Riccarton gardens and requested staff advice on the maintenance schedule cycle for roadside gardens in Central/Upper Riccarton and any additional measures that can be implemented to address accumulations of litter, waste and dumped items in the area.

Staff have responded that litter within gardens covered under the Road landscape contract is removed at the time of servicing which is currently monthly. Dumped rubbish is covered /removed reactively when reported and/or the matter is referred to applicable roading division if removal is beyond the capability of gardening staff.

4.3 Flooding in Ensign Street, Halswell

At its meeting on 15 June 2023 the Board noted there had been expressions of concern about flooding in Ensign Street, Halswell. The road was flooding following rain events, particularly in the vicinity of the medical centre. The Board requested that staff investigate the flooding in Ensign Street and provide advice on possible measures to address this including details of the street sweeping schedule in the area.

Staff advised that investigations have taken place but nothing significant has been found. A good rain event is needed before staff can see the exact issue being raised. This is an operational matter, and the concerned residents should contact the Council call centre if this happens again.

4.4 Vehicle speed - De Havilland Street, Hornby

At its 10 August 2023 meeting the Board requested that staff investigate vehicle speed on De Havilland Street, Hornby and provide advice on any measures required to reduce speeds.



Staff have advised that a tube counter was installed to measure speed in De Havilland Street. It showed the mean speed is 42.4 kilometres per hour westbound and 39.8 kilometres per hour eastbound. The 85th percentile speed is 51.1 kilometres per hour westbound and 48.4 kilometres per hour eastbound. Staff consider that these speeds are acceptable for the current traffic environment and do not indicate a general speed issue. The speed data did however record a relatively small number of vehicles travelling at higher inappropriate speeds, and this information has been forwarded onto Hornby Police to assist with enforcement.

This road was not part of the approved interim Speed Management Plan but is included in the draft Safer Speeds Plan as proposed 30 kilometres per hour, consultation has now closed.



1. Purpose of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The Local Government Act 2002 prescribes the processes by which Community Boards must elect their chairpersons and deputy chairpersons. This report describes the alternative processes available, one of which must be adopted.
- 1.2 The report has been written following the resignation of the current Community Board Chairperson, Helen Broughton.
- 1.3 On 1 March 2024, Helen Broughton resigned as the Chairperson of the Waipuna Halswell—Hornby-Riccarton Community Board effective from 30 April 2024, subject to the condition the Board designate her as lead and spokesperson on all planning issues, including submissions for the remainder of the term. Helen Broughton has indicated that she will continue as a member of the Community Board.

2. Officer Recommendations Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

- 1. Receives the information in the report.
- 2. Accepts the resignation of Helen Broughton as the Chairperson of the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board, subject to the conditions listed in 1.3 above.
- 3. Adopts, by resolution, whether it will use System A or System B to elect a Chairperson.
- 4. Proceeds to elect a Community Board Chairperson effective from 1 May 2024.

3. Legal Considerations

Introduction

- 3.1 The provisions of Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002 apply to Community Boards (with a small number of exclusions), with necessary modifications as if the boards were local authorities. Clause 21 of Schedule 7 requires that each Community Board, at its first meeting, must elect one of its members to be its Chairperson and another to be Deputy Chairperson.
- 3.2 At its Inaugural meeting on 26 October 2022 the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board elected Helen Broughton Chairperson and Marie Pollisco Deputy Chairperson. On 1 March 2024 Helen Broughton resigned as the Chairperson of Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board effective 30 April 2024. A further election is therefore required to elect a new Chairperson to take office as of 1 May 2024.
- 3.3 The manner in which a Community Board is to elect these positions is prescribed in Clause 25 of Schedule 7 that provides that the Community Board must determine by resolution that the Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson be elected or appointed by using one of the following systems of voting:



System A

- 3.4 Requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives the votes of a majority of the members of the Community Board present and voting; and
- 3.5 Has the following characteristics:
 - 3.5.1 There is a first round of voting for all candidates; and
 - 3.5.2 If no candidate is successful in that round there is a second round of voting from which the candidate with the fewest votes in the first round is excluded; and
 - 3.5.3 If no candidate is successful in the second round there is a third, and if necessary subsequent, round of voting from which, each time, the candidate with the fewest votes in the previous round is excluded; and
 - 3.5.4 In any round of voting, if two or more candidates tie for the lowest number of votes, the person excluded from the next round is resolved by lot.

System B

- 3.6 Requires that a person is elected or appointed if he or she receives more votes than any other candidate; and
- 3.7 Has the following characteristics:
 - 3.7.1 There is only one round of voting; and
 - 3.7.2 If two or more candidates tie for the most votes, the tie is resolved by lot.

Practical application of clause 25

- 3.8 Each Community Board must first determine, by resolution, which system of voting it will use, that is System A or System B.
- 3.9 Nominations for the position of Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson are called for.
- 3.10 If there is only one candidate, then the Community Board may resolve that that person be elected.
- 3.11 If there is more than one candidate the Community Board must then put the matter to a vote according to the system, it has adopted. The Community Board members are then asked to vote on each candidate.
- 3.12 The following examples may be useful to illustrate two of the system:

System A


Example 1

Three nominations are received and upon the votes being counted the result is: A (5) B (2) C (1). In this case A is elected to the relevant position.

Example 2

Three nominations are received and upon the votes being counted the result is:

A (3) B (3) C (2). In this case no candidate is successful, so a second round of voting is held for candidates A and B. The lowest polling candidate, C, is excluded.



System B

Example 1

Three nominations are received and upon the votes being counted the result is: A (5) B (2) C (1). In this case A is elected to the relevant position.

Example 2

Three nominations are received and upon the votes being counted the result is:

A (4) B (4) C (0). In this case a lot is held to determine who between A and B will be elected to the relevant position.

1. Purpose of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to reconsider the Officer Recommendations 6 through 10 pertaining to traffic control (Attachment A to this report) and the accompanying design plan (Attachment B to this report) as tabled at the 15 February 2024 meeting.
- 1.2 Further to the report considered at the 15 February 2024 meeting of this Community Board, there is new information that is relevant to the decision that was not before the meeting.
- 1.3 Following on from the resolutions made in relation to this matter, the material has been reviewed by Legal Services.

- recommendations 1(a)-(e), 2, 3, and 4. As the Board did not agree to the recommendations in 6 to 10, staff recommendations 19 and 20 were not considered.
- 3.4 Following consideration of the report at the 15 February 2024 meeting new information has been provided to the Board that was not before that meeting and that is relevant to the decisions made.
 - 3.5 The information will be presented to the Board in Public Excluded as the report contains legal advice. The withholding of the information is necessary to maintain legal professional privilege.

1. Purpose and Origin of Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 For the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to approve safety improvements to intersections around Church Corner and to make recommendations to Council for the items within the proposed design that rest with Council for decision making.
- 1.2 This report has been written in response to ongoing safety concerns in the area particularly for people travelling across the community by all different modes.
- 1.3 This intersections of Riccarton/Hansons/Waimairi and Curletts/Main South are both within the top 1% of intersections within the Christchurch District in terms of risk of being in a crash, compared to over 5700 Council controlled intersections citywide (Main South/Yaldhurst is in the top 3%). The intersection safety improvements were identified through a co-design process with Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency for the 2021-2024 National Land Transport Programme Funding Cycle. The Pipeline Development Tool (PDT) used in this process helps road controlling authorities and their funding partners plan road safety interventions, understand their benefits, including the expected reduction in death and serious injury, and identify the most effective interventions at a local, regional, and national level.
- 1.4 Church Corner and Waimairi Road are busy locations used by many people travelling to school, University or work, accessing the local shops and Bush Inn Centre, or moving across the community. Whether people are travelling through this intersection on foot, by bicycle, by bus or driving, they should be able to do so safely.
- 1.5 The decisions in this report are of medium significance in relation to the Christchurch City Council's Significance and Engagement Policy. The level of significance was determined by this being a busy area used daily by people travelling to the local amenities, travelling to school and commuting to work. There is some community interest in the project due to existing safety concerns.
- 1.6 The recommended option is to construct a package of safety improvements in the vicinity of Church Corner, as show in **Attachment A**, and summarised below:
 - Safe speed platforms on all approaches to the Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane, and Waimairi Road intersection.
 - Removing the slip lane from Riccarton Road onto Waimairi Road.
 - Reconfiguration of angle parking to parallel parking on Waimairi Road.
 - Speed humps on Angela Street and Brake Street at their intersection with Yaldhurst Road, Leslie Street at its intersection with Waimairi Road and Bowen Street at its intersection with Peer Street.

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- Making Main South Road (from Riccarton Road) entry only and removing vehicle access out of Main South Road onto Riccarton Road and Yaldhurst Road.
- Installation of pedestrian zebra crossings on Yaldhurst Road and Main South Road.
- Removing the left turn slip lane from Main South Road into Curletts Road and providing a left turn lane at the signals.
- Raised signalised crossing on Waimairi Road (outside Bush Inn Centre).
- Cycle improvements and bus stop improvements.

2. Officer Recommendations Ngā Tūtohu

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board recommends that the Council:

- Approves, pursuant to Clause 18 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017:
 - a. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of northbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the west side of Waimairi Road, commencing at its intersection with Riccarton Road and extending in a northerly direction to its intersection with Bowen Street.
 - b. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of southbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the east side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 149 metres south of its intersection with Hanrahan Street and extending in a southerly distance to its intersection with Riccarton Road.
 - c. That a Special Vehicle Lane for the use of south eastbound road users as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the north-east side of Yaldhurst Road, commencing at a point 94 metres south-east of its intersection with Angela Street and extending in a south easterly direction to its intersection with Riccarton Road.
 - d. That a Special Vehicle Lane, in accordance with Clause 18 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, for the use of eastbound road users as defined in Section 1.6 (definition of Bus lane) of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004 and also as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004, excepting pedestrians and riders of mobility devices, be installed on the north side of Riccarton Road, commencing at its intersection with Yaldhurst Road and extending in an easterly direction to a point located 105 metres west of its intersection with Waimairi Road, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 2. Approves that in accordance with Section 8.5 of the Land Transport Rule Traffic Control Devices: 2004 that a signalised roadway crossing be installed on Waimairi Road, located 23 metres north from its intersection with Leslie Street, and as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A. This signalised crossing is for the use by the classes of road user as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004.
- 3. Approves that in accordance with Clause 21 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, that the path on the west side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 20 metres north of its intersection with Leslie Street, and extending in a northerly direction for a distance

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of 11 metres be resolved as a Shared Path and in accordance with section 11.4 of the Land Transport Act - Traffic Control Devices Rules: 2004. This Shared Path is for the use by the classes of road user only as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004.

4. Approves that in accordance with Clause 21 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, that the path on the east side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 165 metres south of its intersection with Hanrahan Street, and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 13 metres be resolved as a Shared Path and in accordance with section 11.4 of the Land Transport Act - Traffic Control Devices Rules: 2004. This Shared Path is for the use by the classes of road user only as defined in Section 11.1A of the Land Transport (Road User) Rule: 2004.

That the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board:

General

5. Approves pursuant to Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017 and Part 21 of the Local Government Act 1974 all kerb alignments, road surface treatments, traffic calming devices, traffic islands and road markings on Main South Road, Curletts Road, Yaldhurst Road, Riccarton Road, Angela Street, Brake Street, Leslie Street, Waimairi Road, and Hansons Lane, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.

Approves that in accordance with Section 8.2 of the Land Transport Rule Traffic Control Devices: 2004, that a Pedestrian Crossing be installed on Yaldhurst Road, located 65 metres south-east of its intersection with Brake Street, and as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 7. Approves that in accordance with Section 8.2 of the Land Transport Rule Traffic Control Devices: 2004, that a Pedestrian Crossing be installed on Main South Road, located 313 metres east of its intersection with Curletts Road, and as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024 and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 8. Approves, in accordance with Clause 16 (1) of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017, that Main South Road, from its intersection with Riccarton Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 75 metres, be a one-way street, where vehicles must travel in a westerly direction only.
- 9. Approves that in accordance with Section 4 of the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004 that the west bound traffic on Main South Road at a point 295 metres east of its intersection with Curletts Road be controlled by a Give Way.
- 10. Approves that in accordance with Clause 17(3) of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017 that a No Entry control be placed against eastbound vehicles using the roadway on Main South Road at a point 295 metres east of its intersection with Curletts Road.

Bus Stops

11. Approves that, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017 the north side of Riccarton Road, commencing at a point 158 metres west of its intersection with Waimairi Road, and extending in an easterly direction for a distance of 30 metres, be reserved for Large Passenger Service Vehicles only, for the purposes of setting down or picking up passengers only, as part of a Bus Service as defined in the Land Transport Management Act 2003, Section 5, - Bus Service, (a) (i), only.

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- 12. Approves that, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017 the west side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 72 metres north of its intersection with Leslie Street, and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 12 metres, be reserved for Large Passenger Service Vehicles only, for the purposes of setting down or picking up passengers only, as part of a Bus Service as defined in the Land Transport Management Act 2003, Section 5, Bus Service, (a) (i), only.
- 13. Approves that, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017 the east side of Waimairi Road, commencing at a point 119 metres south of its intersection with Hanrahan Street, and extending in a southerly direction for a distance of 30 metres, be reserved for Large Passenger Service Vehicles only, for the purposes of setting down or picking up passengers only, as part of a Bus Service as defined in the Land Transport Management Act 2003, Section 5, Bus Service, (a) (i), only.
- 14. Approves that pursuant to Section 339(1) of the local Government Act:1974, that a bus shelter be installed on the east side of Waimairi Road, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024, and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.

Stopping and Parking restrictions

- 15. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the east side of Waimairi Road commencing at its intersection with Riccarton Road and extending in a northerly direction for a distance of 168 metres.
- 16. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the north-east side of Yaldhurst Road commencing at a point 48 metres south-east of its intersection with Brake Street and extending in a south easterly direction to its intersection with Riccarton Road.
- 17. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the south-west side of Yaldhurst Road commencing at its intersection with Riccarton Road and extending in a north westerly direction to a point 200 metres south-east of its intersection with Curletts Road.
- 18. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the north-west side of Main South Road commencing at its intersection with Curletts Road and extending in a south westerly direction for a distance of 52 metres.
- 19. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the north side of Main South Road commencing at a point 262 metres east of its intersection with Curletts Road, and extending in a easterly direction to its intersection with Riccarton Road, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024, and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 20. Approves that the stopping of all vehicles be prohibited at any time, in accordance with Clause 7 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, on the south side of Main South Road commencing at a point 286 metres east of its intersection with Curletts Road, and extending in a easterly direction to its intersection with Riccarton Road, as detailed on plan TG145701, dated 23/01/2024, and attached to the report on the meeting agenda as Attachment A.
- 21. Approves that any previously approved resolutions be revoked, in accordance with Clause 6(2) of the Christchurch City Council Traffic & Parking Bylaw 2017, made pursuant to any Bylaw, Local Government Act, or any Land Transport Rule, to the extent that they are in conflict with,

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
or recommended to be removed in regard to the parking and /or stopping restrictions described in 1-21 above.

22. Approves that these resolutions take effect when parking signage and/or road markings that described in 1 to 21 are in place (or removed in the case of revocations).

3. Reason for Report Recommendations Ngā Take mō te Whakatau

- 3.1 The Church Corner area is busy with many people walking, cycling, accessing public transport and driving through, particularly at school times and when people are travelling to work.

 Whether people are travelling through this area on foot, by bicycle, bus or driving, they should be able to do so safely. If Council are to achieve its goal in reducing death and serios injuries on our roads, we need to create a safe transport system; one that recognises humans make mistakes and that these mistakes do not need to cost us our lives.
- 3.2 Options within this report have been assessed against relevant industry-standard guidance including the Standard Safety Intervention Toolkit Handbook produced by NZTA Waka Kotahi and Austroads design guides. Traffic signals are not typically identified and promoted as a Safe System solution, primarily due to the angle and impact speed of crashes at signalised intersections. Safe Speed Platforms (Raised Safety Platforms) are a vertical deflection device increasingly used to reduce the maximum comfortable operating speed for vehicles to Safe System collision speeds. The tolerable limit (survivable speed) for pedestrians and cyclists is 30 km/h.
- 3.3 Since the installation of the platform at the Lincoln/Barrington/Whiteleigh intersection, safer speeds by drivers entering the intersection have been achieved as shown in the chart below. In the preceding five-year period (2018-2022) there were 21 reported crashes at the Lincoln/Barrington/Whiteleigh intersection including two crashes resulting in serious injury. There have been no reported crashes at this intersection in 2023 (as of 16/01/2024).



Approach 85th percentile operating speeds at the Lincoln/Barrington/Whiteleigh intersection (vehicle speeds are at the bottom of the graph)

3.4 During consultation for Christchurch Regeneration Acceleration Facility (CRAF) projects, a request was received from a local blind resident for improvements to the section of Waimairi Road from Riccarton Road to Peer Street to help improve safety and accessibility for vision-

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- impaired, disabled and elderly people. This included a project to investigate the need for a signalised pedestrian crossing at the Bush Inn Centre.
- 3.5 The recommendations in this report will help to achieve the desired community outcome of having well-connected communities and neighbourhoods, so people can take fewer and shorter trips to access goods and services and have access to safe and reliable low-emission travel choices.

4. Alternative Options Considered Etahi atu Kowhiringa

Main South Road/Yaldhurst/Riccarton

4.1 Three options were proposed by the design team for the Main South Road/Yaldhurst Road/Riccarton Road intersection:

Waimairi Road crossing

4.5 An independent assessment was undertaken to determine the most suitable and safest crossing type. This is provided in **Attachment B**.

Safe System Assessment

4.6 A Safe System Assessment was completed as part of the optioneering for the improvements. The Safe System Assessment is a formal examination of a road related program, project or initiative that assesses the safety of the existing intersection and the proposals. The process assesses if, and how, existing or future changes aligns with safe system principles with a focus on safer roads and safer speeds. The assessment provides a score for the existing arrangement and a score for the options from a total score of 448 (the lower score the safer the outcomes). A summary of the scores from the Safe System Assessment can be found below. Note that the lower the score, the safer the option.

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




Chart 2: Summary safe system assessment collision type at Waimairi Road (black is existing and orange is proposed)

- 4.7 Chart 1 summarises the assessment of the Riccarton Road changes, which demonstrates that the closure of Main South Road at Yaldhurst and the Safe Speed Platforms at Riccarton/Hansons/Waimairi reduces the likelihood and severity of crashes for the intersections making them more safe system aligned. The Standard Safety Intervention Toolkit assumes a death and serious injury reduction of 40% by implementing raised safety platforms at existing signalised intersection.
- 4.8 The signalised crossing on a raised platform on Waimairi Road has benefits for all road users as shown in Chart 2.

5. Detail Te Whakamahuki

5.1 Improving safety on local roads in Christchurch is a priority for the Christchurch City Council. Providing safe infrastructure is key to ensure people get to where they are going safely irrespective of their mode of travel. Council has a Level of Service to reduce the number of deaths or serious injuries from all crashes by 40% in 2030. That is a reduction of five or more

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per year, and for this to be under 71 crashes per year within the 10-year period. This is also a goal in the Road Safety Action Plan, which is a collaborative plan between Christchurch City Council, NZTA Waka Kotahi, ACC, FENZ and New Zealand Police.

- 5.2 Information was extracted from the Life in Christchurch Survey to understand how people, who selected Bush Inn-Church Corner as their mall of choice, travel to the centre:
 - 5.2.1 The majority visit once a week (53.33%), with the next highest frequency being two to four times a week (26.67%).
 - 5.2.2 Most travel by car (66.67%), with the next highest mode being walking (16.67%).
 - 5.2.3 Of those travelling by car, 45% find it very easy, and 35% find it easy.
 - 5.2.4 Of those walking, 21.43% find it easy, 19.64% find it very easy, and 17.86% find it very difficult. There is a fairly even spread of difficulty for walkers.
- 5.3 The Church Corner area includes the Bush Inn Centre, Church Corner Mall, St Peters Anglican Church, a medical centre, supermarkets, other local shops and businesses. The University of Canterbury and student accommodation is located to the north of Riccarton Road, and there are two large schools close by including Villa Maria and Kirkwood Intermediate. These all generate foot traffic, so it needs to be safer for people wanting to cross the road. Further information on pedestrian counts and ward data is provided in **Attachment C**.
- 5.4 There are signalised crossing facilities at the Riccarton/Hansons/Waimairi intersection and designated crossing points in the median island close to the Main South Road/Yaldhurst Road intersection for people to cross.
- 5.5 It is proposed to provide improvements for people walking by providing additional crossing points and removing the slip lane from Riccarton Road into Waimairi Road. The primary reason for the removal of the slip lane is that it can make crossing a road feel unsafe for people walking, particularly children or vulnerable pedestrians. Drivers are focusing on what traffic may be coming from the right to see if they can pass through without stopping, which can sometimes lead to people speeding up to take the gap.
- 5.6 Many pedestrians have been observed crossing Riccarton Road using the median islands between the Hansons Lane intersection and the Main South Road intersection, but not at the designated crossing. This is an attractive place to cross given the location of bus stops, however pedestrians are required to cross two lanes of traffic in each direction in faster traffic.
- 5.7 There are no facilities for people riding bicycles through the Riccarton/Hansons/Waimairi intersection on Main South/Yaldhurst intersection. The South Express Cycleway provides a short local connection to Countdown entrance on the south side of Riccarton Road. The 2023 counts identified that there were 43 people riding bicycles through the intersection of Riccarton/Hansons in the morning peak hour, 72 in the afternoon peak hour and 17 during the off-peak lunchtime period. Some people were observed riding on the footpaths.
- 5.8 There are five bus routes that use the stops on Riccarton Road to the west of Hansons Lane including the numbers 5, 86, 100, 130 and 140. The Orbiter bus route turns right into Waimairi Road from Riccarton Road (and left out for return journey). The 5, 100 and 130 bus routes turn left into Main South Road for the outbound journey and use Curletts Road and the Peer/Yaldhurst intersection to travel east through Church Corner. There are bus stops located through the project area. There are no changes to bus routes, however there is a change to the stop outside Bush Inn on Waimairi Road to accommodate the signalised crossing.
- 5.9 There are approximately 2100 vehicles passing through the Riccarton/Hansons intersection in the morning peak and 2400 in the evening peak. There are approximately 1900 vehicles passing through at lunchtime.

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5.10 There is little guidance given to drivers on the westbound approach to the Riccarton Road/Yaldhurst Road/Main South Road intersection, which can lead to late lane change decisions. There is nothing to prevent late lane changing, and this increases potential for vehicles giving way on Main South Road to be confused as to whether they need to give way to westbound traffic. Although the visibility of oncoming traffic on Main South Road is clear, it is possible that the combination of the curve of Riccarton Road and the two westbound lanes attributes to poor perception of vehicle speed and gap selection by traffic waiting to exit Main South Road.

Crash information for Main South/Yaldhurst/Riccarton

- 5.11 In the full ten-year period between 2013 and 2022, and the partial year of 2023 (not all crashes are recorded straight away), there were 83 reported crashes at or within 50 metres of this intersection. Of the 83 crashes:
 - 76 were a result of crossing/turning movements
 - Four were a result of loss of control/head on
 - Two crashes were a result of rear-end/obstruction
 - One crash involved a person walking.
- 5.12 Of the 76 crossing/turning crashes, two resulted in a serious injury, and six resulted in a minor injury. There was no pattern in the two serious injury crashes:
 - 5.12.1One driver failed to stop at the give-way when turning right from Main South Road onto Riccarton Road and has driven into the corner of a bus that was about to turn into Yaldhurst Road from Riccarton Road.
 - 5.12.2One driver failed to stop at the give-way when turning right from Main South Road onto Riccarton Road and has driven into a cyclist travelling west on Yaldhurst Road from Riccarton Road.
 - 5.12.3 The six minor crashes were also similar to the serious crashes in that all drivers exiting Main South Road have hit a vehicle travelling westbound on Riccarton Road to Yaldhurst Road. In four crashes, the driver on Main South Road had failed to give-way, and in two instances the driver on Main South Road failed to see the vehicles approaching and have exited into the path of the oncoming traffic.
 - 5.12.4The remaining 68 crashes were non-injury crashes, however on several occasions FENZ have attended due to the significant damage to vehicles. Ambulances have also been dispatched to many of the crashes alongside Police. This crash type varies from two to 12 per year. Drivers exiting Main South Road have stated that they have failed to see a vehicle, failed to give-way and have mis-judged the speed of the vehicle approaching from the east. In several crashes, the driver travelling westbound has been unable to stop in time when seeing a driver exiting from Main South Road. Two crashes involved buses travelling along Riccarton Road to Yaldhurst Road.
- 5.13 Two of the four loss of control/head on crashes occurred in 2021, the remaining two occurred in previous years. There are no trends in the data, with the following crashes occurring:
 - Vehicle travelling westbound, has swerved hit the central island and then the driver has overcorrected ending up half on the footpath outside the church.
 - Vehicle approached intersection on giveway sign failed to see motorcycle and failed to give
 way, motorcycle swerved to avoid head on collision crossed centreline and was hit by a car
 driving the other way.

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- A driver turning right from Main South Road has entered the intersection, has panicked on seeing an eastbound driver approaching from Yaldhurst Road, and hit the accelerator ending in the front of a building.
- A driver turning right from Main South Road has lost control turning right. Was travelling over the temporary 30km/h limit used for the roadworks.
- 5.14 The two rear end crashes happened in two different years, one has involved a vehicle turning right into a side road away from the intersection and has hit a vehicle where the driver has made a last minute change to turn into the same entrance, the second crash involved a vehicle giving way to a rubbish truck collecting rubbish travelling eastbound on Riccarton Road and has been hit at the rear.
- 5.15 The crash involving the pedestrian resulted in minor injury only. The pedestrian had walked out into the road when walking with friends.

Crash information for Riccarton/Waimari/Hansons

- 5.16 In the full ten-year period between 2013 and 2022, and the partial year of 2023 (not all crashes are recorded straight away), there were 41 reported number of crashes at and within 50 metres of this intersection. During this time, there was one fatal crash, two crashes that resulted in serious injury, 11 crashes resulting in minor injury, and 27 that resulted in non-injury but mainly vehicle damage.
- 5.17 One crash resulted in a person losing a life. The crash involved a vehicle performing a filtered right turn onto Hansons Lane, who hit a westbound motorcyclist on Riccarton Road during early morning hours in 2021.
- 5.18 Two crashes resulted in serious injury to people travelling outside a vehicle:
 - 5.18.1 One crash involved a vehicle performing a filtered right turn onto Hansons Lane, who hit a westbound motorcyclist on Riccarton Road during the evening hours in 2022.
 - 5.18.2 One involved a person riding a bicycle south on Waimairi Road towards Riccarton Road and has collided with the rear of a vehicle. This crash occurred in 2021.
- 5.19 Of the remaining 38 crashes, 11 resulted in minor injury, this included three pedestrians being hit when crossing the road. These crashes occurred in two different locations:
 - Waimairi Road, north of the entrance to Bush Inn.
 - Riccarton Road to the west of Hansons Lane (two crashes).
- 5.20 A further collision occurred involving a pedestrian being hit when crossing the slip lane on Waimairi Road at the intersection with Riccarton Road.
- 5.21 19 of the 38 crashes involved drivers turning at the intersection and being hit, six of which have resulted in a minor injury.
 - 5.21.1 Seven of the crashes occurred at the Hansons/Riccarton intersection. Five vehicles turning right from Hansons Lane were hit by vehicles travelling westbound on Riccarton Road that had failed to stop at a red. A vehicle turning left from Hansons Lane was also hit by a westbound vehicle that had failed to stop at a red. Two crashes involved a vehicle turning right from Riccarton Road into Hansons Lane, which had failed to give way to a westbound vehicle.
 - 5.21.2Ten of the crashes occurred at the Riccarton/Waimairi Road intersection:
 - Four crashes involved people turning right from Riccarton Road and crashing with vehicles travelling eastbound that had proceeded through a very late orange/start of red.

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- Two crashes involved a vehicle turning right into Waimairi Road that had failed to give-way, on one occasion this was failing to see the motorcycle travelling east.
- One crash involved a vehicle waiting in the intersection to turn right and was hit by an
 oncoming vehicle travelling east on Riccarton Road. One crash involved a vehicle waiting to
 turn right into Waimairi Road when the signals were not operating, and one vehicle has
 indicated to the driver to turn but the driver has failed to see the car approaching in the
 other lane.
- Two vehicles exiting Waimairi Road were hit by people travelling on Riccarton Road (one in each direction) that had passed through a red signal. One vehicle that was hit was a bus.
- 5.21.3 Two of the crashes occurred on Waimairi Road at the Bush Inn entrance. One involved a vehicle turning in to the Bush Inn Centre and failing to see a vehicle travelling in the left turn lane accessing the centre, and the other involved a vehicle exiting that had failed to see a vehicle had exited Leslie Street.
- 5.22 Eight of the 38 crashes resulted in the rear end of a vehicle being hit (one was a cycle travelling on the footpath). These were all non-injury crashes, with vehicle only damage being reported. Four occurred on the approach to signals, two of which occurred on the Waimairi Road approach. In each instance a vehicle was following too closely with little time to react.
- 5.23 Five of the 38 crashes involved loss of control by the driver. Three drivers were attempting to turn right into Waimairi Road from Riccarton Road, one turning left from Riccaton Road into Waimairi Road, and one turning right from Riccarton Road to Hansons Lane. On each occasion, the vehicle hit the traffic signals. Four of the five crashes occurred at night after 10pm.
- 5.24 Two of the 38 crashes involved vehicles overtaking and hitting other vehicles. One was a result of a late lane change to exit onto Main South Road, one was an inexperienced and impatient driver.

Crash information for Waimairi Road crossing

5.25 In the full ten-year period between 2013 and 2022, and the partial year of 2023 (not all crashes are recorded straight away), there have been no reported crashes at the location of the existing island.

Changes following engagement

- 5.26 Following consultation, changes been made to the proposal, which include:
 - 5.26.1 Adding a speed hump on Bowen Street at the intersection with Peer Street to slow vehicle traffic entering this local street.
 - 5.26.2 Add sharrow markings in the shared through/left lanes between Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road to remind drivers that people riding bicycles are present.
 - 5.26.3Add additional coloured surfacing road marking alongside the bus stop on Riccarton Road.
 - 5.26.4 Futureproof the zebra crossing on Riccarton Road/Yaldhurst Road to change to a dual crossing in future if people on bicycles are observed crossing at this location.
- 5.27 The decision affects the following wards/Community Board areas:
 - 5.27.1 Riccarton Ward.
 - 5.27.2 Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton

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Christchurch City Council

6. Community Views and Preferences Ngā mariu ā-Hāpori

Public Consultation Te Tukanga Korerorero

- 6.1 Early engagement with key stakeholders started in late October 2023. An email was sent to key transport stakeholders, local organisations and schools to advise them of the proposed changes and offer to meet with staff.
- 6.2 Staff met with Bush Inn Centre on 2 November and St Peter's Anglican Church, St Peter's Anglican Pre-School, and Petersgate Trust on 10 November 2023 to discuss the proposed changes.
- 6.3 Staff visited 66 local businesses around Church Corner on 6 and 8 November 2023. Staff also door knocked eight residential properties around the proposed Waimairi Road crossing. Flyers were left for anyone that was unavailable to speak with staff.
- 6.4 Consultation started on 9 November and ran until 7 December 2023. An email was sent to 173 key stakeholders.
- 6.5 The consultation was hosted on Kōrero mai | Let's Talk which had over 8,500 views throughout the consultation period. A flythrough video of the proposed changes was created and posted on the Council's YouTube Channel which had over 5,000 views. A Chinese voiceover version of the flythrough video was sent directly to Chinese groups in Christchurch which had over 100 views.
- 6.6 The consultation was posted on the council Facebook page and was shared to eight local community group pages which reached over 8,800 people.
- 6.7 A flyer was distributed, and a letter was sent to absentee owners of 300 residential properties around Church Corner on 13 November 2023. 100 copies of the flyer were also dropped to St Peter's Anglican Church and St Peter's Anglican Pre-School.
- 6.8 Paid advertising promoted the consultation to the community, including digital and newspaper ads, bus shelter and washroom posters, digital screens utilised in Upper Riccarton Library, Riccarton Library and Jellie Park and signs put up near pedestrian crossing points around Church Corner and Waimairi Road.

Summary of Submissions Ngā Tāpaetanga

- 6.9 Submissions were made by 12 recognised organisations and 292 individuals.
- 6.10 A full table of submission feedback is available online or in Attachment D.
- 6.11 Submitters were asked questions about the following sections of the proposal:
 - The Riccarton Road, Hansons Road and Waimairi Road intersection.
 - The Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road intersection.
 - The Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection.
 - The raised signalised pedestrian crossing on Waimairi Road.
- 6.12 For each section of the proposal, submitters were asked how safe they feel using these intersections and crossing points now, compared to how safe they think they would feel if the proposed changes were made.
- 6.13 The existing Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 93 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 171 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.

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- 6.14 The existing Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 71 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 173 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.
- 6.15 The existing Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 98 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 151 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.
- 6.16 Crossing Waimairi Road near Bush Inn Centre currently is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 66 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 179 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.
- 6.17 The overall shift in safety perception across all the proposed changes is shown below in Table 1. A full breakdown analysis, key themes from submitters and a 'how to' on reading these tables is available in **Attachment E.** This also includes detailed feedback from key stakeholders including Environment Canterbury and staff response.
- 6.18 Overall, submitters indicated that they would feel safer if the proposed changes were made to each of the intersections or crossing points. There is a general increase in submitters saying they would feel somewhat safe (at least 11%) or very safe (at least 5%).

7. Policy Framework Implications Ngā Hīraunga ā- Kaupapa here

Strategic AlignmentTe Rautaki Tīaroaro

- 7.1 Council's strategic priorities have been considered in formulating the recommendations in this report, including, residents having equitable access to a range of transport options that make it easy and safe to get around the city, and reduce emissions as a Council and as a City.
- 7.2 This report supports the Council's Long Term Plan (2021 2031):
- 7.3 Transport
 - 7.3.1 Activity: Transport
 - Level of Service: 10.0.6.1 Reduce the number of death and serious injury crashes on the local road network <=96 crashes
 - Level of Service: 10.5.1 Limit deaths and serious injury crashes per capita for cyclists and pedestrians <= 12 crashes per 100,000 residents

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Policy Consistency Te Whai Kaupapa here

7.4 The decision is consistent with Council's Plans and Policies.

Impact on Mana Whenua Ngā Whai Take Mana Whenua

- 7.5 The decision does not involve a significant decision in relation to ancestral land or a body of water or other elements of intrinsic value, therefore this decision does specifically impact Mana Whenua, their culture and traditions.
- 7.6 The decision does not involve a matter of interest to Mana Whenua and will not impact on our agreed partnership priorities with Ngā Papatipu Rūnanga.
- 7.7 The effects of this proposal upon Mana Whenua are expected to be insignificant as the proposal involves minor work within the existing carriageway.

Climate Change Impact Considerations Ngā Whai Whakaaro mā te Āhuarangi

- 7.8 The decisions in this report are likely to:
 - 7.8.1 Contribute neutrally to adaptation to the impacts of climate change.
 - 7.8.2 Contribute positively to emissions reductions.
- 7.9 The emission reductions associated with this project have not been estimated.
- 7.10 Improving the ability for people to walk and cycle are a key part of council's emissions reduction efforts by providing a safe, low emission way for residents to move around the city.
- 7.11 From the 2022 Life in Christchurch Transport Survey, 96 percent of respondents travel by car. Inconsiderate and dangerous behaviour from other road users and sharing the road with cars were the main reasons respondents found it difficult to bike.
- 7.12 Improving safety and making the intersection feel safer would address some of the barriers to people making sustainable travel choices. Removing these barriers will lead to reductions in vehicle kilometres travelled and consequently emissions from transport.
- 7.13 The National Emissions Reduction Plan (ERP) states we will have to 'substantially improve infrastructure for walking and cycling' to meet our emissions targets (including a 20% reduction in light Vehicle Kilometres Travelled by 2035 required under the ERP). Improving the quality of walking and cycling infrastructure is also a key part of the Ministry of Transport and Waka Kotahi's efforts to decarbonise the transport system, so improving safety for these users would be consistent with national direction.

Accessibility Considerations Ngā Whai Whakaaro mā te Hunga Hauā

7.14 This proposal improves accessibility for pedestrians/cyclists, by providing a safer means of crossing at the intersection and on Waimairi Road.

8. Resource Implications Ngā Hīraunga Rauemi

Capex/Opex Ngā Utu Whakahaere

- 8.1 Cost to Implement \$810k for the works on Riccarton Road and on Waimairi Road to Leslie Street. The Waimairi Road signalised crossing is estimated to cost \$500k. These are estimates and not tendered prices.
- 8.2 Maintenance/Ongoing costs To be covered under the area maintenance contract, the effects will be minimal to the overall asset.
- 8.3 Funding Source -

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- 8.3.1 Traffic Operations Minor Road Safety Budget for Riccarton Road and Main South Road projects.
- 8.3.2 Waimairi Road signalised pedestrian crossing (CPMS 73676) is funded through the Christchurch Regeneration Acceleration Facility (CRAF) in the Long-Term Plan.
- 8.4 Funding support Waka Kotahi have confirmed that funding support at 51% is approved for the intersection works on Riccarton Road and Main South Road through the low-cost low-risk programme. Activities funded through the Low-Cost Low-Risk investment pathway do not need to calculate a benefit-cost ratio. Funding support is only guaranteed for this financial year.

Other He mea ano

8.5 None identified.

9. Legal Implications Ngā Hīraunga ā-Ture

Statutory power to undertake proposals in the report Te Manatū Whakahaere Kaupapa

- Part 1, Clauses 7 and 8 of the Christchurch City Council Traffic and Parking Bylaw 2017 provides Council with the authority to install parking restrictions by resolution.
- 9.2 The Community Boards have delegated authority from the Council to exercise the delegations as set out in the Register of Delegations. The list of delegations for the Community Boards includes the resolution of stopping restrictions and traffic control devices.
- 9.3 The installation of any signs and/or markings associated with traffic control devices must comply with the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004.

Other Legal Implications Etahi atu Hīraunga-ā-Ture

- 9.4 There is no other legal context, issue or implication relevant to this decision.
- 9.5 This specific report has not been reviewed and approved by the Legal Services Unit however the report has been written using a general approach previously approved of by the Legal Services Unit, and the recommendations are consistent with the policy and legislative framework outlined in sections 9.1 9.3.

10. Risk Management Implications Ngā Hīraunga Tūraru

10.1 None identified.

11. Next Steps Ngā Mahinga ā-muri

11.1 Should the intersection and pedestrian safety improvements be approved, construction will follow this financial year.



CCC have requested a review using the using the Pedestrian Network Guide Crossing Selection Process to determine the crossing selection type for Waimairi Road near Bush Inn.

The location we are reviewing currently has a staggered pedestrian refuge which leads to a bus stop with no crossing facility provided on the eastern side.

Mid-Block Crossing Selection Flowchart



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Conclusion

The flowchart gives us the four options of raised signalised, signalised, raised zebra and median refuge.

Using the Waka Kotahi Crossing Context table there are general geometric similarities between a raised signalised crossing and raised zebra crossing however the signalised crossing has more benefits listed that fit our contextual situation such as reducing community severance across a busy road and eliminating grade change for blind/low vision and elderly residents. A signalised crossing also provides clear information in the form of visual or audible (for visually impaired) signals for users as well as clear guidance on when a driver must stop. These are key benefits of a Signalised Crossing that would appeal to local community such as the blind/low vision residents and elderly residents.

A signalised crossing can also balance the delays to both peds and through traffic by encouraging platoon crossing (in groups instead of a trickle).

Under the Safe System we believe that a raised signalised crossing is the best option using the Mid-block Crossing Selection Flowchart.

Note: The Austroads Pedestrian Facility Selection Tool was not used in this review.

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The Riccarton Ward includes the suburbs of Riccarton, Ilam and Upper Riccarton as well as parts of Sockburn and Fendalton. Hagley Park is on the eastern border of the ward, through to Avonhead Road, English Street and along Main South Road to the Sockburn roundabout. North to South, the ward includes most of Mona Vale along Kotare Street, Creyke Road and Maidstone Road. The railway line forms most of the southern border.

As well as part of Mona Vale, the Riccarton Ward takes in the University of Canterbury campus and Riccarton House and Bush. The busy Riccarton Road bisects much of the ward, not just physically but also demographically and socially. There are marked differences in income levels, as well as housing prices, density and ownership between the two sides of the corridor.

There are a number of older houses on traditionally larger sections on the north side of Riccarton Road, whereas the south side has seen increases in housing density as the larger sections are subdivided and developed into multiple unit housing. This includes social housing where the former state house and section model is being converted into multi storied complexes.



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

Methods

Pedestrian observations were conducted at each intersection, split into "West" (Hansons) and "East" (Waimairi) sites. Observations took place 5th-21st of December.

The journeys of individual pedestrians crossing the road were tracked during peak hours at each site. Pedestrians that did not perform crossings were not counted. Morning observations were conducted between 8am-9am, afternoon observations between 5pm-6pm, and weekend peaks between 1pm-2pm.

Due to time constraints a one-hour observation was conducted per time slot, and a half-hour confirmation count was performed on a different day.

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


Figure 1: Map showing crossing points A to D on Riccarton-Waimairi to describe pedestrian journeys.


Comments

- Pedestrians could also be observed jaywalking farther up Waimairi Road, at the main entrance to Bush Inn Mall, rather than using the C-B-A crossing to get to Church Corner.
- A person with a walker was observed to struggle to descend the steep kerb at D, opposite Waimairi Road. They were assisted by their companion, but this demonstrates the risk associated with the kerb design.
- East observations were completed at a later time than West observations, meaning that the school term had ended and it was nearer to Christmas. This may affect the volume of pedestrians observed crossing.

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

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Christchurch City Council's Safe Speed Platforms. Environment Canterbury is the main public transport provider in the Canterbury region. Our network in Greater Christchurch consists of urban buses, school buses and a ferry service. Please find our comments below.

- Environment Canterbury are supportive of the provision of measures to improve the safety of all users of the transport network. We support lowering vehicle speeds to enhance safety.
- However, we believe that the provision of speed platforms/ tables on roads used by our high frequency routes unfairly disadvantage public transport in relation to private cars, which is contrary to the intent of the Christchurch City Council's Strategic Transport Plan.
- On our high frequency routes our buses will traverse speed platforms multiple times
 each day, increasing wear and tear on suspension components (and therefore
 increasing our operating costs) and causing discomfort for our passengers. To
 partially mitigate this, buses will have to travel very slowly over the platforms,
 increasing our journey times in comparison to private cars that can traverse the
 tables faster and with less wear and tear consequences due to the relative
 infrequency of their movements.
- While Environment Canterbury are supportive of safe speed measures on our high frequency routes, we would prefer to see full consideration of alternatives to speed platforms / tables such as lowering speed limits and actively enforcing the lower limits before speed platforms / tables are constructed on these routes. Where such measures have proven ineffective, we would support the use of speed platforms / tables and would seek public transport friendly design elements such as lower gradients, suitable lengths and placement to ensure that vehicles track over them in a straight line.
- In addition, as part of these projects, we would like to see measures to increase the
 relative competitiveness of public transport incorporated into the planning and
 delivery of such interventions. This could include measures such as dedicated slip
 lanes, queue jump arrangements, signal priority, bus stop improvements and
 increased safety of access to bus stops.

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For the intersection of Yaldhurst/Main South Rd/ Riccarton/Curletts Environment Canterbury does not support the proposed changes in its current form, please see our comments below.

- This is a very busy intersection for public transport and is used by some of the city's
 core services including route 5 (15 min frequency, 10 min frequency from mid 2025),
 route 100 (15 min frequency), route 130 (20 min frequency at peak traffic times) and
 route 140 (30 min frequency)
- The proposed plan for this intersection removes the slip road from Main South Rd to
 Curletts Rd which, will cause increased congestion and slow the public transport
 network down. Removing access to Riccarton Rd from Main South Rd will cause yet
 further congestion and further slow the network at a time when Environment
 Canterbury and The Christchurch City Council are working hard to make using public
 transport more advantageous than using private vehicles. We request that the slip
 road remain open for PT use only.
- We would urge the Christchurch City Council to reconsider the design of this
 intersection to include measures that prioritise public transport.
 Below is the suggested bus lanes in purple, with Bus priority access to the
 Curletts/Main South Rd intersection and bus priority access to Riccarton Rd from
 Main South Rd.



- Environment Canterbury would like to see a bus priority lane for the Orbiter on Walmairi Rd
- With the proposal in its current state and no access from Riccarton Rd to Main South Rd, any maintenance works on Yaldhurst Rd eastbound, Curletts Rd northbound or an emergency closure of either road would mean that public transport would not have a suitable alternative route available to detour. Currently Main South Rd is used to detour, as it has in previous years.
- In addition, it is disappointing that the promotional "Fly through the design" video
 on the consultation website addresses making this area 'safer and easier for people
 driving, walking, biking and scooting'. No mention is made of the many thousands of

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people that public transport carries through this area each day. This appears to be reflective of the design philosophy that has been applied.

Next steps

- We request that Environment Canterbury's Public Transport team are included in the project team working on the detailed design.
- We also request that Environment Canterbury's Public Transport Operations team is notified of any temporary traffic management in advance of implementation to ensure the impact to customers is minimised.



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




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

RE: Church Corner Safety Improvements

Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the proposed changes to intersections and crossings around Church Corner.

Upon reviewing the plans, we note the combination of proposed measures in this area, the principle of which Go Bus support, however, we have concerns about the impact that the measures proposed may have on the efficient delivery of the Public Transport (PT) services that we operate.

We note that in common with several other areas around the city, raised platforms are amongst the measures being proposed. Whilst we are aware that NZTA guidance recommends such treatments in some areas, we note that they are not generally recommended for key PT corridors. Go Bus has previously expressed concerns in relation to the implementation of raised platforms on key PT corridors due to the negative effects on passenger and driver comfort, increased vehicle wear and tear, and the compound effect of such measures on timetable adherence.

To give an insight into the volume of PT services that would be affected by the changes proposed, please see Appendix 1, which details bus movements through the affected intersections. However, to summarise, there are four routes that operate through this area, three of which operate through the Main South Road / Curletts Road, and Curletts Road / Yaldhurst Road intersections – operating a daily total of over 300 trips, Monday to Friday.

In addition to our concerns in relation to passenger and driver comfort, and vehicle wear and tear, we are particularly concerned about the changes proposed for the Main South Road / Curletts Road intersection, as it is our view that the three routes that currently make this turn and then turn right into Yaldhurst Road heading towards the city would be severely impacted by the combined effects of the loss of the slip lane, together with the re-routing of all eastbound traffic to make the same manoeuvre. Statistics available online suggest that on a representative weekday earlier this year, in excess of 1600 vehicles cross Curletts Road on Main South Road heading eastbound towards the city. Routing this number of vehicles via Curletts Road and Yaldhurst Road would effectively double the number of vehicles turning left from Main South Road into Curletts Road (Please see Appendix 2).

Heading west, out of the city, Go Bus is concerned about the islands/build-outs proposed for Riccarton Road in front of Countdown. Based on the plans, it appears that these would force buses to re-join the main traffic flow after serving the Church Corner bus stop outside Countdown. It is our view that this would cause delays to outbound services.

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The proposed works in their current form appear to be a missed opportunity to implement some meaningful and effective bus priority measures, by removing buses from the main flow of the re-routed traffic on Curletts Road and Yaldhurst Road. Go Bus' suggestion is that the section of Main South Road between Curletts Road and Riccarton Road, be turned into a bus only lane heading east bound into the city, with bus priority traffic lights at the Riccarton Road intersection to permit buses to easily enter Riccarton Road. In conjunction with the provision of a section of bus lane on Riccarton Road, from the current Church Corner inbound bus stop through the intersection with Waimairi Road, this would allow buses to by-pass a significant amount of congestion.

Based on experience with the current layout, and our interpretation of the proposed changes, we do not believe that there is a need for similar arrangements for outbound services, however, we do ask that consideration is given to the point made above, relating to the proposed islands/build-outs on Riccarton Road after the bus stop outside Countdown. We request a different approach that would allow buses to exit the bus stop and then turn into Main South Road, without the need to rejoin the main outbound, westerly traffic flow.

It is understood that re-routing the inbound services away from Yaldhurst Road would mean that the 'Yaldhurst Road near Curletts Road' bus stop could not be served, however the creation of a new inbound bus stop on Main South Road, opposite the existing outbound 'Main South Road near Curletts Road' bus stop could enable customer access to the re-routed services. Alternatively, the creation of a bus stop closer to the Riccarton Road intersection could allow easy access to the medical centre and shops in that area, utilising the proposed raised crossing on Yaldhurst Road.

To summarise the points detailed, Go Bus are keen to gain a greater understanding of the following points:

Follow up - additional information requested:

- Please provide a summary of the validated issues which are being addressed with the proposed measures at this location?
- Why are the proposed measures deemed fit for purpose at this location?
- What other options have been considered at this location? Have any of them been trialled, either in isolation, or collectively, if so, over what period and what were the outcomes of such trials?
- What was the rationale as to why any of the options have been discounted and how was this
 evaluated/ measured?
- Has a swept path analysis been conducted to ensure that the proposed kerbs and islands do not
 impact movements of, or cause damage to buses of 13.5 metres in length, when negotiated at
 the traffic speeds proposed?
- Is a reduction of the posted speed limit being proposed in the affected locations?
- Has there been a significant increase in traffic movements in this area to justify the introduction
 of traffic calming measures? If so, over what period was this calculated?
- What other intersections are currently being monitored for an increase in traffic movements?

Go Bus look forward to ongoing and meaningful dialogue about these and future plans which may impact bus routes. Our dedicated team are keen to assist and support wherever possible to also identify opportunities which will help deliver positive network outcomes, such as suggesting bus priority measures where multiple routes are impacted by the proposed works.

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Go Bus is committed to helping improve the safety of all road users while making public transport an attractive and reliable mode choice.

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

Appendix 2 - Traffic Counts - Curletts Road / Main South Road intersection



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

CCC. Safer intersections around Church Corner. 7 / 12 / 2023

If this proposal were to go ahead as per the fly over the negative aspects regarding traffic flow in the adjacent areas would be extreme at best. The areas identified in the flyover most certainly need a tidy up and an accentuation of the pedestrian crossings is required. Please read on.

It would appear that the main issue is the 35 crashes at Hanson's Lane and the 85 at the Main S / Riccarton Rd intersection. The Main S / Riccarton rd intersection can easily be adjusted to significantly lower the chance of crashing.

There are two areas that need addressing to achieve this.

One; travelling East on Main S to turn right on to Riccarton Rd. The vehicles that you must give way to are coming from your right however because of the RH bend in the road these vehicles are actually closer to you than they look and possibly the bend requires one to concentrate just that little bit more to identify them. There are no visual obstructions. The berm trees do not affect visibility.

All that is needed to make drivers more aware of vehicles approaching from the right is signage and there is plenty of space for signage on the central berm. This signage will warn drivers of the approaching vehicles. This "give way" signage should be a "stop and give way to the right"

Two; Travelling West on Riccarton Rd to veer right on to Yaldhurst Rd. There is signage on the central island advising drivers to use their indicators if veering to the right. This sign is small and aged. The forthcoming intersection at the Main Sth Rd to your left is not that obvious so if a driver exiting the Main Sth Rd doesn't see you then you may not have seen them until its too late. So we need to make the intersection more obvious to the Riccarton Rd drivers. The aforementioned "indicate" signage needs replacing with something larger and the addition of wordage, ie "caution, intersection on your left, slow down". The intersection itself could be made more obvious by the addition of signage. Eg, the new "stop" signage on the Main St Rd could be double sided, "stop" facing Main Sth and "slow" or "caution" facing Riccarton Rd.

So now we have made the intersection more obvious from both sides and made drivers from both sides more aware of each other. You could of course drop the speed limit to 30 kph, mentioned further on.

You do not have to remove the intersection! All of the aforementioned could have been done years ago.

Nb, the Main Sth Rd corridor to Riccarton Rd is heavily used and if its removed all of that that traffic will be concentrated on to the SH73 / Peer Str. intersection for the drivers to achieve the same destination, ie turning right on to Yaldhurst to reach Riccarton Rd, their intended route.

The slip lane left from Main Sth to Curletts Rd.

This allows vehicles to enter Curlett's Rd at all times of the day without the unnecessary interference of traffic lights when there is no traffic and also allows large vehicles easy turn.

This is very well used and is totally sensible. A fair percentage of the slip road users are turning left at Yaldhurst rd, why hold them up?

Contrast that; If the slip lane is removed all traffic turning left on to Curletts must use the traffic lights. This is all the traffic that would have gone straight ahead on Main Sth Rd to Riccarton Rd and the left turn slip road traffic. This will create a long tail back at peak times on the Main Sth road and then concentrate that built up traffic at the SH73 / Peer Street intersection all at the same time rather than that traffic filtering through the slip road. Also large trucks turning left will need the two Curlett's Rd lanes to get around and if there is tail back to that intersection from Peer Street, and there will be with the new concentration of vehicles turning right, then the truck will not be able to proceed whereby causing even more of a tail back. This traffic will be going nowhere but it will be stationery exhausting CO2 into the immediate vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians! There is a pedestrian crossing 200 meters away on the Main Sth Rd that is heavily used by Riccarton High School students and the tail backs will exceed that point. This would be dangerous and unnecessarily polluting for these students!!

Removing the slip lane from Main Sth Rd on to Curletts Rd/Peer Street whereby concentrating all the left turn traffic at the new traffic light system. This will be a total disaster. Following is an example of the exact situation that will occur if you go ahead with this proposal.

In approximately 2006 the free turn left from Parkhouse Rd on to Curletts Rd was changed to control by traffic lights. The result was tail backs far reaching back in to the industrial sub division. Every one using this previously perfectly functioning intersection knew it wouldn't work! What next, the CCC reinstated the intersection to "as it was". This whole situation will relive itself at the Main Sth rd Curletts rd intersection if the CCC removes the free left turn albeit worse as the traffic that was going straight ahead to Riccarton Rd will not now have that option and they too will have to turn left to travel down to the next right turn from Curletts to Yaldhurst on to Riccarton Rd.

To the pinch point, the SH73 / Peer St intersection.

We have now removed the Main St Rd extension to Riccarton Rd and the slip lane. So we will now be carrying all the traffic that would have used the Main Sth extension and the traffic that would have used the slip way which is a hell of a lot of traffic and all this additional traffic is released at the same time by way of the traffic lights. This "additional" traffic will now join up with the Curlett's Rd Nth bound traffic that is for 50% of the time stationery waiting for the green light and this traffic is often queued back to the Main Sth / Curlett's Rd lights so where are they going to go? nowhere, for a while at least and this traffic now includes the traffic that would have used the slip way which quietly just filtered through. Remember that we are now also holding the traffic that would have used the slip way to turn left into SH73!

Yaldhurst Rd from Peer St to Riccarton Rd. There is often a tail back here as it is and you want to add all the straight through traffic from the Main Sth Rd corridor/extension. There

will be times when turning right from Curletts on to Yaldhurst will not be possible as there is no room for more vehicles and of course that will further back up traffic way down Curletts and Main Sth. Curletts is slow moving as it is at peak times.

Regarding the roading, improve the intersection with Main St and Riccarton Rds and leave the rest alone because if you proceed as per your proposal you will probably be creating one of the biggest mistakes ever made to traffic control in Australasia.

Just thinking, it actually gets worse. All the Main Sth extension traffic will now be wanting to turn right off Curletts in to Yaldhurst so they will tail back to the Main Sth Curletts corner therefore traffic out of the Main Sth will have nowhere to go when the light turns green. Its even worse than that but I'll be writing forever. I want a meeting!!!

Pedestrian crossings.

There are three at present. One controlled at the Hanson's Lane intersection, one further North on Riccarton Rd with a mid road stopping position and one at the beginning of Yaldhurst rd. The second one needs tidying up and the Yaldhurst Rd one needs repositioning further West. Crossings 2 and 3 can be made into a proper pedestrian crossing, there is no need for traffic lights for those.

With all of the above in mind maybe the speed limit should be 30kph from Auburn Avenue to Brake Street and this would make the whole area a bit more user friendly.

We do not need any raised crossings, the 30kph would sort that.

Parallel parking on Waimairi Rd. Whilst parallel parking the vehicles are holding up traffic and encroaching into the cycle lane which is dangerous so leave the parks as angled.

In Closing;

The main issue is the 35 crashes at Hanson's Lane and the 85 at the Main S / Riccarton Rd intersection. As stated above the Main Sth / Riccarton rd intersection can be improved. A 30kph speed limit, highlighting of the pedestrian crossings and a general tidy up of the area will slow traffic and make drivers more observant.

Your proposal in its entirety will cost a lot and we simply cannot afford it, particularly considering that the proposal is seriously flawed.

The CCC seems to be abscessed with traffic lights controlling all of our driving situations and the affect it is having is slowing traffic and causing additional CO2 emissions which we are trying to cut down on.

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

Dear Sir/Madam,

One area of concern is for cyclists heading towards the city and onto the existing cycleways. Heading away from the city is not such a problem.



Currently the areas in red are dangerous for cyclists, so many will take green route (A).

The flow suggested after the improvements would be either (B) or brave the red just prior to Hansons Lane. (B) would be suitable for heading away from the city as there is no parking on that stretch.

One area that I know is **super dangerous is the area in the circle (Angela - Brake street)** where car doors are a major problem. I know of 4 injuries in that area alone.

A cycle solution starting at Curtlets road (not Brake street) is one solution. It is likely this is also of interest to buses also.

The existing City cycleway that most cyclists are trying to hook into from Yaldhurst or Riccarton road.

Whilst the proposed changes should be readily accepted I point out that since the new pedestrian/cycleway crossing on Waimairi Rd / Maydell St was installed traffic has come to almost a standstill on both Peer St and Waimairi Rd back to Riccarton Rd during peak hours. This has caused traffic from Peer St using Bowen St as a quick access via Hanrahan and Roundtree St's to Ilam Rd and the University and suburbs. Bowen St was never designed for large volume traffic. Closing the access from Main South Rd to Riccarton Rd will only increase more traffic on Bowen St which is the only route between Peer St and Waimairi Rd. This street is narrow and although it has parking restrictions 2 way traffic flow is impossible with vehicles having to pull over to allow oncoming vehicles through. This is as a courtesy rule. Bowen St is used for pedestrian access to Villa Maria College and with many young families who reside in the street's rental properties all face increased traffic hazards such as access to driveways and speeding vehicles. May I recommend a solution. No access from Peer St to Bowen St, left turn only access from Bowen St to Peer St. This would alleviate all of the residents problems."

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

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



of all abilities as well as cyclists and bus users. I have found it difficult to see what is planned without technical drawings, instead having to rely on the artists impressions and fly-though, as the detail in the overview diagram is quite hard to see. Please consider how Riccarton Road will change over time with a high-frequency bus/tram/light

Please ensure the speed limits are reduced around these intersections as soon as possible. Please talk to Waka Kotahi about lowering the speed limit on Yaldhurst Road to 50 km/h between Curletts Rd/Peer St and Russley Rd/Masham Rd (with the section east of Curletts/Peer reducing to 30 km/h).

Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road intersection specifics:

I cycle through here quite often (why aren't travel mode and frequency questions being asked, like they were in the other recent intersection improvement consultations?), typically north/south from Waimairi Rd to Hansons Lane and vice versa (and more so at the moment while Ilam Road has the MCR under construction). It's horrible to negotiate on a bike currently, and I'm too scared to ride my cargo trike through this intersection as there's no space for cyclists currently. Sadly, the proposed changes don't improve things much on left-turn into Hansons Lane, but the cycle lanes on the approaches are very much welcome!!

I support the raised safety platforms to reinforce the slow speed environment.

I support the raised and signalised pedestrian crossing on Waimairi Rd, along with the relocated bus stop and

I support the addition of on-road cycle lanes. Please install flexi-posts where possible (assuming the cycle lane is at least 1.2 metres wide to allow for cargo bikes and trikes).

I support the removal of the slip lane from Riccarton Road into Waimairi Road.

Please consider changing the left-hand lane in the middle bit between Waimariri Rd and Hansons Lane, in both eastand west-bound directions, to be left turn only (except for buses and cycles). Then provide either a cycle lane on the west-bound bit or a shared path, just around that corner from Riccarton Rd into Hansons Lane. Please provide a shared path on the left hand bend from Riccarton Rd into Waimairi Rd. Shortcuts like this are great for cyclists at busy intersections (e.g. Belfast Road into Main North Road).

I support removing the angle parking, as this is very scary as a cyclist (many near-misses here!).

I have concerns for the bus services stopping outside Countdown then merging back into one lane, before turning left to continue down Main South Rd. This merge will cause issues for everyone. Many years ago there used to be issues with west-bound traffic and the split between Main South and Yaldhurst Rds, but the intersection was changed and it made it a lot less ambiguous. Despite removing the conflict with traffic turning out of Main South Rd onto Riccarton/Yaldhurt Rds, I see this being a conflict pinch point that will delay buses, especially as the entrance and exit to the Countdown carpark off Riccarton Road is remaining. Please remove these entrance/exit points to Countdown (I'm guessing there's all sorts of consents to work through) and instead signalize the entrance/exit on Hansons Lane. Please consider providing a bus lane between the bus stop outside Countdown and the left turn into Main South, so buses don't have to merge with merging traffic heading down either Main South or Yaldhurst Rd.

I support the addition of on-road cycle lanes and the shared path from after the bus stop outside Countdown through to the MCR (please ensure adequate signage, black and yellow humps set back from the shared path rather than at the edge of the path (when the motor vehicle's front wheels hit the bump on the boundary line it's too late and the bonnet of the vehicle is blocking the shared path)).

Please also allow cyclists to use the zebra crossing across the entrance into Main South Road, and make the path along Yaldhurst Road between Riccarton Road and Curletts Road a shared path (allowing cyclists to ride down Riccarton Road, onto the shared path outside Countdown, then along Yaldhurst Road to be diagonally opposite Villa Maria College.

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

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

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed changes to the Church Corner intersections.

Introduction

Spokes Canterbury (http://www.spokes.org.nz/) is a local cycling advocacy group with approximately 1,200 followers. Spokes is affiliated with the national Cycling Action Network (CAN – https://can.org.nz/). Spokes is dedicated to including cycling as an everyday form of transport in the greater Christchurch and Canterbury areas. Spokes has a long history of advocacy in this space including writing submissions, presenting to councils, and working collaboratively with others in the active transport space. We focus on the need for safe cycling for those aged 8 to 80.

Proposal

The Church Corner intersections are well used by cyclists and pedestrians. The proposed changes will definitely help raise safety of all users.

Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane, Waimairi Road Intersection

Spokes:

- Supports removing slip lane to Waimairi Road which will make this intersection safer.
- Supports removing the angle parking on Waimairi Road. The parking is not used a lot now
 because as it is too hard for drivers to back out safely. However, those cycling here will need to
 be very careful they are not doored. Ideally the cycle lane should be separated and on the
 inside of the parking.
- The South lane on Riccarton Road just before the intersection turning into Hansens Lane needs a
 painted bike lane and a stop box ahead of the straight / left turn lane to stop vehicles squeezing
 out bikes by creating a third left turn lane. The short 2M line marked at the intersection gives
 them permission to do this but it is dangerous for cyclists.
- Green cycle paint should continue across all safer speed platforms.
- On the North side of Riccarton Road in front of the bus lane/stop there should bicycle lanes.
- Sharrows should be added to Riccarton Road on both sides and on Waimairi going South if there
 is no space for cycle lanes.

Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road Intersection

Spokes:

 Supports the partial cul-de-sac on Main South Road. This change will make the intersection a lot safer by removing conflicting traffic.

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Submission ID: 13187

- Supports the left turn from Riccarton Road to Main South Road, the narrowness will encourage low speeds. Yaldhurst Road should also flow better, both North and South.
- Supports the pedestrian crossings on safer speed platform both Main South Road and Yaldhurst
 Road. This will provide a nice flow for both pedestrians and cyclists to get to the shops. Spokes
 strongly recommends that these two crossings become combined cyclist/pedestrian crossings.
 There is a good route for less confident cyclists going North/South to use Ballantyne Ave, the
 shared path on Main South Road to the crossing, then across Yaldhurst Road to Brake Street on
 a shared path, then to Bowen Street to Waimairi Road (maybe shopping on the way). This
 avoids the two intersections.
- Even confident cyclists find the sections of Yaldhurst Road unsafe from Peer Street to Brake
 Street where car doors are a problem (particularly going South), and the bus stops on Riccarton
 Road on the North side. They often come from Peer St or Waimairi Road, down Bowen St, into
 Angela St, cross over Yaldhurst Road, cut through the church property, then cross Main South
 Road to get on to the new cycleways to get back to Hansons Lane to go where they need. It will
 be interesting if confident cyclists will move to using the new crossing or continue to use Angela
 St which has less traffic and is more suitable for faster commuting.
- Recommends the brick surface of the medium strip be replaced with appropriate native vegetation otherwise you will get pedestrians and cyclists crossing at multiple points. It also provides better water retention.
- Angela Street also needs a refuge crossing as there are a lot of pedestrians and cyclists crossing
 here. There will now be more traffic going south east down Yaldhurst Road making it harder to
 cross (including those going to the church or Growers Market)
- Supports the speed hump on Brake St
- The pedestrian refuge outside Woolworths (Countdown) needs a tidy up for pedestrians and it is difficult to use with a bike. It is unclear if this is happening as part of this project.

Curletts Road and Main South Road Intersection

Spokes:

- Supports the closing the slip lane to Curletts Road. It will mean losing a tree as the current corner is too sharp
- Do you need three lanes given significantly less traffic will go straight through? You could have a
 left lane / straight through and a right arrow lane, giving left turning trucks more room to turn
 and making the cycle lane on Curletts Road a bit safer.
- Provide a shared path for cyclists or a cyclists slip lane to Curletts Road by reusing some of the current vehicle slip lane.

Waimairi Road Crossing

Spokes:

- Supports the signalled controlled pedestrian / cycle crossing with a safer speed platform on Waimairi. It should be clearly signed a dual crossing.
- Supports the on-road cycle lanes between Leslie and Bowen Street (and would like them to continue to the university halls).
- Supports the green treatment across the Bush Inn entrance and Leslie Street.

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Submission ID: 13187

- A lot of older people use the Orbiter bus to shop at Bush Inn and they are often not very mobile.
 Some are pulling a shopping cart or are using walking frames. The Leslie Street refuge is poorly aligned, has rough surfaces and is grey on grey which makes it very difficult to navigate if you have poor sight. It needs to be upgraded to a raised platform as the current crossing is not adequate for their needs. A lot of vehicles use Leslie Street and they are looking right or left to pull out rather than for pedestrians or cyclists.
- Additional hooped bike parking would be appreciated near the shops. The current bike parking
 is old, difficult to lock you bike to, and does not fit bikes with wider tyres.

SH73 Yaldhurst Road / Peer Street

Spokes:

Supports the raised safety platforms on Yaldhurst Road and Peer Street. It is a pity however that
Waka Kotahi did not consult on this intersection as there is no cycle or pedestrian upgrades
proposed and some small changes would make a big difference to safety. Council staff are
much better at designing for all modes at intersections and should discuss a better design with
Waka Kotahi given their aim is to provide a safer crossing space for pedestrians and cyclists.

I would like the opportunity to present to the Community Board on this submission and I am happy to discuss or clarify any issues that arise.

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

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

Long Text

The Yaldhurst Road/Riccarton Road/Main South Road intersection is a very busy intersection in both directions with thousands of vehicle movements each year (approximately 35,000). Having the separate lanes to turn into Riccarton Road (i.e. one at a time) is a very safe way to manoeuvre through this busy intersection as drivers (of cars, buses, scooters and bikes) only have to monitor traffic from one direction at a time.

The council have refused to give us any statistics about the cause/injuries for the 81 accidents at this intersection over the last ten years: what types of accident, cause of accidents, how many people injured, how serious where the injuries, how many fatalities. Providing this information/data would give us a clearer picture of what is actually causing the accidents. This proposed 'solution' seems to be penalising most responsible drivers for the sake of the few that don't stop at the stop sign. The preschool has been open for over 4 years and in that time the accidents we have witnessed have been caused by drivers not stopping at the stop sign when approaching from the Main South Road and trying to turn onto Riccarton/Yaldhurst Road. Surely this is a good reason for more monitoring of this corner, rather than stopping traffic from turning onto Riccarton Road.

I have noticed that Driver (Buses, cars, trucks, buses, scooters and bikes) are generally happy to be in a queue of traffic if the traffic is moving (regardless of how slow). Slowing down the traffic flow here is going to increase driver frustration which can lead to drivers taking unnecessary risks and causing more accidents not less

This section of road is already congested and this proposal will just push the congestion further back down Riccarton Road, Yaldhurst Road, Main South Road and Curletts Road/Peer Street. This creates more safety hazards as there is another early childhood centre, and primary school on Main South Road which have young children entering and leaving. There is also a secondary school and a community library in Main South Road as well and the congestion caused by these changes will negatively affect the flow of traffic (car, bus, scooter, bike, pedestrian) to/from these venues. Funerals are often held at the funeral home in Main South Road and people are entering /exiting this driveway throughout the day. The increased congestion is going to negatively impact drivers of all types, most of whom are already distressed due to bereavement.

Our preschool has approximately 100 vehicle movements in and out of our driveway from both directions (east and west on Main South Road) every day. Most of our parents are new immigrants into the city/country and are learning to manoeuvre our streets, which is challenging. We need to support our newest citizens by ensuring they can get the places they need to go as easily as possible. Our preschool picks up and delivers home up to 25 children throughout the day. This van service is an important practical way we support our immigrant families. The preschool van has 4 van runs in the morning and up to 8 van runs in the afternoon, many of which head east on Main South Road to get onto Riccarton Road to get to other parts of the city, where the driver needs to go. The proposed changes would negatively impact the van as we would not have enough time in the day to pick up/deliver all the children that parents require us to. This could in turn cause children to move to other preschools with easier access, which has huge negative financial and social implications for our preschool, whose heart is to serve the children and families in our community, who come from all parts of the globe. Our preschool sits in the most multi-cultural corner of our city

The wider brick platform on Riccarton Rd between Hasons Lane and Waimairi Rd unnecessarily narrows the road and leaves less room to maneuver when first responders need access through traffic.

It is also a waste of ratepayers money to widen this platform when the council is in such financial strife and there is already a lane divider/platform there.

The new short narrow raised brick platform on Hansons Lane's also has no real purpose and is a waste of ratepayers money.

The small new raised brick platform on Waimairi Rd intersection with Ricc Rd also serves no purpose than to waste ratenages money

I don't agree with removing the slipway from Riccarton Rd to Waimari Rd because it will cause traffic to back up on Riccarton Rd in the short space between Hansons Lane and Waimari Rd. This will cause more driver frustration and bad decision making as traffic from Hansons Lane will spill out onto Riccarton Rd. in an effort to 'make the light' and block traffic going straight through on Riccarton Rd. This already happens at the Wharenui, Riccarton, Clyde Rd intersection which is very similar in configuration, except it doesn't have a slipway. The slipway allows more traffic traveling north from Wharenui to Clyde Rd to pass through the intersection on a single light, It also allows traffic from Riccarton road wanting to turn left onto Waimairi to pass through the tiny bit of road between Hanson's Lane and Waimairi Rd keeping it free for those traveling north from Hanson's Lane when the light changes. Removing the slipway will succeed in blocking traffic flow but does not make the intersection safer. This is why I do not agree with it's removal.

Small new raised brick platform on Riccarton Rd, east of Waimairi Rd serves no real purpose but to get in the way of buses and trucks turning left from Waimairi Rd to Riccarton Rd which is a tight turn for those vehicles already and have to use both lanes on Riccarton Rd in order to make the turn.

I have never witnessed a crash at this site but I have seen bad driving here and all over Christchurch. No matter how much you change the intersection and slow drivers down you will not change bad decision making of drivers which is often caused by driver frustration and wanting to make the light. Helping the flow of traffic will ease the frustration of drivers and hopefully help in decision making.

I am not for removing the slipway as stated above it will slow traffic flow which will cause more driver frustration and bad decisions which will make it less safe for all road users.

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I am strongly against this redesign which affects other intersections and comes with a huge price tag without first

If this goes ahead... the raised brick platforms on south side of Riccarton Rd near Countdown nudging people to use Yaldhurst Rd are unnecessary and could cause confusion and last minute decision making by drivers wanting to go west onto Main South Rd and therefore pedestrians could be confused as to the direction the driver is going and step out in front of the driver

(I've noticed pedestrians often fail to walk the few extra feet to a proper crossing and tend to cross the road wherever they are)

A longer right hand turn lane from Riccarton Rd to Hansons Lane is needed due to the now combined increased traffic along Yaldhurst Rd into Riccarton Rd, wanting to turn right to Hansons lane. Without a longer right hand turn lane the intersection will become clogged, cars will be on road longer as flow of traffic hampered, driver frustration rises, and more bad decisions are made. Plus, difficulty for emergency vehicles to find a way through.

The raised brick platform along Riccarton Rd does not need to be so wide and can easily accommodate a longer

> These changes will create a series of serious bottlenecks for the morning commute; Firstly in Curletts Rd between Main 5th and Yaldhurst as a greatly increased city-bound flow tries to squeeze into an obviously inadequate right turning lane into Yaldhurst. This can be choked up even now, with buses having to push their way in. Secondly, Yaldhurst Rd itself will be completely paralysed as there is only a single lane between Curletts and Church Corner. At peak time even now, traffic is backed up right down the road past Curletts. This should have been seen as an obvious effect to the proposal. Thirdly, this bottleneck at Curletts/Yaldhurst will exacerbate the already-unsafe situation for southbound traffic on Curletts attempting to turn right down Yaldhurst. Currently their view is blocked by city-bound buses in the opposing lane also attempting to turn right. This is really dangerous and this proposal will only worsen it. Fourthly, the "enhancements" at Ilam/Riccarton have created huge congestion in the Bush Inn area. This proposal also creates the opportunity to instal a bus lane from Bush Inn through to Ilam Rd. This is currently used as a de-facto bus lane with buses squeezing through when they can.

My suggestions:

Change the lights phasing at Yaldhurst/Curletts so that each of the four entry points has its own phase. This would enhance safety for both pedestrians/students and all turning traffic. Synchronise the northbound Curletts phase to correspond with their phase at Curletts/Yaldhurst.
This then provides the opportunity to create two right turning lanes into Yaldhurst, one of them doubling as the

Remove all parking on Yaldhurst city-bound between Curletts and Church corner with a view to creating an extra lane to link up with the existing two-lanes at Bush Inn. The existing islands at Church Corner would need to be removed and the corner reconstructed to accommodate.

Merge the second lane into a bus lane from the Bush Inn entrance right through to Ilam Rd.

I traverse this route twice daily by bus and see this congestion first hand.

Our 8 room counselling approximately 29 Yaldhurst Road, on the corner of Yaldhurst Road and Curletts Road/Peer Street. As a result entry and exit to Petersgate centre is already severely restricted. Our clients must enter Petersgate only when traveling west off Yaldhurst Road but because of the constant congestion and an island, clients are unable to exit off Yaldhurst Road. Clients must exit out of our carpark left into Curletts Road. Again because of constant traffic, and an island in the center, clients can not turn right into Curletts Road. As clients drive to Petersgate from all over Christchurch, if, after counselling, they need to travel to east or north Christchurch to go home they currently turn left off Curletts Road into Main South Road and then onto Riccarton Road. Under this proposed new roading plan only allowing west bound traffic from Riccarton Road into Main South Road and blocking west bound traffic from traveling west from Riccarton Road to Main South Road and then right into Yaldhurst Road. Again under this plan that blocks left turning from Main South Road and then orthocurletts Road this would again not be possible. 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

Any pedestrians attempting to negotiate crossing Riccarton Road between the Woolworths car park exit and the bus stop on the northern side of the roadway do so at times at their own peril Traffic traveling east along Yaldhurst Road swing around the corner into Riccarton Road quite often having to pass a bus or two (stopped to take on or let passengers off) therefore blocking a clear vision of pedestrians crossing the road on that northside section. Currently walking from the north to the south side of Riccarton Road by the bus stop can and does cause issues for some because of the speed of traffic (who quite often have to stop for the red lights at the Hansen Lane intersection anyway) when they finally pluck up the courage to make their way to the safe median in the middle of the road. If you anticipate that people will use the appropriate and the proposed new pedestrian crossings - get a life! If we want to catch a bus on the other side of the road a lot of us will not be prepared to walk an extra half block and wait for a road crossing signal. The removal of the left turning from Main South Road to Yaldhurst Road will certainly help the flow of traffic for some and will remove that signal "right turning vehicles to indicate" on the median in Riccarton Road. It has always been an entertaining exercise counting the number of drivers (cars/vans/trucks etc) who currently turn right but NEVER indicate. With the Curletts/Yaldhurst/Peel intersection PLEASE get the traffic lights adjusted to cope efficiently with traffic flows. Church Corner Safety Improvements Submission

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Summary

UC CAC supports the changes proposed as a starting point, excepting the parallel parks on Waimairi Road. UC CAC also points out the context of the climate crisis, and car dependency and its negative effects, such as pollution, cost of living, and death (section 1). Therefore, UC CAC suggests that instead of undertaking these safety improvements CCC simply closes Church Corner to unauthorised cars, allowing only public and active transport instead (para. 2.2). If this is not workable, UC CAC suggests specific alternatives to CCC's proposed changes, which are largely focused on increasing safety and enabling active and public transport, with reference to the climate crisis and car dependency. These alternatives are detailed in section 2.

1 Introduction & Background

- 1.1 UC CAC represents the staff, students, and alumni of the University of Canterbury who hold in common a concern for people and planet in the face of the climate crisis.
- 1.2 UC CAC is pleased to have the opportunity to submit on the safety improvements project for Church Corner. This submission consists of the introduction (section 1), in which we discuss the broader context for safety in the climate crisis (para.s 1.3 1.7) and in general (para.s 1.8 1.19), our responses to the proposed changes (section 2), and our conclusion (section 3). References are footnoted and provided in bibliography list form (section 4).
- 1.3 UC CAC acknowledges that we are in a climate emergency, which <u>Christchurch City Council (CCC) declared in 2019</u>. This emergency has resulted in disasters worldwide, which have displaced, injured, and killed thousands. One of these disasters was the Auckland Anniversary Floods, which killed four people. Immediately following this disaster was Cyclone Gabrielle, which killed a further 11. Both of these disasters caused immense damage to the people, cities, towns, and infrastructure of Aotearoa New

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Zealand ("Ao/NZ"). Sea level rise threatens Ōtautahi's coastal areas, such as Banks Peninsula and New Brighton. These problems will only worsen as the climate crisis continues.

- 1.4 UC CAC notes that the scientific consensus on the climate emergency attributes the climate crisis in large part to greenhouse gas emissions caused by human activity.⁸ UC CAC takes the position that the increasing scale of climate-related disasters around the world should be prevented. Therefore, UC CAC recommends that all bodies reach negative emissions as soon as possible to limit the extent of the climate crisis.
- 1.5 We know that most readers are aware of these facts. They are included to illustrate the urgency, scale, and severity of the climate crisis; to underscore the need for immediate climate action; and to demonstrate the significant risk to safety in Aotearoa New Zealand posed by climate change. At this stage, the climate crisis must be a factor in every decision made by bodies such as CCC.
- 1.6 In Ōtautahi Christchurch, a significant source of emissions is land transport.⁹ Therefore, to achieve net negative emissions, CCC must do everything it can to curtail land transport emissions (which are Ao/NZ's fastest-growing emissions sector¹⁰). There are two principal ways to reduce these "enabled emissions" (the "enabling" is by the transport system). One is to encourage zero-emissions transport, such as active transport and busses. The other is to reduce encouragement of transport by cars, SUVs, and utes (collectively "cars").¹¹ This is a significant step that CCC can take for the safety of its residents, as the climate crisis is a significant safety risk, as above (in para. 1.5).

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- 1.7 One major encouragement for high-emissions transport modes such as cars is the phenomenon of "induced demand", in which the existence of infrastructure for cars causes more people to use cars for transport.¹² In other words: infrastructure for cars always fills to its capacity for congestion. It is thus inappropriate to frame safety projects as "increasing" congestion unless they increase the number of cars on the road: infrastructure itself cannot "increase" congestion. The induced demand phenomenon is therefore a major factor in ever-increasing transport emissions. This means that there is little point in considering whether changes increase or decrease congestion, so this should not be a factor in infrastructure decision-making.
- 1.8 Conversely, the induced demand phenomenon applied to active and public transport infrastructure, can play a significant role in decreasing transport emissions by encouraging zero-emissions transport. Therefore, to increase safety outcomes relating to climate change, CCC must induce demand for active and public transport.
- 1.9 The current transport situation in Ao/NZ and Ōtautahi Christchurch can be described as "car-centric", or "car dependent": transport infrastructure heavily incentivises travel by cars, with all its concomitant climate effects detailed above (in para.s 1.3 1.6). But there are further negative effects to car dependence beyond climate destruction.
- 1.10 Car dependence forces commuters to pay not only for car maintenance (including repairs, registration, road user charges, insurance, and regular replacement), but also for petrol, which is consistently noted as a major part of the cost of living crisis in Ao/NZ.¹³
- 1.11 Cars are also a major cause of pollution in Ao/NZ, which causes negative health outcomes for thousands of people every year, putting strain on the health system and decreasing quality of life for everybody exposed to pollutants, which are more common in urban areas such as Ōtautahi Christchurch.¹⁴ This is a negative safety outcome.

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- The most confronting of the consequences of car-centrism, however, is the "road toll".15 This is the price that Ao/NZ pays in lives for its car-dependence. At the time of writing, there have been 284 deaths on the roads in Aotearoa New Zealand in 2023. In 2022, there were 373, and 318 in 2021. 16 The number of injuries is even higher. 17 UC CAC takes the moral position that even one death or injury caused by car crashes is too many deaths or injuries caused by car crashes, and that every government body should do everything in its power to reduce these numbers.
- In the context of Church Corner, CCC itself has noted the disturbingly high number of car crashes in the area.18
- 1.14 We are pleased to note that CCC has previously installed safe speed platforms in the area and found them to be effective. 19 Therefore, regardless of claims to the contrary, CCC can and should use them to increase safety. However, these should not form the entirety of CCC's safety responses. Safe speed platforms should form the minimum, or basis, of CCC's safety improvement projects.
- We are certain that many readers will be aware of the phenomenon of car dependency, and of the consequences thereof. This overview is included to inform those who are not aware, and to reiterate to the already aware the extent of the harmful effects of car dependency to show the urgency of the need to counteract it.
- 1.16 This submission is written in relation to the various improvements that CCC is proposing to install around Church Corner. We have chosen to submit on these improvements because of their potential to reduce car dependency in Ōtautahi Christchurch, which, as above (in para.s 1.3 - 1.6), has direct bearing on the climate crisis, as well as on the other harmful effects of car dependence.

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- 1.17 Further, many of our members live in the vicinity of, or regularly travel through, the Church Corner area, and it is pursuant to our constitution to represent their interests in this field. Finally, we note that the area is very close to the University of Canterbury campus, on which UC CAC is based. Therefore, we are making this submission.
- 1.18 UC CAC understands this project to have the primary objective of enhancing safety for all road users, including pedestrians, in Church Corner. We have provided the information above (in para.s 1.3 1.11) to situate safety improvements in context. Increasing safety is a worthy goal, which we congratulate CCC for prioritising, but this project exists in a broader context in which the safety of every person in Ōtautahi Christchurch is threatened not only by the prospect of car injuries but also by the climate crisis, air pollution, and the negative health and safety outcomes of car dependency.
- 1.19 We further note that CCC admits (citing NZTA) that intersections are the parts of roads which create the most risk of car crashes, and therefore of injury and death.²⁰ UC CAC considers that, for the safety of Ōtautahi Christchurch residents, the number of intersections that cars can travel through should be kept as low as possible to prevent undue risk of crashing, and therefore that CCC should proactively close intersections to cars in order to uphold safety, including in Church Corner.
- 1.20 We also note that Riccarton Road is scheduled to become a major leg of the Mass Rapid Transit corridor in Ōtautahi Christchurch. To prepare for this change, car traffic on Riccarton Road should be drawn down, beginning as early as possible, so that the transition to a mass rapid transit corridor can be smooth and swift. Therefore, car traffic should be discouraged as much as possible, and locals made familiar with the concept of Riccarton Road as a public transport route, and so as much priority as possible should be given to establishing bus lanes now to avoid disruption in the future.

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2 The Proposals

- 2.1 Our position on these proposals is informed by the principles above. We agree with the safety focus of this project, and are deeply concerned that intersections are the most likely sites for car crashes. We therefore believe that a legitimate option for increasing safety is decreasing the number of intersections, and reducing traffic flow through them to reduce the number of potential vehicle interactions which could cause crashes. As there is an ongoing climate crisis, and car dependency presents significant detriments to society, we do not accept that projects should not have regard for decreasing people's ability to use cars. Rather, we believe that they should have regard for this, and set reducing car dependency as an aim.
- 2.2 UC CAC's recommendation is for the entireties of Riccarton Road, Main South Road, Hansons Lane, Waimairi Road, Curletts Road, and Leslie Street to be closed to all motor vehicles except for buses, open only to public and active transport (as well as, we recognise, certain authorised traffic such as vehicles delivering goods to businesses outside business hours or builders). This is the simplest method to reduce the number of intersection interactions which could result in crashes, thereby being the most successful method to ensure safety at the intersections concerned. It will also decrease the other negative health and safety outcomes we have discussed, such as CCC's climate crisis contributions and pollution. Further, any remaining space unused for public and active transport should be used for trees and green space to make further reductions to CCC's climate crisis and pollution contributions.
- 2.3 We recognise that during implementation of such a plan, there would have to be a grace period for residents to ensure they have non-car travel arrangements. Ultimately, however, reduction of interactions between drivers will ensure a safety outcome of nearly zero car crashes in Church Corner in future. Further, by reducing car traffic, the safety outcome of mitigating the climate crisis will be achieved, and, similarly, by reducing car traffic in this area, the negative health outcomes associated with pollution will be greatly reduced. These are safety outcomes not offered by CCC's current proposals. Therefore, we believe that the loss of convenience for those unwilling to adopt alternate transport arrangements on these roads is far outweighed by the benefits of our proposal, which we also believe would make Riccarton far more vibrant. ²¹

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- 2.4 Because of induced demand, and because Riccarton Road is just one road among many which travels on the east-west axis on the western side of the city, this will not prevent people from reaching their destinations. This solution would also minimise the amount of work on structures that will be removed or remodelled when the Christchurch Mass Rapid Transit Corridor is established.
- 2.5 We understand that CCC is willing to compromise between safety outcomes and traffic flow, so we have provided the following suggestions. Our preferred alternate solution is that all of them are implemented, but even partial implementation is acceptable. Our least preferred supported outcome is that CCC's proposals are implemented unaltered, which we support as it will still have positive outcomes, with the exception of the proposal to install parallel parking on Waimairi Road. We oppose any consideration of implementing less than CCC's current proposals, except for omission of the plan to install parallel parking on Waimairi Road.
- 2.6 We are considering CCC's proposals under the headings provided by CCC on <u>its</u> consultation webpage for this project. These are:
 - The intersection of Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane, and Waimairi Road, discussed in section 2.7.
 - The intersection of Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road, discussed in section 2.8.
 - The intersection of Curletts Road and Main South Road, discussed in section 2.9.
 - The pedestrian crossing on Waimairi Road, discussed in section 2.10.
 - The intersection of Yaldhurst Road SH73 and Peer Street, discussed in section 2.11.
- 2.7 The Riccarton-Hansons-Waimairi Intersection
 - 2.7.1 UC CAC supports the implementation of CCC's changes to the Riccarton-Hansons-Waimairi intersection as written. However, we they are insufficient to meet appropriate climate and road safety goals, so we would prefer the following adjustments are made:
 - 2.7.2 The leftmost of the eastbound lanes on Riccarton Road through this intersection should be made a special purpose bus lane. This will facilitate the use of the expanded bus stops, and have minimal impact on traffic

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patterns (due to the induced demand principle above (in para. 1.7)). As established above (in para. 1.8), the promotion of public transport is a social good, and making it easier for bus traffic to travel will make public transport faster and more convenient. The affected part of Riccarton Road is used by the popular 5, 130, and 140 bus lines. If this recommendation is implemented, we take no position on whether there should be a safe speed platform in the special purpose lane. The cost of this counter-proposal should be minimal: this project already includes painting special purpose lanes, so another should not add significantly to this project's budget. Further, reducing car traffic on a road decreases its wear and tear, reducing the need for expensive repairs and maintenance, and therefore reduces the ratepayer burden relating to that road in the long term.

- 2.7.3 Left-turning traffic into Waimairi Road should be restricted only to bus and cycle traffic, by providing a bicycle lane (either in accordance with CCC's current proposals, or in accordance with our proposal below (in para. 2.3.5)) and converting the northbound lane to a bus lane, similarly to the above recommendation (in para. 2.7.2). Currently, this lane is used by the extremely popular Orbiter service.

 We note that this project addresses the increased risk of car crashes, and therefore injury and death, at intersections. By limiting traffic, this risk can be minimised. The reasons for the above proposal (in para. 2.7.2) apply also to this proposal. This also obviates the need for on-street parking on Waimairi Road, in line with our suggestion below (in para. 2.7.4). This also serves to promote public transport, which has positive safety outcomes for every resident of Ōtautahi Christchurch. This should be a financially expedient solution for the reasons discussed above (in para. 2.7.2).
- 2.7.4 The car parks on Waimairi Road should be removed altogether. UC CAC suggests they could be removed by expanding the footpath into the space currently allotted to parking. Alternately, no stopping lines could be painted. First and foremost, the proposed parallel car parks threaten the safety of cyclists travelling in the painted cycle lane alongside Waimairi Road. This is by exposing them to the risk of "dooring", a common type of cycling injury which is promoted by placing parking alongside bike lanes. These injuries occur when a car door is opened into the path of a cyclist, which is often

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fatal and nearly always injurious.²² CCC must not endorse these injuries by encouraging them, and placing parallel parking alongside a cycle lane encourages dooring injuries. Further, parking increases demand for driving, which is a self-perpetuating cycle. As established earlier, CCC must not encourage driving because of the climate, safety, and other associated risks. Therefore, CCC should not provide parking anywhere, including on Waimairi Road. These suggestions, as they are in line with the works CCC already proposes, should not raise the cost of this project.

- 2.7.5 There should be protected cycleways alongside the brick medians on the Riccarton Road, and on Waimairi Road, similar to that on Cambridge Terrace in Te-Whanganui-i-Tara Wellington if bus lanes are established. These should be unidirectional cycleways on either side of the Riccarton Road median, and a bidirectional cycleway on the southbound side of Waimairi Road, at the expense of a general lane for traffic. If no bus lane is established, there should instead be protected cycle lanes installed on the outsides of these roads (i.e. on the northern side of the eastbound side of Riccarton Road and on the western side of the northbound part of Waimairi). This is to ensure that cyclists can travel safely without disrupting buses or having their safety compromised by travelling among buses, and for the reasons discussed above (in section 1). This could be relatively economically achieved by using affordable protection elements such as plastic bollards.
- 2.7.6 Bicycle sharrows should be painted at regular intervals along all lanes of Riccarton Road, except for in any bus lane established in accordance with the recommendations above (in para. 2.7.3), set well aside from the potential door zone of parked cars where applicable (and considering the proliferation of 1.8m+ wide utes in Ōtautahi Christchurch). This is because there is no bike infrastructure on Riccarton Road in Church Corner, which de facto forces cyclists to take the general lanes as it is. Painting sharrows merely recognises the reality of this situation. To facilitate the use of these sharrows, the 30kmph speed limit on Riccarton Road should be extended through this intersection to reach the Yaldhurst-Riccarton-Main South-Peer intersection (discussed below in section 2.9), or a new, lower, speed limit (such as 10kmph) should be established. This should be relatively economical, as this

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project already involves painting and establishing new signage. UC CAC understands that this is contingent on Waka Kotahi's agreement to allow these sharrows to be placed. However, UC CAC submits that the sharrows should be painted unless Waka Kotahi provides an explicit direction against the sharrows, as safety should be CCC's singular concern.

- 2.7.7 The left turning lane of the northbound lanes of Hansons Lane should be made exclusive to buses by creating a special purpose bus lane. Drivers of cars should have only the option of turning right here to minimise the number of potential accidents in the Church Corner area, and to minimise potential confusion caused by the Woolworths Church Corner carpark exit to drivers on Hansons Lane. CCC has noted that intersections are some of the most risky areas for car accidents. By reducing the number of intersection interactions involving cars, this risk is removed, and safety increased. This should be relatively economical to achieve as this project already involves painting special purpose lanes, so painting more should not add significantly to costs. Any concerns about the franchisees or franchisers of Woolworths Church Corner initiating proceedings for Judicial Review, as supermarkets have done in other cities, should be tempered by the knowledge that these cases are "really hard to win".²³
- 2.7.8 For the reasons discussed above (in para. 2.7.7), right turning from the southward lanes on Waimairi Road should not be available to cars, to limit the potential for collisions and to increase safety for cyclists exiting Waimairi Road. This could be done by painting special purpose lanes for buses and bicycles across that intersection. If needed, bollards or some other measure to ensure that this closure is adhered to should be installed. The cost of this will vary depending on factors such as the necessity of bollards, but should be relatively economical.
- 2.7.9 The leftmost of the westbound lanes of Riccarton Road should be limited to buses. This will promote public transport use, and limit the available lanes for cars, which, for the reasons discussed above (in para.s 1.3 1.12 and 1.15), is necessary for climate and safety outcomes, as it will discourage climate-hostile transport and encourage climate-friendly transport, as well

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as to make it easier for local residents to adapt to the mass rapid transit corridor when it is eventually implemented.

- 2.8 The Main South-Yaldhurst Intersection
 - 2.8.1 We support the implementation of CCC's changes to the Main South-Yaldhurst intersection as written. However, they are insufficient to meet appropriate climate and road safety goals, and would prefer the following adjustments are made:
 - We recommend that Main South Road and Riccarton Road have no motor vehicle connection, bearing in mind that CCC's objective with this project is to increase safety. CCC agrees that the biggest risk of car crashes is at intersections, and this intersection services a very short length of road which is accessible by other routes not going through Church Corner. Therefore, it should simply be closed. The space currently allocated to the lane entering Main South Road from Riccarton Road should instead be used for green space (including trees) and to widen the footpath, including a section to give cyclists the opportunity to travel through Main South Road, and for extending the grassed area. This will make it more pleasant to walk or cycle in this area, and guides cyclists towards the relatively safer bidirectional cycle infrastructure on Main South Road (as opposed to Yaldhurst Road, the design of which forces cyclists into a 60kmph general lane). Pursuant to this, painted cycle sharrows and other cycle infrastructure should be installed to guide cyclists between Riccarton Road and Main South Road. As this project already involves remodelling this area, this should not be significantly more expensive than currently planned.
 - 2.8.3 We support the installation of a zebra crossing and safe speed platforms. We also suggest that, to encourage pedestrian travel by increasing the sense of safety for pedestrians, traffic calming infrastructure is placed on either side of the pedestrian crossing in both lanes, so that pedestrians can both be safer and feel safer, knowing that drivers will be forced by the road infrastructure to slow to safe speeds well in advance of the crossing. This will not only enable pedestrians to freely access the bus stop on Church Corner, but it will also further encourage walking in and of itself.

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2.9 The Curletts-Main South Intersection

- 2.9.1 We the implementation of CCC's changes to the Curletts-Main South intersection as written. However, they are insufficient to meet appropriate climate and road safety goals, and would prefer the following adjustments are made:
- 2.9.2 We note that there are still a great many lanes in the Curletts Road-Main South Road intersection. Pedestrians can cross up to six lanes to get across this intersection, or double that if they need to cross diagonally. This contributes to decreasing both perceived and actual safety by maximising the amount of time that pedestrians spend on a non-grade separated surface exposed to car traffic. Therefore, we recommend that safe speed platforms are installed on all approaches to this intersection for pedestrian safety, real and perceived. An increase in perceived pedestrian safety will encourage more people to travel as pedestrians, which is a form of active transport, which, as above (section 1), should be promoted. UC CAC also suggests the number of car lanes for pedestrians and cyclists to cross is reduced, by reducing the southbound lanes on Curletts Road to one south of this intersection and removing the middle, southbound, lane from the northern approach. Drivers will still have access to a lane for southbound travel, but pedestrians and cyclists will be able to cross much more safely and easily. We also suggest that the number of northbound lanes on Curletts Road south of this intersection is reduced to one by combining the left turning and straight travelling lanes. This could also increase cycle safety by providing more space for the currently existing cycle lane.
- 2.9.3 We support the removal of the slip lane from Main South Road on safety grounds, but are disappointed by the removal of a tree. To maintain the positive outcomes of tree cover (protection from pollution, nominal climate change mitigation, pleasant environment), we recommend that instead of providing a left turn lane going northeast, this is combined with the straight traffic lane going northeast and the grassed area is extended into the putative left turn lane and trees planted in the extended area.
- 2.10 The Waimairi Road Crossing

Church Corner Safety Improvements Submission

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- 2.10.1 We support the implementation of CCC's changes to the Waimairi Road crossing as written. However, they are insufficient to meet appropriate climate and road safety goals, so we would prefer the following adjustments are made:
- 2.10.2 As above (para.s 2.7.3 and 2.7.5), we recommend bus lanes and cycleways are built on Waimairi Road to maximise safety for road users.
- 2.10.3 We recommend that the bus stop on the southbound lane of Waimairi Road is made an in-lane stop, to promote public transport use and prevent public transport from being illegally stopped by drivers refusing to yield. UC CAC also recommends this so that a cycle lane diversion can go around the bus stop and into Bush Inn, making it safer for cyclists to enter Bush Inn by avoiding many complex road interactions. The merits of promoting active and public transport have already been discussed above (in section 1).
- 2.10.4 We recommend that the signalised pedestrian crossing is always green for pedestrians, and that cars and bikes should get green lights by triggering car and bike detectors on Waimairi Road. This will give pedestrians confidence that they will be able to cross, thereby promoting active transport, and reducing the risk that drivers will not comply with orange and red lights as they often do on Waimairi Road.²⁴
- 2.11 The Yaldhurst-Peer Intersection
 - 2.11.1 We support the implementation of CCC's changes to the Yaldhurst-Peer intersection as written. However, they are insufficient to meet appropriate climate and road safety goals, and would prefer the following adjustment is made:
 - 2.11.2 UC CAC suggests that, for the reasons discussed above (in section 1), one of the westbound lanes on Yaldhurst Road, approaching the Yaldhurst Road-Peer Street intersection, is replaced by a special purpose bus lane. The cost

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of this should be relatively low as much painting is already involved in this project.

- 2.12 Our General Recommendations
 - 2.12.1 We propose these changes to the plan for the Church Corner area in its entirety:
 - 2.12.2 We note the omission in CCC's proposals of a vital measure for increasing safety outcomes: speed limits. CCC wishes to increase safety in the affected area, but it is not proposing to use the lever of speed limits to achieve that outcome. Given that the likelihood, relative safety of, and destruction caused by, a crash are all determined by the speed of involved cars, CCC must look into using speed limits and traffic calming to reduce the speed of traffic in a high-risk area. Therefore, we suggest that lanes should be reduced to a maximum of 1.9 metres of width, that physical traffic calming measures are installed all along the affected area, and that speed limits from 10 to 30 km/h are considered and implemented.
 - 2.12.3 We have already (in section 1) discussed the importance of promoting active and public transport. Therefore, we suggest that as much road as possible is used for special purpose lanes (bus and cycle lanes) to promote the positive outcomes of public and active transport.

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3 Conclusion

- 3.1 To conclude, UC CAC would remind CCC and the elected councillors of their moral obligation to uphold the health and safety of every resident of Ōtautahi Christchurch, which necessarily requires considering the dangerous and harmful effects not only of climate change, but also of car dependency. Given the context of the climate crisis, car dependency, and the over 100 crashes in the last decade in the affected area, ²⁵ these proposals are the bare minimum that CCC should implement. These changes should not be watered down or reduced. Rather, a much more extensive program, in line with our suggestions, should be implemented instead. This would indicate CCC's willingness to boldly face the climate crisis and car dependency, as young people expect nothing less than total protection for their futures, and UC CAC exists to express that expectation, to CCC and other bodies. All residents of Ōtautahi Christchurch are entitled to expect from CCC protection from car accidents, pollution, the climate crisis, and all other negative effects of car, including those who submit against projects such as this.
- 3.2 UC CAC would like to continue to be involved in any further stages of consultation for this project, including by presenting to hearings panels. > However, there is not enough done to make this a safe intersection for cyclists beyond minor tweaks. Removing the angle parking and adding some green paint will help, but it doesn't overcome the inherent unsafe nature of this intersection for cyclists. For example, turning right from Riccarton Road into Waimairi involves moving across two lanes of traffic into the turning lane, and then turning across two lanes of traffic, without the option of a safer hook turn (similar for turning right into Hansens Lane). The proposed design doesn't even have any green paint on at the mid-block stopping points, meaning there is nowhere to stop safely if you have to stop in that section of the road. And the 2.5 lanes for the straight/left turn into Hansens Lane is also unsafe

> This design would be significantly improved with the continuation of the shared path along the south side of Riccarton Road. There is currently a shared path connection from Main South Road when the South Express turns down Ballantyne Avenue until just outside the Countdown carpark. At this point the path just ends, meaning cyclists traveling from the South Express (something I do regularly!) have nowhere to go! Instead, the existing footpath should be widened to accommodate a shared path past the bus stop, crossing Hansens Lane to continue past the cafe, then turning left onto the east side of Waimairi Road and continuing to the new signal controlled intersection. If the new pedestrian crossing on Yaldhurst was modified to be a shared crossing, then this would provide a much improved safer option for cyclists to move around the area.

I have attached a basic image showing in green where the shared path should extend as I've described. I've also added arrows to show the right turns which would be much safer for cyclists if this shared path was in place. (Left turns would also be nicer, but they're easier to do normally)

I am like most motorist that is getting sick of tired of intersections that are being revamped with raised speed platforms and speed bumps. We hear the same old crap that we have to make it safe for pedestrians and cyclist.

I have no idea what the council is try to achieve by placing speed bumps just a few metres form an intersection or in front of pedestrian safety islands such as those that are placed on Worcester St. I live between the two of them and I can you that there is no justification of having them. I see very few people actually walking along Worcester St.

Why is necessary to have a safe speed platform at the Waimairi road crossing when you have a set of traffic lights? I personally believe that it total waste of time and money.

We have seen this at number of areas around Christchurch where the council has put in separate cycle lanes, then find out that they also have a shared footpath. Looking at Curletts rd and Main south road intersection this is also the case.

Bridge St and Estuary Rd. Once again raised platform as you enter the roundabout. What I don't understand why is it that Travis/Bower intersection has speed bumps both entering and exiting while Bridge St / Estuary only has speed bumps entering this intersection. This doesn't make any sense to me.

As you can see that I am totally opposed to raised speed platforms and speed bumps. My observation while sitting at traffic lights that the problem is not speed but people driving through the intersection on a red light. On a number of times I had to wait while having a green light for the intersection is clear. I also seen a number of pedestrians walk across the intersection forcing drivers to stop while they walk in front of the vehicle.

Another word that is thrown around is safety. How safe is for cyclist travelling along St Asaph St when their view is blocked vehicles even driver have to be careful when exiting the vehicle or finding trucks and buses cannot stay in their own lane. Bus lane along Moorhouse Ave. If you don't let them in the driver will push their way in and force you into another lane, then there's Lincoln Rd how safe do you think it is safe for cyclist to share the same piece of road as buses.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit feedback on the Church Corner safety improvements.

I commute through the Church Corner intersection a few times a week. This is often as a cyclist to do my shopping or as a bus passenger passing through or connecting to another bus.

I find this intersection (and Yaldhurst/Riccarton Road) is unsafefor cycling and consequently I very rarely travel through here. I often go along the new cycle route on Main South Road, Ballentyne Ave and Suva Street, even though I know this will take me longer. In particular, it is difficult to cycle down Yaldhurst road down the narrow streets and to turn Right onto Hansons Lane, or go straight through to the Bush Inn. I usually avoid the intersection if I am going home and go along Peer Street or Main South Road as a safer, but less direct alternative to Yaldhurst Road.

I am pleased to see that Christchurch City Council are considering the following safety improvements to this Intersection in particular:

The additional cycle lanes along Waimairi Road - I believe this fits and how it works in conjunction with the new crossing at the Athol Terrace/Waimairi crossing.

The Waimairi Road crossing - to increase safety and accessibility between the shopping centres. Furthermore, the number of pedestrians crossing at the Waimairi Road and Riccarton Road intersection will reduce, alleviating congestion at the intersection.

The Raised platforms at each intersection and reduced speed limits – to increase safety by slowing traffic.

Removal the right turning lane at Main South Road and Riccarton Road – to simplify the intersection and eliminate the crashes here.

I still have the following concerns:

On road cycle lanes marked between the Waimairi Road and Hansons Lane intersections - Having this will help encourage cyclists to move through this intersection more easily and safely.

Cycle lanes entering and exiting the intersection from Yaldhurst Road — While there is good connectivity to cycle lanes at Main South Road, There is not good connectivity to Yaldhurst Road. There is no cycle lane exiting onto Yaldhurst Road. While there is a cycle lane entering from Yaldhurst Road, it does not connect all the way through to Peer Street.


Overall, I commend the plan for improving cyclist safety. But the nature of this intersection means that it is hard to connect the cycle network while it being separate from the road. This means I will still have to weave past cars to turn right from Yaldhurst Road into Hansons Lane and have to cycle beside cars along Yaldhurst Road. For that reason, I still feel the intersection remains slightly unsafe for cyclists.

The main change I would like is for a cycle lane to be added on the south side of Riccarton Road and Yaldhurst Road. The proposed changes will not make it any better but it looks like there is plenty of space (diagonal shoulder markings and very wide raised median) for this to be added.

In general, I think that more road space should be reallocated to provide safe cycle infrastructure. 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

Church corner safety improvements

I support the following parts of the proposal which I think will make the area safer for all road users:

- Safe speed platforms added to intersection approaches
- Cycle lanes added on Waimairi Road and the one on the north side of Yaldhurst/Riccarton Road
- Removing the slip lane from Riccarton Road into Waimairi Road is a great safety improvement for pedestrians
- Replacing the angled parking on Waimairi Road with parallel parking
- Signalised pedestrian crossing added on Waimairi Road including raised platform to slow vehicles down
- Pedestrian crossings added on Yaldhurst Road and Main South Road including raised platforms
 to slow vehicles down. This will make accessing the Church corner shops from the cycleway on
 Main South Road/Ballantyne Avenue much easier which is a route I take quite frequently and
 currently involves an awkward unsafe merge left after turning right from Main South Road into
 Riccarton Road.
- Closing Main South Road exit to Riccarton/Yaldhurst to simplify the road design
- Removing the slip lane from Main South Road into Curletts Road and replacing it with a left turn lane at the lights.
- Riccarton Road bus stop improvements

The main change I would like is for a cycle lane to be added on the south side of Riccarton Road and Yaldhurst Road. I use this road frequently to get to the fruit and vegetable shop on Yaldhurst road and it is currently a very unsafe design for cycling on. As described below in point 3, it looks like there is plenty of space for this to be added.

The other main change I would like is for the **side street speed humps to be closer to the intersection and integrated with raised continuous footpaths** as described below in point 8. This would do much more to slow high-speed cars as they turn into the side streets and make it better for pedestrians crossing these streets.

In general, I think that more road space should be reallocated to provide safe cycle infrastructure. Some sections still have 100% of the road width (kerb to kerb) dedicated to vehicle lanes which is pretty bad. There is a cycleway only a few hundred metres south of the Riccarton/Hansons intersection but the link from there to the many shops/services north of Riccarton Road (both Church corner and Bush Inn) is still not very good. There are grocery shops, restaurants, doctors, gym, bank and many more in this area so it makes sense to have a strong link from the cycleway. This also applies to the cycleway which goes through UC which should have a safe link to Woolworths on the south side of Riccarton Road.

The following are some suggestions to improve the design for pedestrians and cyclists:

At the Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road intersection there are three vehicle
approach lanes and two exit lanes on Riccarton Road and zero cycle lanes, there are only some
cycle advance stop boxes which do not really help cyclists much at all. The road width is limited
but 100% is devoted to vehicles at these sections, that is 5 lanes for vehicles and zero cycle

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lane. Please consider narrowing the lanes, reducing the size of traffic islands, or even removing a vehicle lane to fit cycle lanes in at all intersection approaches as intersections are where the most accidents occur.

2. The westbound part of Riccarton Road, between Hansons and Waimairi, has awkward lane markings, with what seems like one and a half lanes marked for mixed straight/left turning traffic. This is the same as what is there currently. I suggest changing this to a normal sized lane and adding a marked cycle lane between that lane and the kerb as indicated in picture. The traffic island here is very wide, so it could be reduced in size to gain some more road space to allow a cycle lane on the other side (eastbound) too.




3. The very wide raised median (wasted space on a narrow right of way) on Riccarton and Yaldhurst could be narrowed to make space for a west bound cycle lane. There is already some extra space there marked as diagonal shoulder markings, so a cycle lane should definitely be able to be added here.

- 4. The new cycle lane on the north side of Yaldhurst/Riccarton Road from Brake Street to the bus stop is good, but it should continue past the bus stop all the way to the traffic lights. At the very least the left most lane should be marked as shared bike/traffic lane, as having a cycle lane disappear just before a very busy intersection (3 vehicle lanes) seems like a very bad design.
- 5. At least one pedestrian crossing leg should be added out of the two missing legs at Riccarton/Hansons and Riccarton/Waimairi as shown in picture. Even though the two intersections are close together, these missing peg legs mean that certain trips require crossing the road twice when it really should only be once. We should not be re-building intersections with missing pedestrian legs as it is very hostile to pedestrians.

6. There is also a missing pedestrian leg at the Curletts Road/Main South Road intersection. This means that certain walking trips will require two extra crosses of the road e.g. someone walking from a house on the west side of Curletts Road to New World Ilam will need to cross the road four times instead of twice (or three times instead of one time if their destination is say a friend's house on the south side of Yaldhurst Rd). This is a very bad design for pedestrians so the missing pedestrian leg should be added to the design.



7. There is a cycle hook turn box marked on Riccarton Road that looks like it is for cyclists turning right from Hansons into Riccarton, but this is not useful since that is a free right turn as it is a T-intersection. What is needed is something to assists cyclists turning right from Riccarton into Hansons Lane. This is a troublesome manoeuvre to make currently, and the proposal makes little improvement to it. Advance cycle stop boxes do basically nothing to make this easier or safer for cyclists.



8. Regarding the speed humps on side streets - I think the largest problem here is cars turning too quickly into the side streets (rather than turning out) so positioning the speed humps closer to the intersection would do more to help slow these cars. This could be done with raised continuous footpaths as some other side street crossings in Christchurch have. Leslie St only has a speed bump on the exit side, one should be added on the entry side of the road as well to slow cars which are entering from Waimairi Road.

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

I go in and out of the Bush Inn car park at least once every day, and have done for over 8 years, so my observation of behaviour is of at least 2500 daily visits. The greatest risk of pedestrians being hit by a car (and I've seen a number of close calls in this time) arises in the location of the Bush Inn carpark exit into Waimairi Rd. At that point pedestrians visiting the shops/ bank/ cafes and especially the Blood service bounded by Leslie St, Waimairi Rd and Riccarton Rd very regularly choose to jaywalk across Waimairi Rd in either direction to access the Bush Inn and its carpark. They can be hit by cars from 4 different directions, both sides of Waimairi Rd, right turners from Leslie St and right turners from the Bush Inn carpark. It is really challenging for drivers to deal with this behaviour on top of the challenges of the traffic volume and the multiple directions of vehicle travel in this area. There is already a safety barrier crossing on Waimairi Rd where you propose to put in traffic lights, and a controlled traffic light crossing at the Riccarton Rd intersection, both basically equidistant from where the current risk area is. Pedestrians by the dozen every single day totally ignore using both these options and instead take their life in their hands to jaywalk straight across the road. If you don't put a physical wire barrier on the footpath on both sides of Waimairi Rd for a distance of c.20 metres you will not remove this area of risk. In my view the new traffic light controlled pedestrian crossing instead of the existing safety island is a waste of money without this additional physical barrier to stop the current recurring unsafe pedestrian behaviour.

The presentation of changes made, which for vehicles is primarily the slip lane removal for left turning from Main South Rd into Curletts Rd, has one fundamental factual error, and a justification for accident reduction that has been confused by that error. And neither of these statements in the presentation appears to justify at all the removal of the slip lane.

The factual error is the statement that the changes will "mean more people turning at the Curletts Rd and Main South Rd intersection , to access Riccarton Rd". Clearly this is nonsense/ makes no sense, because at present most of the traffic that enter Riccarton Rd from this direction do so to enable them to travel directly down Riccarton Rd to destinations at Church Corner and beyond. This option is no longer going to be available to them, so you will have much less not more people accessing Riccarton Rd once the changes to the Church Corner end are made . Noting this error I accept that this change should also reduce the accident count at this intersection because of the reduction of volume of cars that would previously have turned right off Curletts Rd into Riccarton Rd in particular. But I note this has nothing to do with the elimination of the slip lane off Main South Rd and the presentation video gives no justification/ explanation for this change.

My critical concern regarding the slip lane removal is the increasing gridlock risk of traffic backup on Main South Rd, and the impact this may have on driving behaviour during peak periods as drivers shortcut to head north towards Burnside/ Bishopdale and beyond. If the slowdown in traffic that the slip lane removal will inevitably cause results in

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	drivers shortcutting to Yaldhurst Rd via either Craven St/ Middlepark Rd or Epsom Rd/ Racecourse Rd or even English St then you can likely expect more poor driver behaviour both on these streets and then accessing Yaldhurst Rd, whichever direction that drivers then take from that point on. I fail to understand why you want to increase the likelihood of drivers using these suburban (and sometimes school) street options for their journey with all the associated additional risks this creates for accidents with resident pedestrians in those streets and then with other vehicles when they access/ use Yaldhurst Rd. Your presentation gives no explanation of why slowing down traffic flow through at such a critical intersection that is left turning is of any benefit to the current accident rate reduction, nor does it address the consequential risk issues above.

If drivers observed road rules and a bit more courtesy, then these major upgrades would not be required. I hate to think of the chaos there will be if these upgrades go ahead. Trying to get through Church Corner into the City on a work day is a nightmare. The changes will also impact on the businesses in the area. I do think the focus for this proposal is off point here and is not really necessary. There are already controlled intersections here there is no need for a pedestrian crossing or any further works on R road. However, Waimari road could really do with a crossing as all the students currently run the gauntlets on the daily to get to uni. A cross walk down this end of the road could be more beneficial.

Putting in raised islands literally has not worked in any city it drives cars away from the shops. Case point examples: Wellington, nelson city and also auckland in some parts (I work in all those cities and the retail sector is dying. I think that improving the footpaths is the number 1 priority here especially given the greater amount of foot and electric scooter traffic. In particular, car traffic coming from Yaldhurst road onto Riccarton road goes from one lane (at proposed pedestrian crossing) to having three lanes at the Hansons road light set. Vehicles are likely to drift into the painted cycle lane on that left bend, near Daphenes making it unsafe for cyclists. This behaviour has been observed and resolved on the lincoln/moorhouse road intersection. If the car lanes at hansons/riccarton road lights are reduced to two lanes coming from the west, the painted cycle lane could be made protected (not just paint), enabling safe cyclist access to bush Inn(requiring a suitable change to the waimari/riccarton road intersection). A protected cycle lane could continue on the north side of riccarton road all the way down to Middleton road connecting to the Norwest cycleway. The proposed pedestrian crossing at Daphenes on Riccarton road could have a cyclist component allowing linking to the Southern express cycleway.

GoBus asked for more detail about various aspects of the project in their submission, which staff have responded to. Their primary concern was the use of safe speed platforms on bus routes.

Of the 292 individuals that submitted:

- 44 live within Upper Riccarton
- 109 live in the surrounding suburbs (Riccarton, Ilam, Addington, Middleton, Hei Hei, Sockburn, Wigram or Hornby)
- 119 live in broader Christchurch
- 20 live outside of Christchurch

Submitters were asked how safe they feel travelling through the intersection now, compared to how safe they think they would feel if the proposed changes were made. The below table outlines how to read the tables in this report.

Feedback on the proposed changes for the Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road intersection

The existing Riccarton Road, Hansons Lane and Waimairi Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 93 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 171 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.

Overall shift in safety perceptions

Overall, there was a decrease in submitters feeling somewhat or very unsafe (31.16%) and an increase in feeling somewhat or very safe (26.71%), as shown in Table 3.

Shift in safety perceptions by method of travel

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by their method of travel, as seen below in Table 4. Most methods of travel mirror overall submitter sentiment with decreases in people feeling unsafe and increases in people feeling safe with the proposed changes. Submitters who drive a car shifted from feeling somewhat unsafe (16.38% decrease) to somewhat safe (14.69% increase). However, car drivers were the only group who showed a notable shift from very safe to less safe. 12 car drivers said they currently feel very safe and the proposed changes would make them feel very unsafe.

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Submitters who use bikes or walk as their main method of travel were more likely to feel safer with the proposed changes than other methods of travel, with a 60% increase in bike users feeling somewhat or very safe and a 63.16% increase in walkers feeling somewhat or very safe.

Shift in safety perceptions by reason for travel

Submitters shift in perception of safety has been broken down by reason for travel, as seen below in Table 5. There were mixed opinions from those who live in the area, some were more likely to feel somewhat safe with the proposed changes (25.64% increase). However, 12 submitters said that they currently feel very safe, but the proposed changes would make them feel very or somewhat unsafe. They provided some rational for this rating within their comments for this section:

- · Four felt raised platforms or speed bumps made the road less safe.
- Four felt the changes would make congestion or traffic flow worse.
- Three felt that painted cycle lanes are dangerous as they narrow the road.

This trend is similar with submitters who were commuters. 17% more said they would feel somewhat safe with the proposed changes. Again, however, 13 commuters said that they currently feel very safe, but the proposed changes would make them feel somewhat or very unsafe. Their rational for this rating was:

- Seven disliked the inclusion of the raised platforms.
- Four felt money would be better spent elsewhere.

Submitters in the 'other' category shifted to feeling safer (31.25% increase in feeling somewhat safe and 28.13% increase in feeling safe). This category is largely made up of people who shop at the businesses in this area or do a combination of the other categories.

35 generally positive comments and 15 generally negative comments were received about this section with no further detail.

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Feedback on the proposed changes for the Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road intersection

The existing Main South Road and Yaldhurst Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 71 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 173 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.

Overall shift in safety perceptions

Overall, there was a decrease in submitters feeling somewhat or very unsafe (38.01%) and an increase in feeling somewhat or very safe (34.93%), as shown below in Table 6.

Shift in safety perceptions by method of travel

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by their method of travel, as seen below in Table 7. Much like the previous intersection, most methods of travel show similar trends to the overall submitter sentiment with decreases in people feeling unsafe and increases in people feeling safe with the proposed changes. Submitters who drive a car shifted from feeling somewhat unsafe (15.25% decrease) to feeling somewhat safe (12.43% increase).

Submitters who bike or walk as their main method of travel were again more likely to feel safer with the proposed changes than other modes of transport, with a 64.29% increase in bike users feeling somewhat or very safe and a 63.16% increase in walkers feeling somewhat or very safe.

80% more submitters who use the bus as their main method think they would feel somewhat or very safe as a result of the changes.

Shift in safety perceptions by reason for travel

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by reason for travel, as seen below in Table 8. Business or people who work in the area who showed very little shift in any category. Submitters who visit the area sometimes were again more likely to shift towards feeling somewhat safe (31.51% increase) or very safe (24.66% increase) than any other reason for travel. Submitters who live in the area also said that they would feel safer (17.95% increase in somewhat safe and 15.38% increase in very safe).

21 generally positive comments and 13 generally negative comments were received about this section with no further detail.

Feedback on the Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection

The existing Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 98 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 151 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.

Overall shift in safety perceptions

Overall, there was a decrease in submitters feeling somewhat or very unsafe (22.26%) and an increase in feeling somewhat or very safe (18.15%), as shown below in Table 9.

Shift in safety perceptions by method of travel

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by their method of travel, as seen below in Table 10. The shift in safety perceptions for the proposed changes at this intersection is somewhat smaller than the shift seen in the previous intersections, which can likely be attributed to only one minor proposed change (the removal of the slip lane from Main South Road to

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Curletts). Again, submitters who bike or walk as their main method of travel were more likely to feel safer with the changes than any other mode of transport, with a 51.43% increase in bike users feeling somewhat or very safe and a 52.64% increase in walkers feeling somewhat or very safe.

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by reason for travel, as seen below in Table 11. Commuters were the only category that shifted their sentiment away from feeling very safe (6.33% decrease), and all groups increased in the amount that felt somewhat safe (by at least 8%).

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Key themes

Common themes raised by submitters about the Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection were:

Supportive of aspects of the proposal:

. Support the removal of the slip lane from Main South Road onto Curletts Road (41)

Concerns about aspects of the proposal:

- Oppose the removal of the slip lane from Main South Road onto Curletts Road (26)
- Congestion (32)
- Cost (9)

Requests:

- Feel that there needs to be changes made to the light phasing/green turning arrows at the Curletts Road and Main South Road intersection and the Curletts Road and Peer Street intersection (36)
- Would like to see more or better cycle infrastructure in this area (12)

20 generally positive comments and 12 generally negative comments were received about this section with no further detail.

Feedback on the raised signalised pedestrian crossing on Waimairi Road

Crossing Waimairi Road near Bush Inn Centre currently is perceived as somewhat or very safe by 66 submitters. If the proposed changes were implemented, 179 submitters said they would feel somewhat or very safe.

Overall shift in safety perceptions

Overall, there was a decrease in submitters feeling somewhat or very unsafe (36.64%) and an increase in feeling somewhat or very safe (38.70%), as shown below in Table 12.

Shift in safety perceptions by method of travel

Submitters shift in safety perceptions has been broken down by their method of travel, as seen below in Table 13. Across all methods, there was at least a 10% increase in submitters feeling somewhat safe. Submitters who bike, walk, use the bus or are a passenger were more likely to shift towards feeling very safe with the proposed changes (at least a 30% increase). While car drivers showed no shift in feeling very safe.

Shift in safety perceptions by reason for travel

Shifts in submitters safety perceptions did not differ by reason for travel.

Key themes

Common themes raised by submitters about the raised signalised pedestrian crossing were:

Supportive of aspects of the proposal:

- Support the installation of traffic lights (21)
- · Support the safe speed platform (12, of which 9 travel by active transport)

Concerns about aspects of the proposal:

- · Oppose the installation of traffic lights (3)
- Oppose the safe speed platform (14, of which 11 travel by car)
- Congestion (11)
- Cost (10)

51 generally positive comments and 21 generally negative comments were received about this section with no further detail.

Staff response to some key themes

Improving facilities for cycling

There were many requests for improved cycle facilities on Riccarton Road, particularly for protected cycle infrastructure. It is not possible within the current budget to deliver large scale changes to accommodate protected infrastructure. This feedback will be provided to the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) team that are looking at the longer-term design for this area.

Concerns about Congestion

The purpose of this project is solely to address an ongoing safety risk to people who travel outside

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of vehicles at this intersection. Improvements to the efficiency of the intersection is not the main objective of the project.

The safe speed platforms are designed to control speeds to 30km/h and as such, at the most congested times of the day (where travel speeds are less) they are not expected to be detrimental to the efficiency of the intersection and exacerbate further any existing congestion related issues. Slower speeds and improved facilities help to make people travelling outside of vehicles feel safer, enabling more people to choose other transport options.

A concern was raised about additional traffic using Bowen Street, Owens Terrace and Suva Street. Volume counts are being undertaken at these locations to understand a baseline traffic volume. These will then be monitored and re-counted six months after the changes are made. This will allow staff to understand the impacts on the network and consider mitigation measures if required.

Use of safe speed platforms

The addition of the speed platforms is to achieve a significant and much needed improvement to user safety. No one expects a crash, but people make mistakes – including those who are careful and responsible drivers. Speed is the key factor in deaths and serious injuries – no matter what the cause of a crash is, its speed that determines whether or not you'll walk away from it. We can prevent serious injury and harm through a safe system approach, which incorporates safe speeds and safe infrastructure, which includes treatments such as vertical traffic calming. Slower speeds will provide more time for all users to observe each other and reduce the risk of crashes resulting in a significant reduction to the likelihood of crashes and, in the unfortunate event crashes do occur, less severe injuries.

The science behind lowering speeds shows that lower vehicle speeds improve survival rates and reduces serious harm to people who walk, cycle, scoot and use motorcycles. Lower vehicle speed is particularly important for vulnerable road users, who include children, the elderly and those with visual or mobility impairments. For example, the survival rate of people over 60 is half that of people younger than 60 at most vehicle impact speeds.

Even small reductions in speed improve survival and reduce serious harm in the event of a collision with a vehicle. Several studies show a 1 km/h and 5 km/h drop in average speed improves survival rates by 4% and 20% respectively.
