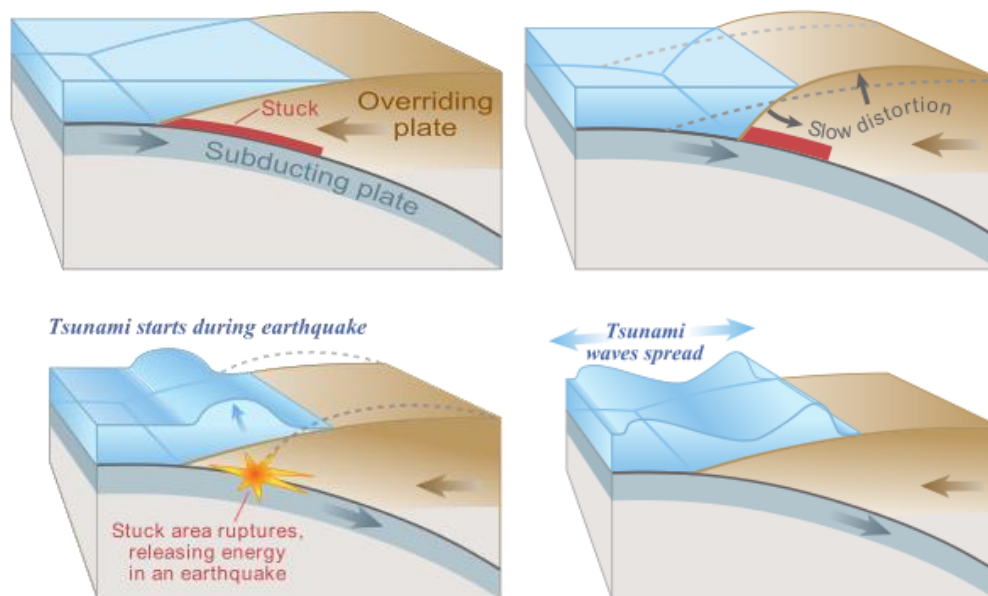

Locally generated:

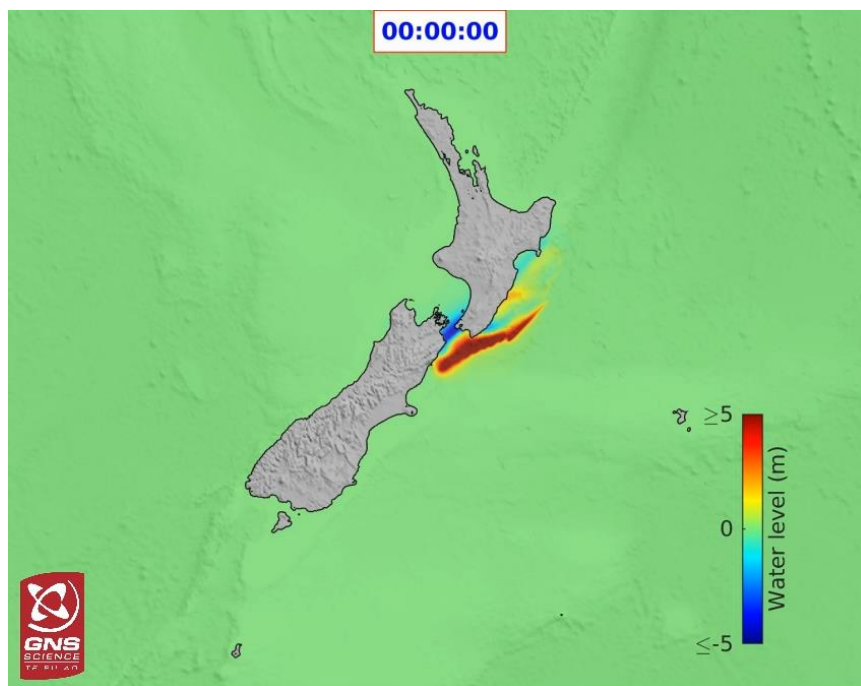
- Originate from NZ's continental shelf
- Take less than 1 hour to reach NZ
- Observe and respond to natural warning signs

Regionally generated:

- Originate from the southwest Pacific
- Take between 1 and 3 hours to reach NZ
- Potential for official warnings to be sent out

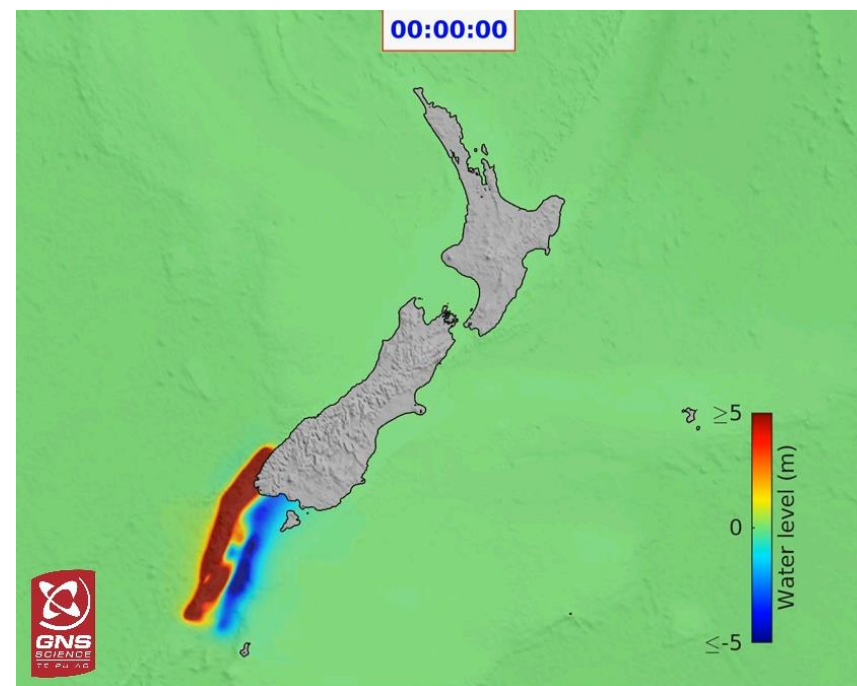
Distally generated:

- Originate from around the Pacific Ocean
- Take more than 3 hours to reach NZ
- Time for official warnings to be sent out



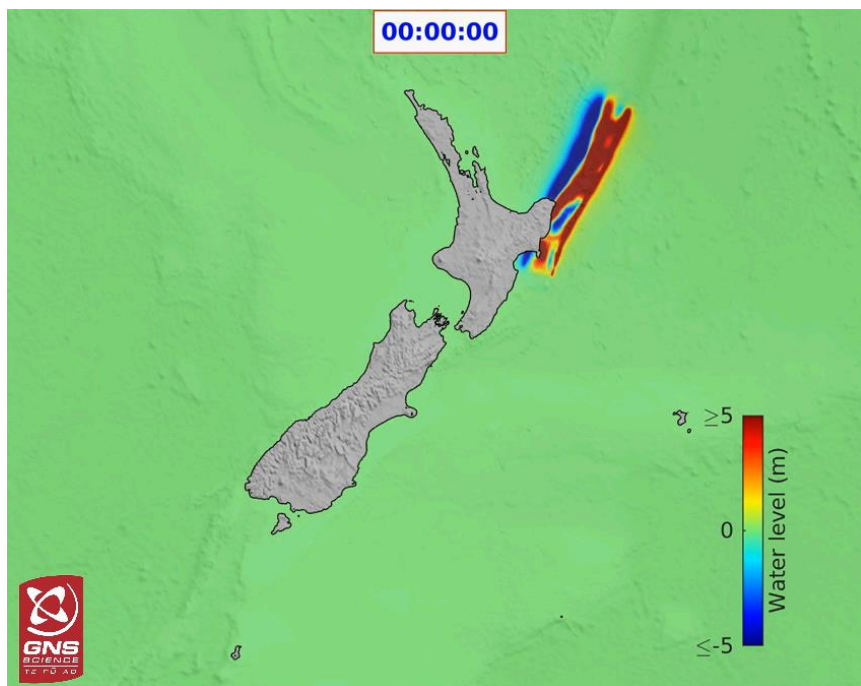
Locally generated tsunami:

- Southern Hikurangi Trench
- Magnitude 9.0 earthquake
- Reaches Christchurch in 1 hour



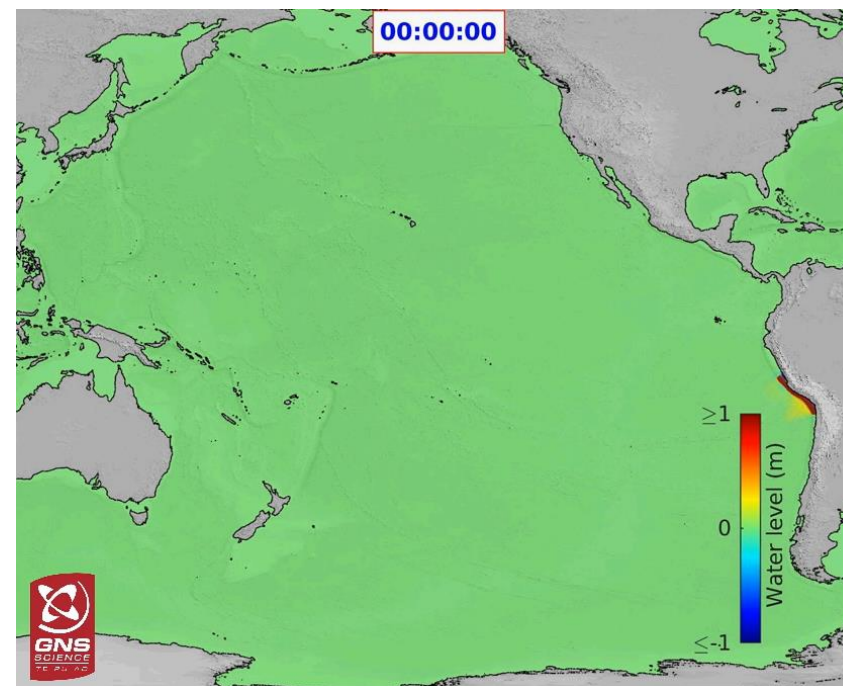
Locally generated tsunami:

- Puysegur Trench
- Magnitude 9.3 earthquake
- Reaches Christchurch in 3 hours



Regionally generated tsunami:

- South of Kermadec Islands
- Magnitude 9.3 earthquake
- Reaches Christchurch in 2 hours

- West coast of South America
- Magnitude 9.45 earthquake
- Reaches Christchurch in 15 hours

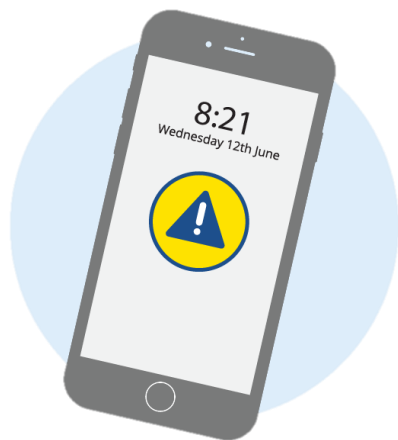

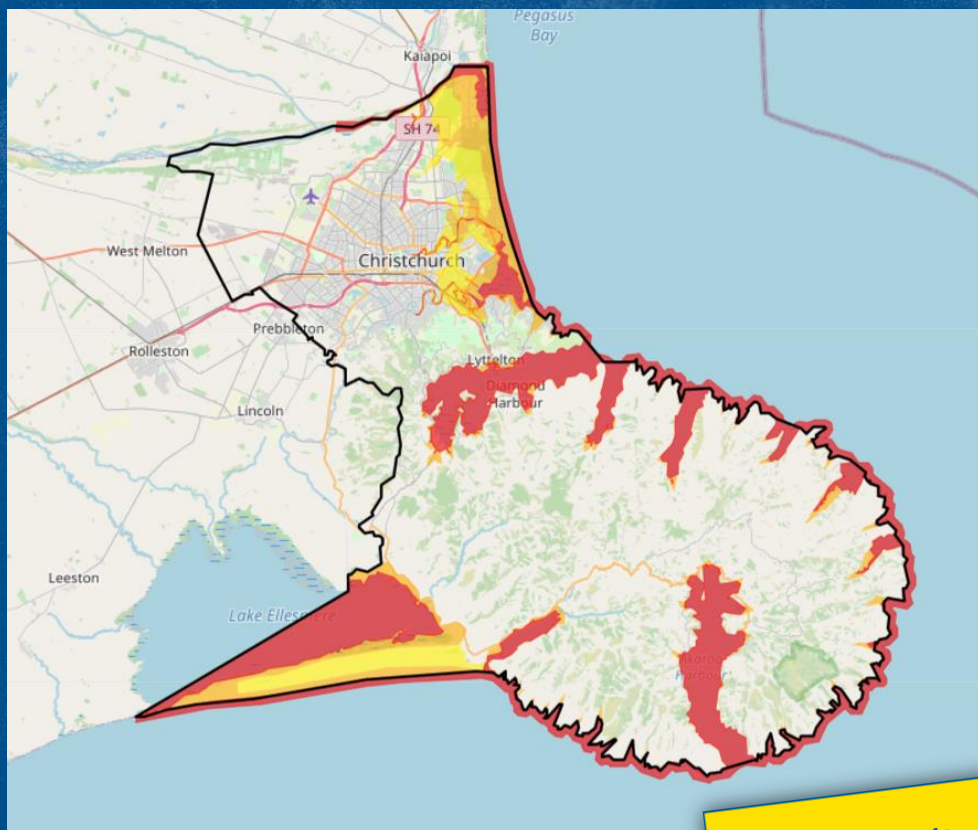



1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This workshop is expected to last for 60 minutes.
Purpose / Origin of the Workshop	<p>The purpose of the workshop is to provide the Community Board information on the status of the Bromley Transport Action Plan and inform on the analysis methodology and prioritisation of interventions available against potential funding streams.</p> <p>Presenters will introduce a GIS based interactive intervention selection tool aimed at providing opportunity to affect / refine intervention choice.</p>
Confidentiality	The workshop and any shared information is not confidential.
Background	<p>The Bromley Transport Action Plan seeks to identify key transport issues within the Bromley urban area, focusing predominantly on the residential areas. Taking into account feedback from public engagement (in particular vehicle speeds and route choice of HCVs), and analysis of transport matters, design consultants have developed a suite of interventions with high level costings, prioritised for implementation subject to budget caps.</p> <p>An interactive GIS platform has been developed to support refinement of options (screen shot examples below). The design team will present the platform and facilitate the interactive session on intervention choice refinement.</p>

1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	<p>The purpose of this workshop is to provide additional information on the play equipment renewal at Thomson Park and wider playground renewal programme for the Coastal Ward.</p> <p>The Community Board Resolved CCBCC/2024/00054 on 6 May 2024 following a petition from the Community around the renewal of play equipment at Thomson Park.</p> <p>That the Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Community Board:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Receives the petition.2. Requests that the Parks Staff work with the Board to create a larger footprint for the replacement playground to accommodate a custom module (in addition to those already purchased).3. Requests staff prepare a report with options for funding the additional module;<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. That these options include reordering of playground renewals within the Coastal Ward.b. That the advice also includes the schedule of renewals for the local play space renewal budget in the Coastal ward, the amount allocated, and the year allocated. <p>Staff want to have a discussion with the Board prior to providing any formal reports.</p>
Confidentiality	The workshop and any shared information are not confidential.
Background	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• During a routine playground inspection in December 2023, safety concerns over the play equipment at Thomson Park were identified, prompting the commission of an external inspection of the entire playground. The subsequent playground inspection report highlighted various safety issues concerning both the swing and the large module.<p>The swing set was removed subsequently. Repairs were undertaken on the large module to allow for it to remain over the summer months, including the “I love Brighton” event, but this has also been removed since.</p>• To replace the two items, Council staff identified “like for Like” replacements and approval for the works was provided under delegation by the Project Sponsor. “Like for like” renewal aims to provide the same or similar play

	<p>elements as the items that are being replaced while adhering to the New Zealand Playground Standards NZS5828:2015.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The new equipment has been ordered and is expected to be delivered in July 2024 for installation shortly after.• Any option beyond the approved scope of works is currently unfunded and would require re-prioritisation of other playground renewals or allocation of alternative funds.• To inform the discussion to accommodate and fund an additional module, the below table shows the proposed works in project ID 73980 – Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Local Play Space Renewals. For example, there is a playground in FY28/29 which is likely to be swapped with Aranui Playground as it is in poorer condition.• The current renewal works are being funded from project ID 64749 – Community Parks Play Item Renewals. This is a citywide budget to allow for renewals of individual play items and safety surface renewals in a play space where the rest of the play equipment is in good condition. \$71,110 (21%) of the FY24 budget and \$112,800 (31%) of the FY25 budget have been allocated to the renewal of the Thomson Park play equipment.
