Timing	This information session is expected to last for 45 minutes.
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	The purpose of this information session is to provide information through a presentation to the Community Board regarding the updated Good-to-go ways to get to school programme the Council provides to schools.
Confidentiality	The workshop and any shared information are not confidential.
Background	<p>Good-to-go ways to get to school is a programme designed to support schools in encouraging safe, active, fun, affordable, low-emission ways to travel to school and around their community.</p> <p>The programme requires schools to participate in walk or wheel to school week (primary and intermediate schools only), participate in crash bash (high schools only), promote and participate in our annual school travel survey and receive our termly newsletters. Many of our schools are already meeting these requirements. Council works in partnership with registered schools to focus on transport issues that are prevalent for them. Depending on the type of issue the school is facing we look at the different interventions that could be used.</p> <p>The Good-to-go ways to get to school programme has been well received with over 43 schools registered.</p>

4. Richmond Hill Road - Proposed No Stopping Restrictions

1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	<p>The purpose of this briefing is to update the Waihoru Spreydon-Cashmere-Heathcote Community Board on a proposal for No Stopping Restrictions, and a defined footpath area to be installed on Richmond Hill Road to improve pedestrian safety and access.</p> <p>This is a staff initiated briefing to inform the Board of the proposal, and reasons behind it, prior to staff consulting with affected members of the Public.</p>
Confidentiality	The workshop and any shared information is not confidential and can be made public.
Background	<p>A member of the public has raised a safety concern about parked vehicles obstructing access for pedestrians on the section of Richmond Hill Road which extends between the two hairpin bends (between 54 and 70 Richmond Hill Road).</p> <p>This has also been raised at various times in the past - including through consultation on the project to construct a new footpath on the uphill section (completed in 2021), however it was outside of that project scope.</p> <p>The kerb on the north side of the road is largely flush with the road surface so there is no defined footpath. Due to the narrow road width drivers often park as far to the left as possible, requiring pedestrians to walk on the road to navigate around them.</p> <p>There is a clear gap in infrastructure through this section of road. It connects between formed footpaths at either end, as well as a pedestrian walkway intersecting approximately midway along (located between 62 and 64 Richmond Hill Road). Over time traffic volumes have also increased due to development towards the upper section of Richmond Hill Road.</p> <p>The proposal includes defining a marked footpath along the kerblines and restricting parking on sections of the road that are too narrow to accommodate a parked vehicle while still providing clearance for through traffic.</p>
Key Issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is no defined footpath on this section of road, resulting in poor connectivity for pedestrians. • Due to the narrow road width, the proposal will result in the removal of on-street parking.
Next Steps	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff will consult with affected residents to seek feedback on the proposal.
