### 1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

	During the Long Term Plan meeting convened on 14 February 2024, Council resolved to:	
	<ul> <li>A129a: Establish a new capital programme fund of \$20 million per year, starting in FY 27, for addressing and resolving regular surface flooding at sites identified against a priority matrix established by Council in FY 25 and FY 26; and</li> </ul>	
	A129b. Requests staff to report back on resolving surface flooding issues at the following sites, with options considered against the priority matrix developed:	
_	i. Brenchley Ave	
Purpose and Origin of the	ii. Robinsons Bay stormwater diversion	
Workshop	iii. Cygnet Street Catchment review	
	iv. Cambridge Terrace between Madras and Manchester	
	v. Edgeware Village.	
	A PX workshop on 25 February 2025 started the engagement with Council on the programme prioritisation.	
	The purpose of the workshop is to describe progress made since the first workshop on the development of the priority matrix and resulting flood pocket identification. The workshop will also explore criteria that will be used to inform programme definition.	
Timing	This workshop is expected to last for 60 minutes.	
	The outcome sought is to inform Councillors on flood pocket identification and prioritisation. In the workshop, Staff are seeking direction from Council on:	
0	Criteria for including a flood pocket within the physical works programme	
Outcome Sought	The next steps in developing the physical works programme	
	Staff can then apply the criteria to the prioritised flood pocket to inform development of prioritised list of physical works for approval by Council in stages.	
ELT Consideration	ELT considered the information contained within this briefing in the meeting on 29 May 2025. Support was given to progressing the briefing subject to additional information being provided in the briefing on the next steps.	

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	ELT will consider the prioritised list of projects that will be developed from this process though planned Council report(s), the Annual Plan and the Long Term Plan.
Next Steps	<ul> <li>Stream 1: apply the criteria to develop a list of the highest priority projects for approval via a report to Council. This will enable delivery of projects in FY27 against the budget set by Council in the LTP. This Stream needs to be progressed with urgency to meet the LTP funding profile.</li> <li>Stream 2: the remaining flood pockets will be prioritised to inform delivery of the remaining programme. This Stream will occur over a longer time period as these projects are planned to be delivered after the highest priority Stream 1 projects.</li> <li>The report to Council to agree the Stream 1 projects can be expected in July.</li> </ul>
Key points / Background	<ul> <li>The flood pockets have been identified and prioritised based upon the feedback from the online survey of Councillors.</li> <li>Councillor identified flood pockets have been included in the assessment.</li> <li>Proposed criteria include those in the Coastal Adaptation Framework as agreed with Council.</li> <li>Many but not all the projects presented to Council on 5 April 2023 in a report titled "Citywide Surface Water Flooding Update" are prioritised highly. This is because past projects have been prioritised primarily on above-floor flooding. The prioritisation undertaken for this programme is much broader.</li> </ul>

Purpose and Origin	<ul> <li>Brief Council on the Minister's decision on Alternative Recommendations for PC14.</li> <li>Discuss next steps in the plan change process.</li> </ul>			
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 45 minutes.			
Outcome Sought	To inform the Mayor and Councillors of the effect of the Minister's decision, including influence on consenting.  To get confirmation on next steps, including decision making on undecided alternative recommendations deferred by the Minister.			
ELT Consideration	This has not been considered by ELT.			
Next Steps	Officers intend to present at an Information Session on 1 July to discuss the outcomes of the Environment Select Committee regarding changes to the Resource Management Act to allow for an opt out of MDRS. The session will discuss what options are likely to be available under the Act and ascertain whether Councillors wish to receive a decision report on opting out of undecided MDRS.			
Key points / Background	<ul> <li>The Minister has only accepted 3 alternative recommendations.</li> <li>The Minister has deferred decision making for Daresbury heritage listing, Antonio Hall heritage listing, and Piko Character Area until Council decides on the underlying zoning.</li> <li>All other council alternative recommendations have been rejected and the IHP recommendations have instead been adopted</li> </ul>
