Background	The purpose of this briefing is to update the Community Board on aspects of the 'Improving Bromley Roads' project. CERF Update Funding details Delivery timeline Consultants /contractors Consultation Project specifics These projects are currently under investigation by the designers (Stantec), so no plan is yet available. In general it is intended that they include: Measures to slow traffic speeds to safe system levels Improvements to pedestrian crossing points and to cycle facilities through the intersections. 1.1 McGregors Road / Hay Street / Butterfield Ave intersection Identified as a location of concern on the route to school. Speeds high on Hay Street, and any intervention here is also intended to contribute to lower speeds. 1.2 Hay Street / Ruru Road intersection Speeds high on Hay Street and Ruru Road, and any intervention here is also intended to contribute to lower speeds. Fatal crash reported in the media at this location last year. 1.3 Keighleys / Bromley Road intersection Identified as a location of concern on the route to school, specifically crossing Bromley Road. High number of heavy vehicles on this route. 1.4 McGregors / Walcot Street – local shops Identified as a location with opportunity to manage speeds, address antisocial road user behaviours and improve pedestrian and cycling access to local shops.				

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1.5 Hay / Korora intersection

Identified as a location of concern on the route to school. Speeds high on Hay Street, and any intervention here is also intended to contribute to lower speeds.

1.6 Korora / Kawau intersection

Identified as a location of concern on the route to school – close to side entrance to school.

In addition asset planning staff are developing a network plan for the area. This will aim to identify further changes to the road network.

Broad goals for this plan at this stage include:

- Reducing heavy vehicle traffic on residential streets.
- Taking opportunities when renewing roading assets (through the citywide maintenance and renewals program), such as programming improvements to coincide with renewals.
- Supporting lower speed limits.
- Improving transport options to the area, including linkages to the major cycle route on Linwood Ave.

HV management

At present, the Bromley Road / Keighleys Road route between Linwood Avenue and Maces Road carries the highest volumes of heavy vehicles (12%, ~601/day), followed by the Hay Street route (Maces Rd- Ruru Road – Hay Street – Linwood Avenue, 6.4 - 13.9%, ~168 - 286/day) and the Ruru Road route (Maces Road – Ruru Road – Pages Road, 10.1% ~239/day).

In order to achieve a shift in heavy vehicle volumes from these roads onto the state highway and surrounding arterials, it will be important to improve the connection to SH74 (Such as at SH74/Maces Road). This can then be coupled with measures to disincentivise heavy vehicle use of the other streets, which could include narrowing corner radii, traffic calming, and bylaw restrictions. However, these measures alone (without improvements to SH74) are not considered to be as effective.

Future funding

Additional funding for other projects identified will be sought in future Long Term Plans (depending upon priorities and subject to the Long Term Plan process), and supplemented where possible through any external sources of funding (such as from Waka Kotahi or central government funding).

CERF projects SH74/Maces Intersection Improvements – consultation and report for approval. NMP & SH74 / Maces – Waka Kotahi bid for NLTP funding for the 2024-27 period. Christchurch City Council will also bid for funding in the LTP for supporting works (the timing of which may change depending upon how successful). Useful Links
