#### 1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Purpose and Origin	<ul> <li>The purpose of this information session is to discuss the Capital Endowment Fund, and particularly the request for funding from the Youth Hub Trust.</li> <li>This request was initially made to the Long-Term Plan, where it was recommended that the Capital Endowment Fund may be a more appropriate vehicle for support.</li> </ul>
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.
Confidentiality	The session and any shared information are not confidential.
Outcome Sought	To take questions and provide information to elected members with information on the status of the fund, and contextual information about the Youth Hub project.
Next Steps	If approved, the first year of funding would be applied to the project in early 2025.
	This application is not only to create and activate the events space at the developing Youth Hub but will also serve to enable use of additional floor-space already built in part of Phase One of the project, currently limited due to ground-floor fire protection guidelines.
Key points /	Discussions with other local funders (specifically the Rata Foundation) have been very encouraging, with a strong intention to see this project completed successfully.

#### 1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Purpose and Origin	At the Information Session/Workshop –of 18 June 2024, councillors requested this briefing, noted as:  • Rezoning properties – Briefing on processes for rezoning in the district plan.
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 45 minutes.
Confidentiality	The session and any shared information are not confidential.
Outcome Sought	<ul> <li>That councillors have an understanding of:</li> <li>How and why, we use zoning to manage land use and development in the district</li> <li>A rezoning plan changes in preparation</li> <li>How zoning interrelates with development proposals and/or the disposal of land.</li> <li>In relation to the plan change being prepared, that councillors are aware of what this plan change considers and where in the process the plan change currently is.</li> <li>The plan change being prepared considers rezoning properties where the zoning is not appropriate including, but not limited to – split zoning; corrections; new legal roads; anticipated/commenced/completed developments where is the outcome is contrary to existing zoning and is considered to require a zone change; strategic highways/designations; specific purpose school zones where no longer required; disposals; and specific sites/unique circumstances.</li> </ul>
ELT Consideration	Not applicable.
Next Steps	For councillors to review and consider the information contained in the briefing.  Officers are preparing a discrete plan change which will address matters of zoning in the district plan. An Information session on this plan change will be scheduled in due course, ahead of preparation engagement.
Key points / Background	<ul> <li>Zoning is a method used to tailor District Pan rules to different parts of the District, the objectives of which are based within the framework of the Resource Management Act 1991. Additionally specific zone standards are found within the National Planning Standards 2019.</li> <li>Officers are currently preparing a plan change for rezoning sites in the district plan. The scope of this plan change will be based around zoning requirements derived from the objectives of the Resource Management Act 1991.</li> <li>Although it can be interrelated with land disposals, zoning is driven by different objectives and outcomes.</li> </ul>

Purpose and Origin	<ul> <li>The purpose of this Information Session/Workshop is to provide Elected Members with an overview of the proposed refresh of the draft Ōtautahi Christchurch Transport Strategy (the Strategy).</li> <li>As per the last update to Councillors about this work programme, it is now being progressed at the start of the next 3-year planning cycle, following the:         <ul> <li>adoption of the 2024-34 LTP; and</li> <li>publication of the 2024 Government Policy Statement Land Transport.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 90 minutes.
Confidentiality	The session and any shared information are not confidential.
Outcome Sought	<ul> <li>The outcome sought from this Information Session is for Councillors to:</li> <li>get an update on the proposed approach for progressing this work and shape and content of the draft Strategy; and</li> <li>provide an opportunity for discussion and comment ahead of finalising the updated draft strategy for public consultation.</li> </ul>
ELT Consideration	The proposed next steps for this Strategy were considered and endorsed by ELT on 22 July and 12 August 2024.
Next Steps	<ul> <li>Next steps for the completion of the Strategy are Council consideration of a updated draft at a late September/early October Council meeting.</li> <li>Approval will be sought at this stage to publicly consult on the draft.</li> </ul>
Key points / Background	<ul> <li>The Ōtautahi Christchurch Transport Strategy is the Council's non statutory 30-year strategic plan for transport. It's scope is city-wide, whole-of-network and strategic in its focus.</li> <li>The Strategy guides the Council's transport capital programme and transport policy and planning programmes. It is an important part of the Council's transport system stewardship role.</li> <li>The Council's Strategic Transport Plan has not been updated since 2012. Work to update it has been in train since 2019-20.</li> <li>The timing is good now to progress this work. The Council is at the beginning of a 3-year planning cycle; the LTP has been finalised; and the new Government's policy direction is confirmed.</li> </ul>

#### 1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Purpose and Origin	On 30 July 2024, the Independent Hearings Panel released its recommendations on Plan Change 14, the Housing and Business Choice Plan Change.
	<ul> <li>This information session is the fourth session in which staff will provide information for the Council on the IHP recommendations to support the Council's decision- making on the recommendations.</li> </ul>
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 60-90 minutes.
Confidentiality	The session and any shared information are not confidential.
Outcome Sought	This session will expand on matters raised during the first sessions on the IHP recommendations on Plan Change 14, which took place on 6, 13, and 20 August 2024.
	Staff will provide more in-depth information and respond to any questions Councillors may have following their review of the IHP's recommendations.
ELT Consideration	ELT has been advised of the IHP's recommendations and timing of staff engagement with the Council in preparation for the Council's decision on the IHP recommendations.
Next Steps	As timing is tight before the Council meeting on 4 September, when decisions on the IHP's recommendations are to be made, staff will also provide additional information to the Mayor and Councillors through Memoranda.
	The Government has set a deadline of 12 September 2024 for the Council to notify its decisions on the IHP recommendations relating to implementation of the National Policy Statement on Urban Development (NPS-UD).
	Staff will prepare a report for the Council meeting on 4 September 2024, when decisions need to be made on the IHP recommendations to meet the Government's deadline for notifying the public.
Key points / Background	<ul> <li>The Council is required to make decisions on those aspects of proposed Plan Change 14 (Housing and Business Choice) that implement the National Policy Statement on Urban Development (NPS-UD) by 12 September 2024.</li> </ul>
	Council has until December 2025 to make decisions on the remainder of proposed Plan Change 14.
	The IHP issued its recommendations on Plan Change 14 in a report provided to the Council on 30 July 2024.
