The agenda was dealt with in the following order.

**1. Apologies Ngā Whakapāha**

Apologies for absence from Tim Baker and lateness from Kelly Barber.

Kelly Barber arrived at 3.12pm during consideration of item 2.

**2. Marine Parade Street Renewal Project - Consultation update**

As representatives of local coastal groups the Chairperson invited David East on behalf of North Beach Residents' Association, Esther Parriam on behalf of the Pier and Foreshore Society and Lyn Klenner on behalf of the New Brighton Gardens to the table to receive the update from staff and to ask questions of their presentation.

Council Officers in attendance provided the Board with an overview of the project and consultation feedback. Council Officers also advised of an alternative option with a shared path and bi-directional cycleway.

It was noted that the new alternative option is an addition to Option A with necessary safety amendments to crossing points with regards to the proposed shared path and bi-directional cycleway.

Those present gave a majority steer for staff to further investigate and consult on a new alternative option noting that there would be a delay to the decision making meeting which is likely to be held in November and construction which is likely to take place in May 2025. Noting that this timeline is high level and will be confirmed at the November meeting.

It was noted that staff should consider the following when further investigating the new alternative option:

- Merging carparks 5 and 6 noting that some trees will need to be removed.
- Considering swapping the grass berm and pathway proposed in the block between Lonsdale Street and Rawhiti Avenue noting that the pathway has recently be laid.
- Consider using chipseal instead of asphalt to save costs.
