1. Apologies Ngā Whakapāha

Apologies were received from Ben Manson.

2. Coastal Hazards Adaptation Plan

Community Board Briefing, Seminar or Workshop Recommendation

Jane Morgan, Team Leader Coastal Hazards Adapt Planning, and Tom Simons-Smith, Principal Advisor Coastal Adaptation, presented to the Zone Committee regarding the Draft Coastal Adaptation Plan. During the presentation, the following points were noted:

- A draft Coastal Hazards Adaptation plan has been created but has not been subject to Council processes as of yet. The draft plan is expected to be presented to Council at their 16 October 2024 Meeting.
- The current policy approach prescribes public assets that contribute to the health, safety and wellbeing of communities need to be prioritised. Though if a private asset, such as Marae, fits this framework then it may also be prioritised. This is a noted grey area in the policy approach.
- Some adaptation fixes (including raising or relocating roads) have been priced at over \$100million. As such, the draft plan encourages some societal changes rather than total adaptation fixes, as a cost saving measure for the Council.

3. Erosion and Sediment Control, and Soil Conservation Resource Development

Community Board Briefing, Seminar or Workshop Recommendation

Jaimee Grant, Zone Committee Facilitator, and Brent Barret, Whaka Ora Healthy Harbour, and Mike Patchett, Christchurch West Melton Water Management Zone Committee member, presented an update to the Zone Committee on the Erosion and Sediment Control project which was funded by previous ZCAP (Zone Committee Action Plan) funding. During the presentation, the following points were noted:

- The project has financial resource of \$10,000 to utilise.
- A full project brief has been created, which includes an understanding of project scope, the key tasks, and the stakeholders. The focus should be on empowering landowners to take educated action on their land.
