












THE MISSION

Ötäkaro Orchard is a critical anchor for Christchurch's thriving local food movement, a central nexus for inter-generational learning, and a world-class exemplar of what's possible for New Zealand and other cities around the globe.










We need Christchurch City Council to help get this finished.

We have paid the loan interest up until September with Vegetable sales.

The QA cost to complete is \$650k with inkind support secured we need \$290K with contingency and \$60K working capital.

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




CNZHL INCOME 2023/24







Share of population with at least three of the four key aspects of wellbeing (2023)










