

A POOL FACILITY: CATERING FOR OUR GROWING COMMUNITY, YOUNG, OLD & DISABLED




TOTAL ESTIMATED COST \$400,000

- a) Summer use and opening days are weather dependent. Resulting in the Belfast Primary School changing swim schedules last minute disrupting learning time.
- Change rooms are beyond their economic life. The Senior Campus uses the change rooms as they are now located "off-site" in the Belfast Village.
- There is no disabled access or toilet / changing facilities available.
- d) The site is exposed to the prevailing cold Nor-Easterly winds.
- e) The children are exposed to harsh UV sunlight and often for significant periods of time as they play.
- The school currently offers 150 hours of swimming lessons each year (assuming 30 students per class). The MOE has built school buildings to provide for the school role to expand from 420 to 700 students projected for 2041 that will require 233 hours of swim lessons at capacity.
- The Graham Condon Pool facility cannot cater to the current swim program, and its distance from the school would require an additional 150 hours in travel time from the school program, which the children cannot afford to miss in a lower decile school.
- h) Our community is projected to expand by 100% by 2041, from 7,500 to 15,000 residents, and we are 1/3rd through that schedule. Our community facilities should plan appropriately to accommodate them and our rapidly changing demographics.
