Purpose / Origin of the Information	 Preliminary summary of consultation feedback on phase 1 draft scheme (Keighleys Road and Bromley Road). 					
Session	 Indicate any potential changes in the final phase 1 scheme coming to the Board for approval 9 December 2024. 					
	Progress update on the Bromley Transport Action Plan.					
Confidentiality	The information session and any shared information is not confidential, however it is requested that staff be advised if any consultation results are shared, as submitters will be updated.					
	 On 27 June 2024 staff updated the Community Board on the draft Bromley Transport Action Plan in an information/workshop session. 					
	 a. An interactive workshop session was used to identify Quick Win priorities in the draft Action Plan that could be constructed with available FY25 budget. 					
	 First priorities identified comprised traffic calming and safety upgrades on Keighleys Road, Bromley Road and Hay Street. 					
	 On 7 October 2024 at an information session staff updated the Community Board on the draft Phase 1 scheme for public consultation. 					
Background	 The draft Phase 1 scheme included traffic calming and safety upgrades on Keighleys Road and Bromley Road. 					
	 Hay Street was removed from this phase of work as it needed to be addressed as part of "Street Renewals" programming due to the condition of the carriageway and deep dish channel. 					
	 There was support for consultation: the Board requests that consultation include a drop-in session, and that the community be consulted on the draft Bromley Transport Action Plan. 					
	4. Consultation was open from 9 October to 3 November 2024.					
	 a. A drop-in session was held on 21 October and was attended by eight residents. Discussions covered the draft phase 1 scheme and a map of treatment sites in the draft Bromley Transport Action Plan.

	At the time of preparing this report, 37 submissions have been recorded. However, these have not been checked and verified, so this is subject to change. There is also the possibility that late submissions may be received.
Key Issues	 The staff presentation on 11 November will include: A preliminary report on feedback and community views received through this consultation. A discussion of potential changes, if any, for the final phase 1 scheme. This is ahead of the designs coming to the Board for a decision on the 9 December 2024.
	A progress update on the draft Bromley Transport Action Plan and priorities Staff will return to the Community Board on 9 December 2024 with:
Next Steps	 A recommendation and formal analysis of consultation submissions. Request for a decision approving progress of the final phase 1 scheme (traffic calming and safety upgrades to Keighleys and Bromley roads) to detailed design and construction.

1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	In June 2024 the Council directed staff to commence work on development of a Local Alcohol Policy (LAP). This Information Session outlines a LAP's potential scope, the process being followed, and upcoming opportunities for community participation.
Confidentiality	The workshop and any shared information are not confidential.
	The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (2012) requires councils to have regard to a comprehensive range of information in producing a draft policy. Collecting this information has been a staff priority in recent months as it needs to underpin a LAP.
Background	 Community views about sale and supply of alcohol were sought via the mid-year 'Life in Christchurch' survey – high-level findings, including in the Board's area, will be reported at this session.
	Wide community engagement will follow, with several opportunities/ways for people to participate in the development of a LAP.
	Early engagement with key stakeholders began in October.
Key Issues	There is expected to be strong local community interest in the development of a LAP, so it is important that the Board has a clear understanding of what provisions can or cannot be included, and what opportunities there will be for them – and their local communities – to participate and share their views.
Next Steps	Community Boards will continue to receive regular updates about the project, as they will be important connectors with their local communities and encourage their participation and sharing of views on proposals.
