## 13. Elected Members' Information Exchange Te Whakawhiti Whakaaro o Te Kāhui Amorangi

Board members exchanged the following information:

- Some Board members attended the Duvauchelle A&P Show recently.
- The Board were advised that the Council has started preparation on the upcoming Draft Annual Plan.
- The Board noted that the Banks Peninsula Conservation Trust has a new Chairperson.
- Council has decided that staff are to continue to pre-consultation on a draft Local Alcohol Plan.
- The Board acknowledged the work of Ōnuku Runanga hosting the 2025 Waitangi Day celebration which the Prime Minister attended and spoke.
- The Coastal Hazards Adaptation Plan submissions have been heard by Council and a decision will be made at the Council's 4 March 2025 meeting.
- The Lyttelton Museum has formally changed the museum's name to Te Ūaka Lyttelton Museum. The Museum Committee will have a strategy planning day shortly.
- The Akaroa Information Centre is attracting a lot of visitors and more volunteers. Many visitors are seeking information on local walking tracks.
- The Board discussed Te Pātaka o Rākaihautū Banks Peninsula Destination Management Plan and thought that there needed to be an approach for national funding.
- French Fest committee are working through the challenges of running the festival.
- The Board were advised that there has been follow up by a Board member on supporting multicultural groups with Te Pātaka o Rākaihautū Banks Peninsula.
- The Akaroa Bays Emergency Response team has revised their draft plan and the document will soon be distributed for public consultation.
- A suggestion was made for the Board to consider including extending the Council's Akaroa Service Centre hours in its Annual Plan submission.
- The Board were advised that the Coronation Library is progressing.
- A ceremony is being held on 14 February 2025 to unveil the Smart Christchurch Pole Mounted Fire Detection Sensor.
- The new mural in the corridor of the Mānawa Kāwhiu Lyttelton Recreation Centre was blessed recently.
- The Board were advised that the Lyttelton Information Centre has a new manager.
- The Board noted that there was no enough signage advising of the water quality for swimming around Te Pātaka o Rākaihautū Banks Peninsula. - It has been noted that there has been an upsurge of anti-social road users around Whakaraupō Lyttelton Harbour basin and graffiti.
