2. Community Funding Information Session

1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.		
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	The purpose of this information session is to update elected members on the changes to Council's contestable funding for the 2025/26 financial year; including the new funding platform, SmartyGrants.		
	Staff will also provide information on the range of community funding that is available to community organisations through Council.		
	This information session is being provided in advance of a comprehensive review that will be presented to the incoming Council and Community Boards in late-2025.		
	Council's previous funding platform, Salesforce, was at the end of its lifecycle as an IT platform and was costing Council significant OpX to maintain.		
	The new funding platform, SmartyGrants is used by over half of the TLA's across New Zealand (<i>including Environment Canterbury and Auckland City</i>), as well as various community trusts and funding providers. It is an industry-leading solution and a social-enterprise, with fees less than ¼ other competitive options available.		
Background	Compared with the outgoing solution, SmartyGrants will bring a range of improvements to Council's community funding schemes for the community organisations who apply, staff and elected members alike.		
	Included as Attachment A , staff have provided a summary of the contestable and non-contestable funding schemes that are available to community organisations in Christchurch. The intention is to inform elected members of these offerings, so that in interactions with community organisations, quality advice can be provided.

	A number of funds are <u>already</u> being administered through Smartygrants. Elected members will note an immediate improvement to the presentation of decision matrices and reports on grant-spend.
Next Steps	The remaining funds will be transferred to the new platform, before decommissioning Salesforce at the start of the new Financial Year.
	Staff will collect and review community feedback on the changes made and adjust/improve the new platform and any processes iteratively over the coming year.



3. Transport Growth work in the Waipapa Area

1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This information session is expected to last for 30 minutes.	
Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	The purpose of this information session is for staff to update the Board on various growth-related transport work occurring in the Community Board area. Any shared information is not confidential.	
Background	Update on Progress of Highfield ODP CPMS 41973 / 79980 The progression of Highfield North Area is starting to create a major change to a short section of Hawkins Road along Horners Drain with realignment of Selkirk Road and Hawkins occurring in the next 18 months. This change is one of the Resource Consent conditions for Oakbridge Development Plan. This change is essential to support the growth for the area. The presence of Horners Drain creates an engineering challenge and can only deliver a 7.2m wide and 1.5m path required for a local road. Note that the development in this area of Hawkins Road will also trigger changes to the speed limits as the land use transitions from rural to urban. This will be progressed separately alongside other speed limit changes as it will need to align to the current direction from Council for speed management plans and to national legislation. For the road network to operate efficiently, future traffic will be able to commute to Marshland Road via Oakbridge Boulevard which will be formed to a collector standard and an upgraded Selkirk Road. This collector route will be a primary link to Marshland Road. The completion of this road link will enable Council to improve safety at the Prestons / Hawkins /Hills intersection by restricting traffic movement at Hawkins/ Prestons intersection with a left in and left out movements only. This restrictive change will provide a safer travelling environment in a changing and challenging environment. The Resource Consent for the Oakbridge Development also requires Selkirk Road be upgraded to a collector status with two 3.2m vehicle lanes and two 1.8m cycle lanes. The presence and retention of some large trees in the road corridor requires the need to	
	introduce localized carriageway narrowing with traffic management measures to ensure all the road elements for a collector road are in accordance with Council's engineering requirements and practices.	

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	The realignment of Selkirk and Hawkins is programmed for construction in mid-2025 following the stormwater works which are currently in progress. The balance of the works will happen progressively in the next 18 months. Further changes along Prestons Road will occur progressively with developments in the next few years. The carriageway along Prestons Road will consist of two 3.2m traffic lanes, two 1.8m cycle lanes and flushed median together with traffic management features for safe pedestrian movement. It is intended to report to the Board at some future dates to formalize the declaration of special lanes, regulatory signs and markings, and other road changes associated with the Boards' powers of delegation.
