1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This workshop is expected to last for 75 minutes
Purpose / Origin of this Workshop	To identify and document the Committee's top priorities to pass on to a new leadership model.
Background	<p>In 2023, the Canterbury Mayoral Forum (CMF) initiated a review of Zone Committees to assess how to better include local leadership in freshwater decision-making. A report presented to the CMF in November 2024 acknowledged the valuable contributions of these committees but noted they may no longer be the preferred option to support effective local freshwater leadership in some areas. The CMF agreed further work is needed to develop an improved approach, with Environment Canterbury leading this effort alongside Councils and Papatipu Rūnanga in early 2025, ahead of a proposed model being presented in May.</p> <p>To support the transition to a new leadership model, the Banks Peninsula Zone Committee is developing a list of priorities and key issues a new model can utilise to inform any future work programme. This list may include actions and focus areas from the Committee's current Action Plan, and priorities/issues identified in the Banks Peninsula Zone Implementation Plan or Addendum, or broader priorities that require collaborative and coordinated leadership.</p> <p>Consideration can be given to:</p> <p>Zone Committee Action Plan (ZCAP)-</p> <p>This outlines the current priority areas and actions the committee is working on to implement the CWMS at a local level. Progress has been made against several priorities with further work to be done on several actions. A ZCAP progress table draft is attached (Attachment 1) which will be used to support discussion and be added to at the workshop. The Zone Committee can consider what actions or priorities included in the ZCAP that they would like to see carried on. A copy of the Banks Peninsula ZCAP can be found online here: Banks Peninsula Water Zone Committee Action Plan 2021-2024 Environment Canterbury</p> <p>Zone Implementation Plan (ZIP) and Zone Implementation Plan Addendum (ZIPA) –</p> <p>The Banks Peninsula ZIP and ZIPA were developed to outline local priorities and actions for achieving the goals of the CWMS. These documents reflect community input and</p>

	<p>provide guidance on freshwater management, biodiversity, and cultural values across the zone. As a new leadership model is considered, the ZIP and Addendum offer valuable insights into established priorities and can help identify incomplete or ongoing actions that may be important to carry forward into future planning.</p> <p>Current issues of relevance that have been identified by the community, the Committee, or other stakeholders, or are widely recognised—such as contact recreation and water quality monitoring.</p>
Discussion	<p>Prior to this workshop, Committee members were asked to think about and bring along their top three priorities they would like to see carried forward to help inform the discussion.</p> <p>The following questions are for the Committee members consideration when identifying priorities or actions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Are there any outstanding or ongoing issues in the ZCAP, ZIP or ZIPA that require follow up or ongoing action? 2. Are there key activities/projects/issues that require connecting parties and would benefit from coordinated leadership between agencies, mana whenua and local leaders? 3. Are there any groups or activities that have been supported by the Committee that it would like to see have support continued? 4. Are there any successful initiatives by the Committee or others that have proven effective and could be scaled or continued? 5. Any lessons learned from past challenges or barriers to progress? 6. Are there any recent issues that have been raised by mana whenua, stakeholders or community that require attention?



