2. Banks Peninsula Zone Committee Priorities

Committee Information Session/Workshop Notes

The Committee discussed priorities to include within a hand-over document to be considered by the new model, following the Zone Committee review. The Committee agreed the top priorities included:

- Water quantity.
 - Review of the science and the existing rules to make sure they are adequate and are fit for purpose going into the future.
- Hosting and/or supporting fundraising workshops to enable community groups to access funding.
- Sediment control.
 - Identify, support and develop sediment basins in places like Wairewa as identified in the ZIPA.
- Biodiversity on harbours and getting linkages through a biodiversity corridor.
 - Continue to support the fencing of waterways and springs, as these support corridors, shades waterways and prevents sediment getting into waterways.
- Water quality.
- Fish passage surveys.
 - Educate on fish passage in schools.
- Drinking water.
 - Run several workshops around drinking water and waterways going into the harbour and looking at how to slow down sediment.
- Community engagement.
 - Ensuring there is adequate engagement and community have a voice and are enabled to take action.
