The key purpose of the vision document is to:

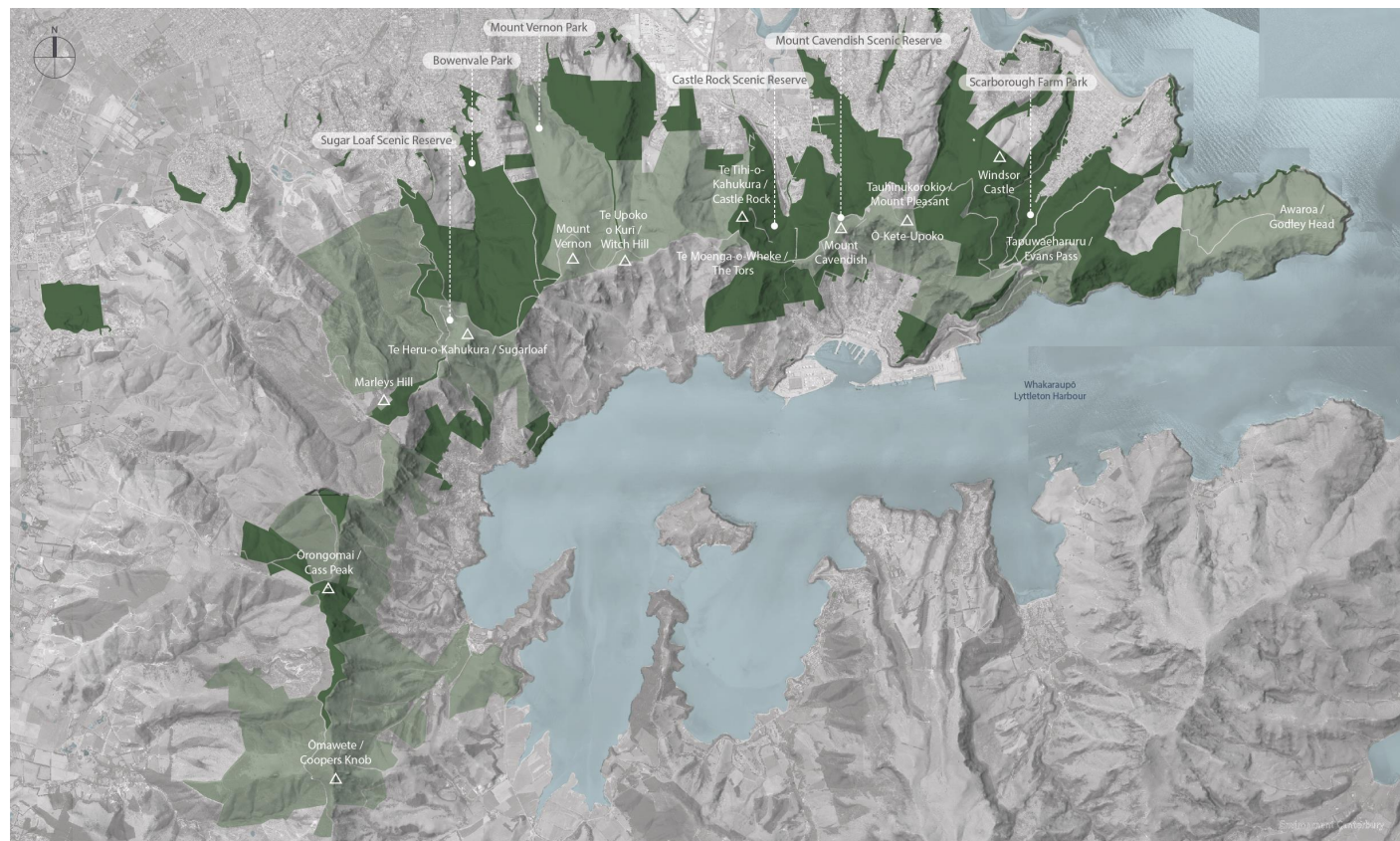
- Establish a shared vision that coordinates the development, use, and management of the Port Hills.

Port Hills Vision Document – draft scope

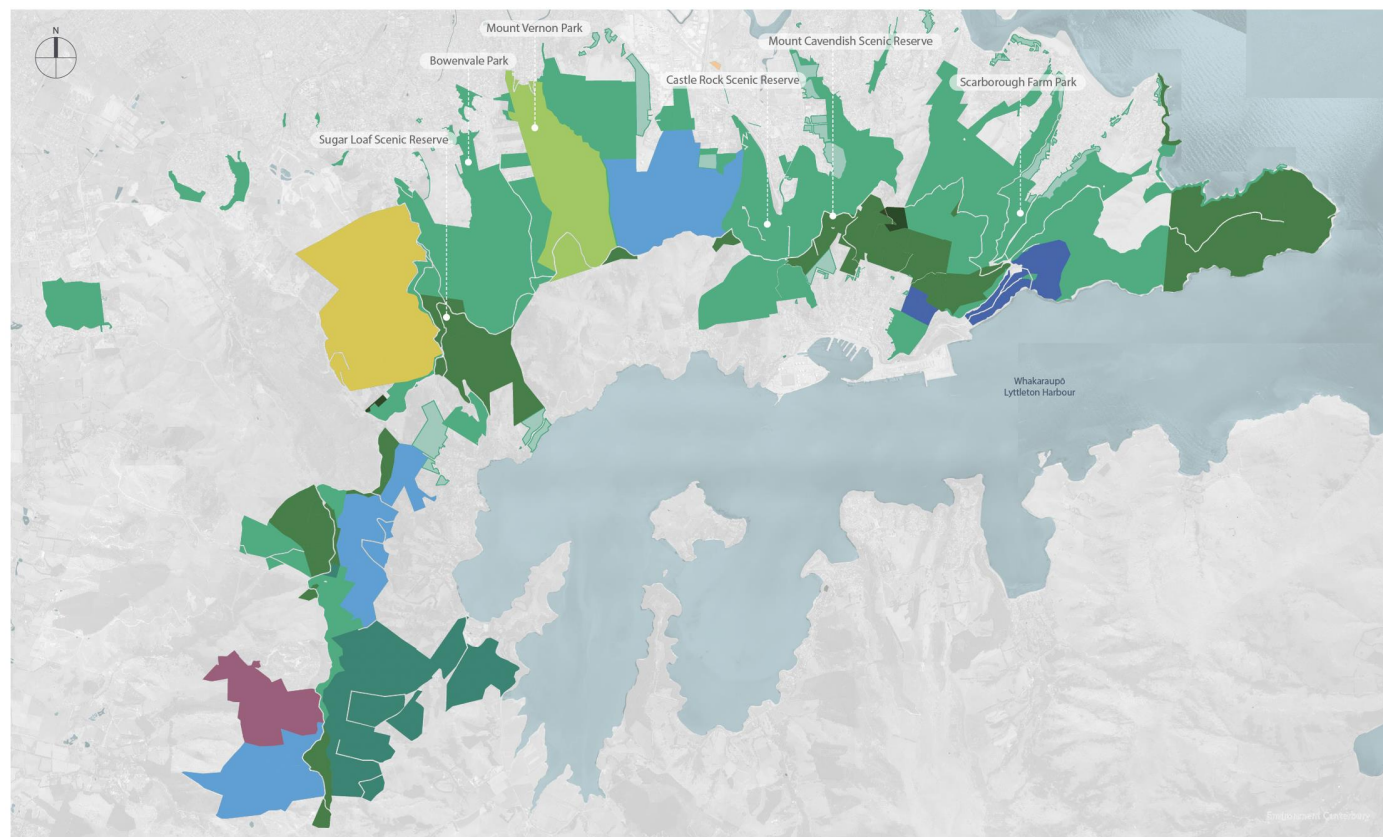

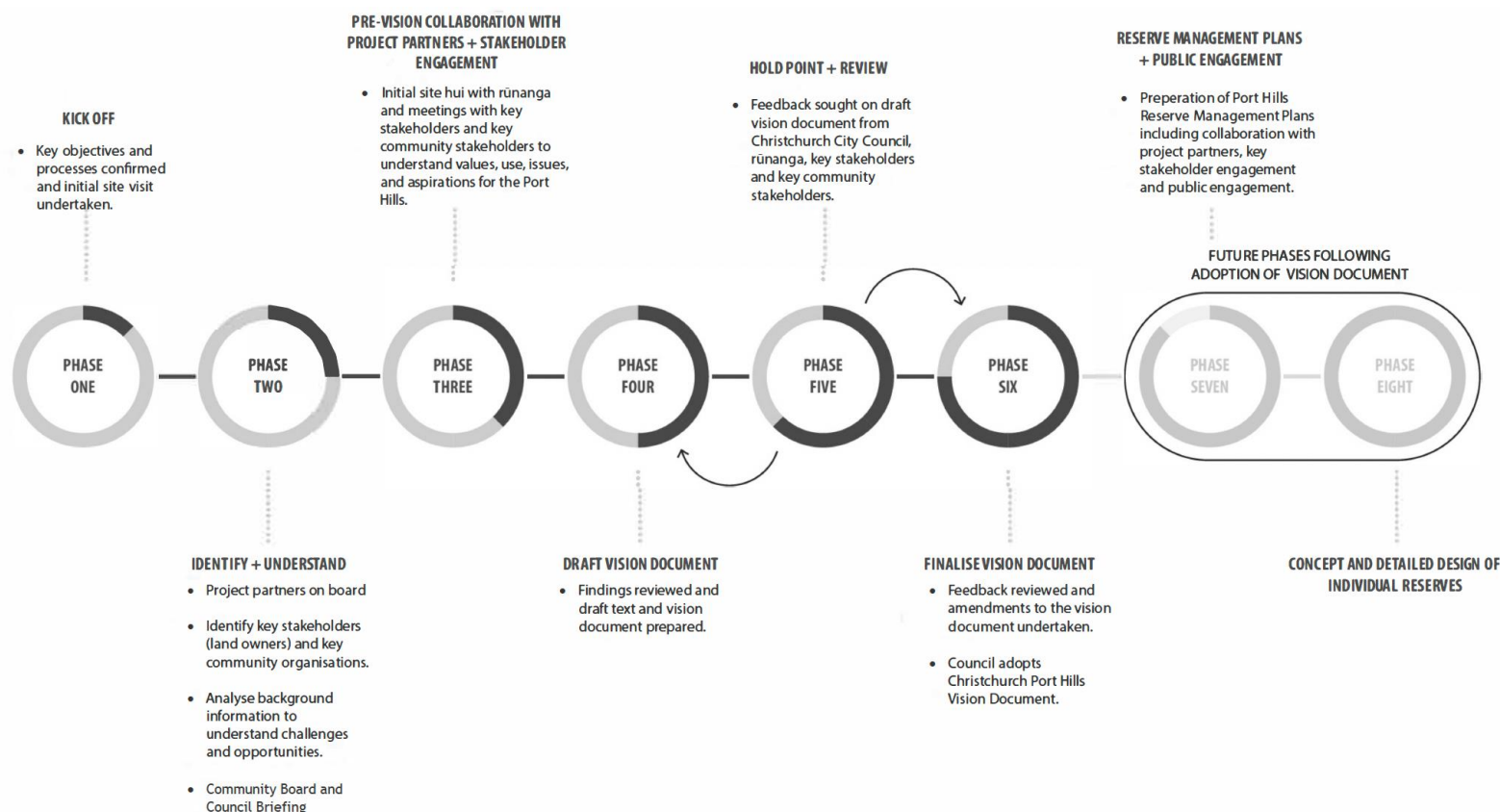
Port Hills Vision Document

 - Key community stakeholder perspective
 - Trusts (e.g. Port Hills Park Trust Board), Societies (Summit Road Protection Society), catchment groups, reserve committees
