1. Purpose of the Memo

- 1.1 The purpose of this Memo is to provide Officer Advice on Mayor Phil Mauger's Notice of Motion requesting:
 - 1. In response to concerns raised by hospital staff working nights shifts, requests staff to investigate and engage with Christchurch Hospital management regarding the feasibility of:
 - a. providing free overnight car parking at Parakiore Recreation and Sport Centre for Christchurch Hospital staff working night shifts; and
 - b. the Christchurch Hospital providing free transport options for hospital staff night shifts to and from Parakiore.

2. Resource Impact of the Notice of Motion

- 2.1 In September 2023, Christchurch Hospital representatives expressed interest in accessing overnight parking at Parakiore for Emergency Department staff, specifically from 8pm to 5.30am. Discussions were paused due to construction delays and uncertainty around the opening date.
- 2.2 In April 2025, Council staff re-engaged with Christchurch Hospital representatives to confirm ongoing interest in after-hours parking as part of operational planning.
- 2.3 A meeting was held on 28 April 2025 between Council staff and the Christchurch Hospital's Parking Manager to explore potential access arrangements. The Parking Manager advised that the greatest parking pressure is during the afternoon shift which typically starts around 2pm. Most night shift staff currently park in the HNZ car park building, where free parking is available from 3.45pm weekdays and all day on weekends.
- 2.4 There are no resourcing implications associated with continuing discussions. A plan is already in place to re-engage with the Hospital following the first three months of operation at the Parakiore Recreation and Sport Centre. This follow-up will assess the feasibility of supporting hospital staff parking needs, including potential allocations for daytime parking and a reassessment of overnight parking demand.
