1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Timing	This workshop is expected to last for 30 minutes.	
Purpose /	The purpose of this workshop is to present the Community Parks Rolling Renewal Programme for the current year and the next three years, and to gather feedback. Considerable effort has been made to ensure renewal projects are distributed fairly across all Wards, with a strong emphasis on prioritising assets in poor (Condition 4) or very poor (Condition 5) condition.	
Origin of the Workshop	Individual project budgets are not included in the attached documents. Costs are allocated at the programme level once work has been competitively priced.	
	To strengthen the engagement process, staff will return to each Community Board later this year with an updated Community Parks Rolling Renewal Programme for resolution, incorporating any changes proposed by the Board. Staff will aim to present the decision report to each Board before the 2025 local body elections.	
Background	Community Boards will be presented with the renewal programme for the current year and the subsequent three years. Significant effort has been made to ensure that the delivery of renewal projects is allocated equitably across all Wards, with a particular focus on deteriorating assets graded as Condition 4 (poor) or Condition 5 (very poor).	
	Individual project budgets are not included in the attached documents, as costs are drawn down at the programme level once the work has been competitively priced.	
Key Issues	• The renewals programme for the current financial year (FY26) has been scoped and is ready to deliver, for that reason we recommend no change to this year as it will impact deliverability.	
Key issues	• The programmes across the next three financial years (FY27, FY28 and FY29) are indicative, and elected members can provide feedback and requests for changes. Any changes made to the renewals programme will likely require substitution.	
	Receive feedback and change/substitution requests from elected members.	
Next Steps	 Investigate proposed changes/substitution and re-prioritise rolling renewals programmes for FY27 to FY29. 	
	• Present a decision report to the Waipapa Papanui-Innes-Central Community Board reflecting the changes put forward by the board members for resolution.
