Spokes held an open planning day at Tūranga in March

- 187 suggestions 39 specific to wider Waipapa area, plus 40 for CBD
- Prioritised for each Community Board
- Safety and smaller connections that will enhance cycling
- Focus on top three priorities today, but hope to present the remaining ideas in the future
- We also looked at the Love-to-Ride data entered by participants

Strategic Priorities






Northcote Road

- Create a shared path or separated two way cycle lane on Northcote Road between the Northern Line and the QEII Drive shared path (700m) on South side
- Lots of students bike down here to St Bedes, Marian College, Papanui High
- Northcote Road is busy and is used by many heavy trucks
- Design is happening now options need to be safe and fit for purpose
- Spokes concerned that design is being compromised to reduce cost

Waipapa – Priority 1





Crossing over Innes Road near roundabout on QEII Drive is dangerous

- Vehicles speed around corner, 60km/h to 80 km/h, two lanes of traffic
- Left turning lane from Innes Road going West particular problem
- Hard for pedestrians/cyclists to see vehicles on bend
- Many cyclists will not use QEII path due to safety concerns here
- Options include traffic lights, speed humps, raised pedestrian platform

Waipapa – Priority 2






Prestons Road / Marshlands Intersection

- Cyclists travelling west on Prestons Road through Marshlands Road intersection being cut off by traffic turning left into Marshlands Road
- Shared path by BP + pedestrian crossing
 no cut down to encourage use
- Red left turn light is available but does not trigger for cyclists, particular concern at night
- Ask staff to review intersection safety and recommend improvements for cyclists
- Re-establish off road cycle lane on Prestons Road - increasingly popular route going to Hills Road underpass or to Redwood

Waipapa – Priority 4-6

- New Harewood Road housing and fences at the railway line has narrowed the Northern Line difficult to see others on path
- Langdons Road dangerous for cyclists, particularly near Northlink
- Greers Road north of Clyde Road –
 on road cycle lanes need extending
 full length of road (north of
 Wairakei Rd for Waipapa)

Waipapa – Priority 4-6









General Priorities

- Bike parking at popular destinations and events that suits a wide range of bikes with space for loading and unloading
- Provision of cut downs into and out of paths suitable for cargo bikes and mobility devices
- More cycle signage and way-finding
- Reinstating cycle infrastructure when road works done
- Improved lighting for cycling through parks and alleyways
- Greater enforcement for vehicles parked / driving in cycleways



Also impacting Waipapa

Central - Council

- Carlton Mill Intersection does not work for pedestrians or cyclists
- Armagh St Bridge
- Fitzgerald / Kilmore intersection
- Colombo Street to Papanui Parallel test safety treatments have disappeared

Waihoro

 North Wilsons Road from Shakespeare / Opawa Road intersection to shared path beside Lancaster Park
