1. Purpose and Origin of the Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to decide on the application for proposed road closures for the Fire on High 2025. The proposed closures are designed to provide a safe separated space for the event to be held with attendees on road, where they can be separated from regular road users.
- 1.2 This report has been written because Fulton Hogan have proposed to close the following road from 7am to 10pm on 30 August 2025:
 - High Street from Lichfield Street to Tuam Street

- 3.5 Staff support the proposed temporary road closures and believe that it will not unreasonably impact traffic.





1. Purpose and Origin of the Report Te Pūtake Pūrongo

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to decide on the application for proposed road closures for the Events at Apollo Projects Stadium Provincial Rugby.
