1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

Purpose and Origin	 To provide information with respect to the Whoosh Transportation System. Several Councillors have already met with staff from Whoosh and consider a wider briefing would be of value. 			
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 45 minutes.			
Outcome Sought	That the Mayor and Councillors are informed about the Whoosh Transportation System.			
ELT Consideration	Whoosh has not presented to ELT, although several members of ELT visited the office/warehouse in Christchurch.			
Next Steps	That the Mayor and Councillors receive the presentation.			
Key points /	Whoosh creates point to point transportation for passengers or goods traveling on a light and flexible elevated cable and rail guideway. Vehicles travel across cable sections to span over geographic obstacles without interference to the area below.			
Background	 Whoosh have developed a operational prototype system in their building in Hornby, although there are no real-world systems operational now. 			
	 A public pilot project in New Zealand is underway, and they report they have additional interest for projects around the world.

1. Detail Te Whakamahuk

Purpose and Origin	To provide Elected Members with an overview of the Resource Management replacement legislation introduced on 9 December 2025.
Timing	This information session is expected to last for 45 minutes.
Outcome	The workshop aims to inform Elected Members about the key elements of the Bills, with particular emphasis on the implications for Council's roles and functions.
Sought	Staff seek to identify which components are of greatest interest to Elected Members to guide future briefings and the development of submissions.
ELT Consideration	N/A
Novt Stone	At the time of writing, the Planning and Natural Environment Bills have yet to be referred to Select Committee. Timeframes for public submissions will be released once the Bills have been referred to Select Committee.
Next Steps	Following this introductory briefing, staff plan to come back to Council for further briefings before making a final submission on the Bills, subject to the confirmed submission timeframes.
	The Government has been progressing significant reform to the Resource Management (RM) system, working towards the replacement of the Resource Management Act (RMA) 1991.
Key points / Background	On 9 December 2025, the Government introduced two new Bills to replace the Resource Management Act. At the time of writing, the Bills have yet to have their first reading. This is expected to occur in the week of 15 December.
3	The replacement legislation proposes two new Acts: the Planning Act and the Natural Environment Act.
	The key driver of the reform is to simplify the planning system, reduce duplication, and cut unnecessary red tape, creating a more efficient and streamlined framework for managing New Zealand's natural and built environments.
