Petition for the Saint Albans Business District Against Unsocial and Threatening Behavior





Overview - what we're doing

- Coordinated programme of water and roading upgrades over two years
- Six wastewater and water supply renewal projects, worth approx. \$35 million
- Three transport projects, including components of the Nor'West Arc and Wheels to Wings cycleways
- Multiple contractors
- First work to start January 2026: Morrisons Avenue/Langdons Road; Memorial Avenue and Greers Road Water renewals and Greers Road road renewal (Memorial Ave to Waimairi Road), followed by Matsons Avenue/Chapel Street and Harewood Road






Why we're doing it

- We're upgrading water, wastewater and roading infrastructure in the city's northwest to make sure these essential services continue to meet the needs of our communities
- Water and wastewater pipes have reached the end of their service life and need replacing. Some will be upsized to increase capacity and meet growing demand
- We're making roads safer and improving traffic flow
- Our three waters and roading teams are coordinating their work to minimise the disruption, reduce costs and avoid the need for further work later on

B projects - March/April 2026

Nor'West Arc MCR (Matsons Ave) + wastewater renewal Harewood Road water supply renewal

C project - June 2026

D projects - March 2027

Langdons Rd/Main North Rd wastewater renewal Nor'West Arc (Aorangi Rd)

E projects – to be scheduled

Harewood Rd wastewater upgrade Greers Rd (north) wastewater upgrade Condell Ave street renewal Wairakei Road water supply renewal

Key concerns and solutions

Concern	Solution		
Restricted traffic flow to businesses – fewer customers during detours or one-way systems	Staging work to minimise disruption, ensuring detour routes are available, working with contractors to provide timely, accurate updates and signage, working with businesses to understand their needs		
Access – reduced accessibility due to closure or altered entry points	Working closely with stakeholders to ensure appropriate access whenever possible		
Parking – limited parking discourages customers from visiting	Working with contractors to minimise loss of parking, ensuring the message that businesses are open as usual gets through including onsite parking signage		
Patients/customers unable to get to appointments on time	Working with stakeholders and contractors to ensure clear and timely communication so people can plan ahead		
Temporary loss of water supply – ability to provide services at critical times in the day	Working with stakeholders to understand critical needs, and with contractors to ensure clear and timely communication so people can plan ahead – this has been a key part of our early engagement		
School drop-off and pick-up –congestion, loss of parking. Safety concerns	Scheduling work during school holidays when possible. Working with schools to understand their needs and ensure appropriate access whenever possible.		
Timely, clear, accurate information – unclear or incorrect updates causes confusion	Good information builds trust – working with contractors to provide timely, accurate updates through multiple channels.

Changes to date

- Proposed upgrading/renewal of three signalised intersections to help with detour routes prior to Wairakei Road works
- Proposal to combine renewal and upgrade of Greers/Wairakei signals with wastewater works to minimise disruption
- Stopping Greers Road water supply work clear of the shops and combining that portion with Wairakei Rd wastewater to minimise disruption
- Working on best delivery methodologies for Greers Rd water and transport projects
- Combining projects to enable better traffic management and faster construction
- Co ordinating routine renewals such as footpaths for a one pass approach in the area
- Combining scope, or parts of scope, from different projects into contracts for smooth delivery





Communications and marketing approach


- Communications strategy and plan developed

The human context

We aim to reach those **affected by, or with an interest in,** the decision. But there are **barriers**... and we know that consultation isn't representative

- We hear from people who have the time, energy and know-how to get involved.
- We normally hear from the passionate against and for.
- If people like something, they're less likely to provide feedback. If they don't like something, they're likely to turn up to speak.
- We're more likely to hear from people when proposals affect their everyday lives
 less so when future-focused.
- The conundrum of timing too early or too late?





Engagement - managing expectations


- Consultation should serve a purpose feedback needs to be able to influence decision making.
- A project needs to have negotiables what are they, what do decision makers want to know from their community.
- When we already know what people think, consultation is not a good use of time and resource.
- Not one-size-fits-all every engagement plan is shaped by project context, negotiables, affected communities and stakeholders, timelines, and legislative requirements.
