Purpose / Origin of the Information Session	<p>This staff-initiated workshop is to support the Board to review and consider community feedback on its Draft Community Board Plan.</p> <p>Staff will present an overview of the feedback received, particularly in relation to the nine draft priorities and highlight key themes emerging from the community feedback.</p>
Background	<p>Each Community Board across Christchurch adopts a Board Plan for its electoral term, outlining its priorities and areas of focus for the triennium.</p> <p>The 2026–2028 Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board Plan will outline the priorities of the current Board and provide information to the community about the role of the Community Board, how it intends to work with residents, and the values that guide its approach.</p> <p>The Draft Waipuna Community Board Plan 2026–2028 was released for public feedback in mid-February alongside the draft plans for the other five Christchurch Community Boards.</p> <p>This draft has been informed by a survey completed by Board Members in January and a workshop with the Community Board in February.</p> <p>The Draft Plan received 24 submissions from 15 individuals and 8 organisations.</p> <p>The submissions summary is attached (refer Attachment A).</p>
Key Issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Community Board Plan will help guide the Board’s advocacy and submissions to Christchurch City Council’s Annual Plan and Long-Term Plan processes. • The plan will support the Board and staff to prioritise actions and initiatives across the Waipuna area over the 2026–2028 term. • It is important that the final plan reflects community priorities while remaining targeted and realistic about what can be delivered within a constrained financial environment.

- Submission on Waipuna Halswell Hornby Riccarton Community Board Draft priorities 2026-29
Thank you for your draft plan. We are pleased to have the opportunity to comment on your priority work areas for the next three years.
This is a submission on behalf of the Halswell Community Project Committee. The Project aims to create a connected, resilient community which fosters engagement, inclusion, participation, a sense of belonging and pride that brings about better outcomes through those improved connections and information sharing.
We serve a community that has grown very quickly since the Christchurch Earthquakes and continues to do so. Like most other places in Christchurch, we have also seen our community become increasingly diverse, culturally. We think it is important that people who live here have access to all that they need to connect into the local community. We are also highly aware of the importance of this to help people be more resilient and adaptive when our community is challenged by difficult circumstances – fires, floods, earthquakes, terrorism etc.
- Waipuna Community Board Vision Statement
We identify with the Vision that the Community Board has put forward, which aligns well with our own vision. (<https://www.halswellcommunity.net.nz/Halswell-Community-Project/>)
We believe this serves our wards and Community Board area well.
- Waipuna Community Board Priorities
Overall, we think the Board's stated priorities, particularly for the Halswell area, need some adjustment to align with:
- The Community Board's vision statement,
 - The actual work that the Community Board is charged with,
 - The three-year length of the plan, and given the vision statement,
 - The 4 wellbeings, as well as local infrastructure needs.
- The Community Board vision and priorities should stand as agreed reference statements, relevant for the whole of the three-year term, that will guide current and future deliberations and actions of the Board. As such, we would like to see a good breadth of work that benefits all three wards and reflects the points above. For example, it seems likely that all three wards will want board support/ advocacy for their communities, and community facilities. The focus on roading and water infrastructure in Halswell seems a little narrow in focus given that our community, community facilities, environment and economy are also of importance to us as a community.
Please note that we are not submitting against any of the priorities already put up in this plan, however at least some of them seem more appropriate for the What the Board will do section rather than as bigger picture priority areas.
Our thinking has been guided by the priorities that the Board has put forward in this plan, what two community meeting (In November 2025 and February 2026) put forward as priorities for Halswell, and thinking about what we know of our community and the needs that we see here in Halswell.

in each of the priority areas.

Some priorities that we think could or do span all three wards might be:

- Sustainable, accessible, safe transport
- Connecting people across cultures
- Increasing community connections
- Maintaining and running community facilities
- Economic and business wellbeing, and/or
- Environmental wellbeing.

More projects – at least for Halswell

Projects that we'd like to see added as projects that focus on the Halswell Ward within these priorities:

- Supporting community connections - ensuring new and longer-term community members can find out what is going on, and to be able to find and join activities that suit their various needs.
- Support Increasing options for vulnerable communities (eg older people, disabled people, new migrants) within their local communities.
- Ensuring our community facilities are well maintained and their use is optimised.
- Making transport around Halswell safe for those on bikes, in wheelchairs, on scooters or on foot so that children and older folk can safely get to local shops, parks and community facilities.
- Ensuring good connectivity both locally and to the city by advocating for a more local form of public transport with the Regional Council (or whatever replaces it).

Whatever the Board decides, we believe it is important to have a good spread of priorities that are clearly aligned with the Board's vision statement. We also think such an approach would better represent what we have seen the Community Board do over time. Furthermore, as we head into some potentially difficult times, communities become vital for our collective capacity to adapt to and manage what arises. As an organisation that works hard with others to do that foundational work, we really appreciate the work that the Board does and hopefully will continue to do over the next term.

Do you have any comments on this priority?

It is unclear which specific area you are referring to as the Riccarton CBD. Spokes supports creating better urban spaces that prioritise people and active transport over motor vehicles. This has been successful in the Central CBD, partly by 30km/h speeds. From the CCC information, 44% of people living in Riccarton are aged 15-29 and are likely to be lower waged than the CCC average and more culturally diverse. Any revitalisation should take this into account.

To what extent do you support our priority for Smarter Transport: Traffic Optimisation

Do you have any comments on this priority?

Spokes supports initiatives that improve reliability for public transport and active travel. We can see benefits in optimising traffic flow and improving network efficiency but there are more important priorities for Riccarton residents that would have a greater impact on transport. Improving network efficiency should be business as usual for council staff.

The Iran war will have a significant impact on the cost of living for the next year. This will have a greater impact on young people, students and the low waged who have fewer resources to fall back on. Many residents will be looking for alternative transport options to save money and we are already seeing an increase in cycling and public transport. Increasing cycling and public transport use reduces vehicle use and improves network efficiency.

The Community Board should be looking at ways to improve the reliability and speed of public transport. Riccarton Road could be transformed by closing it for vehicle traffic except for public and active transport. As a minimum, bus lanes need to extend, uninterrupted, for the full length of Riccarton Road and be properly enforced.

There is a good cycling base in Riccarton with 6.9% of residents biking to work and 11% biking to education (CCC figures from 2023). This can be increased with some relatively cheap changes such as providing sharrows on Puriri St (South end) and Rattray St to safely connect the South Express and the Uni-Cycle MCRs together, improving the connection between Riccarton Mall and the South Express, and completing the cycle lanes on Waimairi Road which was approved by the Community Board but never actioned.

The Board could also encourage major commercial organisations to improve cycle parking and provide a template for good practice. The cycle parking at Church Corner is poor.

Long Text Spokes supports increasing green spaces, tree canopy and biodiversity. As high density housing increases in Riccarton the privately owned green spaces and mature trees are being lost. Spokes strongly supports the Amyes Road renewal with cycling and pedestrian infrastructure also added.

Advocate for additional budget in the Long Term Plan for the Awatea/Springs/Amyes intersection upgrade.
Spokes strongly supports the Awatea / Springs / Amyes intersection upgrade. The volume of traffic is increasing on Amyes Road and Springs Road. The intersection is dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians.

Advocate for a pedestrian link between the Hornby Mega Centre and Hornby Hub on Main South Road. Spokes supports this link if it is also suitable for cyclists.

Advocate for Safer School Crossings at Hornby schools, including St Bernadettes School, Hornby High School and Gilberthorpe School. Spokes supports safer crossings at these schools.

Looking at the wider picture there is a strong need for a safe Hornby - Halswell cycle connection. Dunbars Road / Awatea Road / Amyes Road is an important north-west, south-east link for commuter cyclists between Halswell and Hornby. This connects through to the South Express via Goulding Ave and Chalmers Street, which also need safety upgrades. The only other direct option is Halswell Junction Road, which is less safe and does not connect to the Hub Hornby or the local schools.

Q21 To what extent do you support our priority for Hornby fit for purpose community facilities and parks?

Q22 Do you have any comments on this priority?

Long Text Spokes supports fit for purpose community facilities and parks, including shared paths that are easy, safe and convenient to use. Lighting on shared paths is important, and good bike parking at destinations is needed.

Q23 Is there anything missing or priorities that you would change?

Long Text These priorities have come from Spokes members and from a number of public consultations in 2025 and 2026. These are our top 10 of 35 requests for Waipuna in priority order. Note that some priorities are also reflected in the Community Board priorities above, and some are partially in design or completed but not finished.

1. Upgrade the intersection of Division Street, Dilworth Street, Maxwell Street to make it safer for cyclists and pedestrians to get into Riccarton Mall. This is the best connection from the South Express.
2. Improve Chalmers Street outside the Hub Hornby Mall, and the connection through the Rugby Club carpark to the South Express cycleway. Hub Hornby/South Express cycleway exit from the rugby club carpark is confusing for drivers and unsafe for cyclists as it exits on the corner and has multiple exits combining into one.
3. Hendersons Road/Cashmere road needs a shared path from Penruddock Drive to Sparks Road.
4. Improve and seal the path from Bronco Playground (in Nash Reserve) to Little River Link on the other side of the motorway. Improve safety at the adjoining path on the south-east side of the underpass. This section also needs lighting as it is used at night.
5. Provide on road cycle lanes on Waimairi Rd between Riccarton Road and Maidstone Rd, (project approved in 2020 but never delivered).
6. Provide sharrows on Puriri St (South end) and Rattray St. This would provide a connection between the South Express and Uni-Cycle cycleways, and safer cycling for students at St Theresa School (pedestrian lights on Riccarton Rd)
7. Provide a safer / faster cycling connection between Halswell and Hornby. Crossing the street along Springs Road is slowly but surely becoming more and more difficult. Some planned improvements are included in the AP but not enough to be meaningful.
8. Connect the Sparks Road cycleway through to Sutherlands Road and preferably down to the Halswell Road Intersection.
9. The unused railway spur towards Prebbleton cuts South Hornby in half. Remove the railway line and make it a shared path. This will make Hornby intersections less complicated and safer for cyclists, pedestrians and other active transport users. It could also provide better connections across the space. A lot of people work in the industrial area and want to cycle there.
10. Provide cycle lanes on Yaldhurst Road and / or a shared path on the South side from Racecourse Rd to Manakura St

Spokes is happy to provide more details on these priorities on request. There are also some general things that can significantly improve cycling in the Wapuna area.

- . Speed reductions make neighbourhoods safer for all road users. Spokes would like to see more roads reduced from 50km/h to 40km/h and 60km/h to 50km/h.
- . Pedestrian / cyclist refuge crossings make it easier to get across busy roads.
- . Bike parking at popular destinations and events that suit a wide range of bikes such as cargo and cargo trikes with space for loading and unloading children.
- . Provision of cut downs into and out of paths in parks and alleyways – suitable for cargo bikes and mobility devices.
- . Progressively remove staples and bollards at alleyway entrances that are too narrow for cycles, push chairs and mobility devices to navigate. Put reflective tape on bollards that remain and paint diamonds on pavement where appropriate. Where bollards remain, offset them back from the entrance slightly
- . More cycle signage and way finding. This was the top request at the HCSA Orientation Day from new students

. Ensuring that cyclists trigger the lights at intersections without waiting for a car or pressing the pedestrian button.
E.g. If there is a cycle lane at the intersection, make sure the cycle lane has underground loops to trigger the signals, and diamonds on the road surface so cyclists know where to ride.
. Spokes would like to see bike parking provided at all playgrounds.
. Flexi-posts should be installed on left-hand bends where drivers cut the corner and drive in the cycle lane or shoulder, where possible. These have been very effective along Kotare Street.

Spokes is dedicated to including cycling as an everyday form of transport in the greater Christchurch and Canterbury areas. Spokes has a long history of advocacy in this space including writing submissions, presenting to councils, and working collaboratively with others in the active transport space. We focus on the need for safe cycling for those aged 8 to 80. Spokes also supports all forms of active transport, public transport, and has an interest in environmental matters.

Another option is low cost or 0% loans to buy a bike. Council could also encourage local businesses to provide FBT exempt cycle purchases for their employees to get to work.

The Board could also encourage major commercial organisations to improve cycle parking and provide a template for good practice. The cycle parking at Church Corner is poor.

Transport improvements

1. Advocate for the continued progress of the Amyes Road Renewal.

Spokes strongly supports the Amyes Road renewal with cycling and pedestrian infrastructure also added.

2. Advocate for additional budget in the Long Term Plan for the Awatea/Springs/Amyes intersection upgrade.

Spokes strongly supports the Awatea / Springs / Amyes intersection upgrade. The volume of traffic is increasing on Amyes Road and Springs Road. The intersection is dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians.

3. Advocate for construction of missing footpaths at key locations, including Springs Road, Awatea Road, Steadman Road.

Spokes strongly supports construction of these footpaths, in particular a shared path on Steadmans Road to connect to the South Express MCR.

4. Advocate for a pedestrian link between the Hornby Mega Centre and Hornby Hub on Main South Road.

Spokes supports this link if it is also suitable for cyclists.

5. *Advocate for Safer School Crossings at Hornby schools, including St Bernadettes School, Hornby High School and Gilberthorpe School.*

Spokes supports safer crossings at these schools.

Looking at the wider picture there is a strong need for a safe Hornby - Halswell cycle connection. Dunbars Road / Awatea Road / Amyes Road is an important north-west, south-east link for commuter cyclists between Halswell and Hornby. This connects through to the South Express via Goulding Ave and Chalmers Street, which also need safety upgrades. The only other direct option is Halswell Junction Road, which is less safe and does not connect to the Hub Hornby or the local schools.

Fit for purpose community facilities and parks

Spokes supports fit for purpose community facilities and parks, including shared paths that are easy, safe and convenient to use. Lighting on shared paths is important, and good bike parking at destinations is needed.

Spokes Cycling Priorities in Waipuna

These priorities have come from Spokes members and from a number of public consultations in 2025 and 2026. These are our top 10 of 35 requests for Waipuna in priority order. Note that some priorities are also reflected in the Community Board priorities above, and some are partially in design or completed but not finished.

1. Upgrade the intersection of Division Street, Dilworth Street, Maxwell Street to make it safer for cyclists and pedestrians to get into Riccarton Mall. This is the best connection from the South Express.
2. Improve Chalmers Street outside the Hub Hornby Mall, and the connection through the Rugby Club carpark to the South Express cycleway. Hub Hornby/South Express cycleway exit from the rugby club carpark is confusing for drivers and unsafe for cyclists as it exits on the corner and has multiple exits combining into one.
3. Hendersons Road/Cashmere road needs a shared path from Penruddock Drive to Sparks Road.
4. Improve and seal the path from Bronco Playground (in Nash Reserve) to Little River Link on the other side of the motorway. Improve safety at the adjoining path on the south-east side of the underpass. This section also needs lighting as it is used at night.
5. Provide on road cycle lanes on Waimairi Rd between Riccarton Road and Maidstone Rd, (project approved in 2020 but never delivered).
6. Provide sharrows on Puriri St (South end) and Rattray St. This would provide a connection between the South Express and Uni-Cycle cycleways, and safer cycling for students at St Theresa School (pedestrian lights on Riccarton Rd)
7. Provide a safer / faster cycling connection between Halswell and Hornby. Crossing the street along Springs Road is slowly but surely becoming more and more difficult. Some planned improvements are included in the AP but not enough to be meaningful.
8. Connect the Sparks Road cycleway through to Sutherlands Road and preferably down to the Halswell Road Intersection.

9. The unused railway spur towards Prebbleton cuts South Hornby in half. Remove the railway line and make it a shared path. This will make Hornby intersections less complicated and safer for cyclists, pedestrians and other active transport users. It could also provide better connections across the space. A lot of people work in the industrial area and want to cycle there.
10. Provide cycle lanes on Yaldhurst Road and / or a shared path on the South side from Racecourse Rd to Manakura St

Spokes is happy to provide more details on these priorities on request.

There are also some general things that can significantly improve cycling in the Wapunai area.

- Speed reductions make neighbourhoods safer for all road users. Spokes would like to see more roads reduced from 50km/h to 40km/h and 60km/h to 50km/h.
- Pedestrian / cyclist refuge crossings make it easier to get across busy roads.
- Bike parking at popular destinations and events that suit a wide range of bikes such as cargo and cargo trikes with space for loading and unloading children.
- Provision of cut downs into and out of paths in parks and alleyways – suitable for cargo bikes and mobility devices.
- Progressively remove staples and bollards at alleyway entrances that are too narrow for cycles, push chairs and mobility devices to navigate. Put reflective tape on bollards that remain and paint diamonds on pavement where appropriate. Where bollards remain, offset them back from the entrance slightly
- More cycle signage and way-finding. This was the top request at the UCSA Orientation Day from new students. Adding 'except cycles and pedestrians' signs to no exit streets with alleyways helps for navigation
- Reinstating cycle infrastructure when road works are completed, e.g. green paint.
- Improved lighting for cycling and walking through parks and alleyways.
- Greater enforcement for vehicles parked / driving in cycleways and cycle lanes, or dangerously parking at school entrances. Automated 24/7 enforcement at hot spots.
- Ensuring that cyclists trigger the lights at intersections without waiting for a car or pressing the pedestrian button. E.g. If there is a cycle lane at the intersection, make sure the cycle lane has underground loops to trigger the signals, and diamonds on the road surface so cyclists know where to ride.
- Spokes would like to see bike parking provided at all playgrounds.
- Flexi-posts should be installed on left-hand bends where drivers cut the corner and drive in the cycle lane or shoulder, where possible. These have been very effective along Kotare Street.

I would like the opportunity to present to the Community Board on this submission and I am happy to discuss or clarify any issues that arise.

I respectfully ask that, as this work progresses, consideration be given to ensuring there are spaces and opportunities for all tamariki to engage in unstructured free play within these parks, facilities, and other public areas.
- Unstructured play is fundamentally important for the healthy development of tamariki; however, opportunities for this type of play are becoming increasingly limited. Research suggests that the decline in free play, particularly play that allows children to explore, take manageable risks, and move independently within their communities, may contribute significantly to the growing mental health challenges experienced by young people.

- It is also important to ensure that all tamariki, including those from families newly moving into the community, have safe and accessible opportunities to play in public spaces close to where they live. These spaces may include local quiet streets, neighbourhood green areas, and other nearby environments suitable for play. Many tamariki do not have regular access to outdoor play spaces because parents may be unable to accompany them due to time constraints, while also feeling concerned about traffic safety, "stranger danger," or the judgement of neighbours.
- At the same time, tamariki can play an important role in strengthening neighbourhood connections. Child-friendly streets and neighbourhoods tend to foster social interaction among residents, creating communities that are more connected, vibrant, and resilient. - One area that could strengthen several of these priorities is the meaningful involvement of children and young people in the design of parks, greenspaces and community facilities. Through Place Cadets Trust (formerly Gather Foundation), we work with schools and councils to involve tamariki directly in designing outdoor spaces in their neighbourhoods. Children are often the primary users of playgrounds and many park spaces, yet their perspectives are rarely included in planning and design processes. We encourage the Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board to consider supporting approaches that involve children and young people in shaping parks and community spaces as they are renewed or upgraded. Integrating specialist expertise in participatory design with children alongside existing Council planning and design processes can help ensure their insights are gathered in practical ways and translated into outcomes that better reflect how these spaces are used. Involving tamariki early also helps build a stronger sense of ownership and connection to local places, which can contribute to well-used and well-cared-for parks and community environments. Date: 20 March 2026

Standing: Halswell Residents Association Incorporated advocates for the interests of people in Halswell. Activities are largely carried out by a Committee of 6-8 members, which holds monthly meetings open to the public. For submissions such as this, a draft is circulated to our Committee and consensus obtained before the final version is submitted and minuted at the next monthly meeting.

List of proposed changes

- a. In the Draft Vision, change “creating” to “facilitating” (or similar).
- b. In the Draft Vision, change "sustainability" to “environmental sustainability”.
- c. In the Vision Statements, make reference to environmental sustainability.
- d. In the Vision Statements paragraph, make reference to the need to ensure that community facilities match suburban growth.
- e. Delete the Draft Priority “Accessible chlorine-free community water station”, and replace it with one of the priorities identified by the community hui on 5 February.

1. “Our Draft Vision”

- a. The Draft Vision is a really good start, but needs some minor tweaking to better align with the Vision Statements.
 - i. Firstly, the statement that the Board will “create” a thriving and connected community seems out of place. The Board doesn’t (and cannot) do this; it might better describe its role as “facilitating”.
 - ii. Secondly, the word “sustainability” is, when used on its own, poorly defined; it can mean almost anything. We suggest adding “environmental” as a qualifier, because social sustainability is implied in the phrase “well-being of residents”.

2. “Our Vision Statements”

- a. The vision statements themselves generally look good, from our perspective. However, there is nothing in the vision statements that links to the sustainability (environmental or otherwise) in the Draft Vision. This is important for Halswell, given the poor state of Huritini Halswell River and its tributary streams.
- b. Having said that, the paragraph below the vision statements seems primarily aimed at Hornby and Riccarton wards; it needs to include something relating to Halswell. For example, the paragraph makes the general comment about advocating for increased roading, footpath and park maintenance. The issue for Halswell is not so much maintaining these facilities, but actually getting them in the first place; the vision statement needs to reflect this.
- c. Our final comment here is that Community Board has a lot of work to do around bringing these Vision Statements to reality, particularly the second bullet point: “A decision making process that is open and transparent enabling residents to understand and engage in the process.” Our experience is that few people in our community understand either the legal basis for community boards or how they work in practice.

3. “Our priorities for Halswell”

- a. This is where we have really serious issues. Community Board staff ran a workshop on 5 February, one part of which was putting together a list of priorities for each of the three Wards. The priorities for Halswell from that workshop bear no resemblance whatsoever to the priorities in the Draft Community Board Plan.
 - i. The workshop was a serious inconvenience to both our representatives, and to see its key outcomes disregarded shows to us that the Board has no real respect for the volunteer contributions of people in our community - contra the Vision statements above.
 - ii. In future, Community Board needs to be more up-front. Having priorities that are decided by board members might be fine but Community Board needs to say so right from the start.
- b. The Draft Priorities: we are somewhat conflicted here.
 - i. On one hand, we do not understand why an approach totally built around individual projects has been taken for Halswell, given that the Draft Plan is for three years. It may seem unlikely, but if the three projects were implemented in the 1st year, what would Community Board advocate for Halswell in the following years?
 - ii. Furthermore, the way this reads is that all Halswell needs is completion of these three projects; this is demonstrably not the case.
 - iii. This is especially important given that (in principle) community board priorities are an important contributor to the long-term plan process.

- iv. On the other hand, we suspect that Community Board is being strategic in identifying particular projects rather than focus areas - it gives the Ward Councillor more direction (and support) when it comes to getting projects into the Long-Term Plan. And two of the projects nominated are certainly important.
- c. This brings us to the priority “Accessible chlorine-free community water station”.
 - i. Firstly, we cannot see how the cost of such a facility could be any less than \$100k. This is an enormous amount of money given the financial pressure that the City Council tells us they are under. On top of this is the cost of ongoing monitoring and plant maintenance.
 - ii. Given that we have a water supply that meets the government Drinking Water Standards, is there really nothing else in Halswell that ratepayer money should be spent on? Here’s an illustrative list: youth facilities (e.g., a skatepark in SE Halswell), safe routes to school, a multitude of intersection improvements, active and public transport accessibility, running Community Board meetings in the community, cleaning up Nottingham Stream, expanding Te Hāpua to meet the enlarged population, heating Halswell Pool, better all-ages play equipment in parks (etc.).
 - iii. The water for such a station has to come from somewhere. If it was to come from a local bore, there is a fair chance that its nitrate levels would be higher than the city supply. This would then swap one “problem” (chlorination), for another (nitrate). There is no easy way to remove nitrate.
 - iv. Although we appreciate that some residents have either a medical or philosophical aversion to chlorination, chlorine-free drinking water is readily available either through supermarkets or through a domestic-scale filtration apparatus.
 - v. We conclude that this Draft Priority should be deleted. It should be replaced with one of the priorities identified by the 5 February hui.

MRT needs light rail (not trackless trams that has been suggested). The technology needs to be well-proven (See G:link Gold Coast Light Rail for a success story). So, for this Board priority, I would like to see the following pre-requisite points added to the "What will the Board do?": * Advocate for proven Light Rail transport as the MRT transport solution. * Request for as early as possible, a plan showing where tracks will run, the Riccarton Transit Mall footprint and how the metro bus network will integrate (specifically what path will buses take locally to provide a stop for ease of transfer). I feel the Transit Mall should include an air bridge to the north side of Riccarton Road to provide ease of access to businesses. Close passes tend to happen on the north side where there is no shoulder, on the south side where vehicles are parked on the roadside, or at the approach to the roundabout at Hindess Street and McMahon Drive.

I certainly would not recommend anyone bike this route if they are not experienced. There would be merit in widening the path on the north side and making it a shared path. That however would only be a part solution as there would need to be options for transitioning on and off the shared path. Travelling east, it seems feasible to provide this, however travelling west it is more complicated to provide this.

It is a complicated area, possibly the most complicated in Christchurch. Reality is, this needs a major project with big investment and big commitment. I feel MRT is the core project to begin to get this sorted once and for all.

The decommissioning of the railway line though Main South Road, and transferring useful land ownership to Christchurch City Council needs to happen as soon as possible. The section beside Shands Road could become a shared path which would greatly improve safety as well.

This needs at minimum a sealed shared path connecting to Bronco Drive beside the playground. Lighting is also needed. A shared path should also continue to McMahan Drive beside the Heathcote River. In future it could also connect to Aidanfield Drive as well. Potentially these later sections could be done in chip rather than asphalt.

I would also really encourage the Board to support the Major Cycle Routes (MCR) programme through to completion. It just takes a split second for something really bad to happen on the roads, and in that instant many lives get changed for the worse and that can never be undone. I've seen a driver white as a ghost when they realise they nearly hit a cyclist. The outcome would have been bad, but with many years' experience one becomes hyperaware of potential SMIDSY type mistakes on the road - I stopped while the driver continued through. Even with experience I don't catch them all (some end up as a near miss).

Draft Vision:

The stated Vision, and expansion of this in the vision statements looks to be an appropriate summary of the important issues relevant to our local community.

Draft Priorities:

I haven't found a dedicated space to comment on the priorities as a whole before addressing these individually, so I will add this in here.

I will submit on the priorities for Halswell only, as this is where I live. But also because the 3 draft Halswell priorities are the most problematic of the 9, in my opinion.

The Waipuna Halswell-Hornby-Riccarton Community Board Draft Plan 2026-28 is unique amongst the six Christchurch Community Board draft plans, in assigning priorities to each ward.

This is an interesting approach. It does suggest that the priorities chosen should have particular relevance to each named ward, ie be truly local in their significance.

It is also important to reflect that this is a once in three-year opportunity to 'put a stake in the ground' to promote the values held by our community that our Board can refer to over the full three year period, for challenges including those not yet apparent.

The current marked increase in fossil fuel pricing with multiple flow-on effects that will reverberate for months if not longer, is an obvious example of a challenge with community implications appearing since these draft priorities were formulated.

In meeting such a challenge, how are our 3 elected Halswell representatives to be guided by the priorities of a chlorine-free community water station, a single specified road renewal project and single intersection modification?

This submission form states immediately before the priorities feedback pages:

"Our priorities guide our local decision-making and help us advocate for what matters to you."

The 3 draft Halswell priorities do not fulfil this function very well. They appear to be a selection from a "to do" list, and although possibly having merit as such, I hope our 3 local community board members can be nudged to take a more ambitious approach.

Both Riccarton and Hornby have put forward priorities that will have greater durability over the three year period.

My understanding of the concept of priority is that this refers to "something given or meriting attention before competing alternatives" (Merriam-Webster dictionary). It is an acknowledgement of limited resources: time and (ratepayers') money. This is the lens through which the draft proposals should be viewed.

I am relatively new to Halswell, having moved here just 3 & 1/2 years ago from Invercargill. The standout aspect of living here is the rapid rate of new house building and associated influx of people.

The Christchurch City Council's Halswell Ward census and population data page states that in 2023 the Census population count of the Halswell ward was 28,600, an increase of 4,750 people since 2018. In June 2024 Halswell's estimated population was 32,100, a further increase of 3,500 in three years.

Given the large influx of new residents to this ward, it is a surprising omission that there is no truly community focused priority in the three draft Halswell priorities.

I believe that we can retain all three of the projects that have (in draft) been labelled as priorities, by placing these more appropriately in the "What will the Board do" section of a relevant priority, but not as the priority itself.

If this approach is adopted:

1) The proposal to advocate for an 'Accessible chlorine-free community water station in Halswell' could sit under a Priority to "support community wellbeing and encourage healthy activity" or similar (this is taken from the statement of "Why does this matter" under the water station proposal).

2) The two roading related proposals can be included under a single Priority, that could reflect the principles stated in the "Why does this matter" section of the Dunbars Road renewal draft proposal: "to improve transport safety, accessibility and resilience"

3) This leaves space for a third Halswell-specific Priority, that I think should reflect the needs arising from the rapid growth of this community. This could include several of the concepts put forward in the vision statements, such as "supporting the physical, social, and emotional wellbeing of all residents".

The claimed-for benefits of "supporting community wellbeing and encouraging healthy activity" are questionable.

There is clearly passionate support for a return to chlorine-free water from a portion of the Christchurch population,

It is sobering to reflect on the 2016 Havelock North experience referred to in the Radio NZ article above, that contributed to a nation-wide rethinking of risk, when "up to 8000 people in the area were infected and about 5000 became ill, with about 45 people hospitalised. The infection is thought to have contributed to the death of up to four people, and others were left with long-term disabilities."

The Christchurch City Council has excellent information on it's use of chlorine to treat our water here: <https://ccc.govt.nz/services/water-and-drainage/water-supply/quality-and-monitoring/water-chlorination>

It states (amongst other points):

"Chlorine has been used safely all around the world for about 120 years. It keeps millions of people all over the globe – including in most of New Zealand – safe from waterborne illness.

"There are no known health impacts from drinking water treated with chlorine and it is safe for pregnant women to drink. The quality of the groundwater remains excellent and it is tested daily to ensure it is free of bacterial contaminants."

I am not opposed to a chlorine-free, filtered and UV-treated water station in the southern region of Christchurch, but I would argue that this does not belong as a Priority for Halswell.
